Judge Powers called the meeting to order and gave the invocation and Commissioner Carter led the Court in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flags.

INTRODUCTION OF RECENTLY HIRED HAYS COUNTY EMPLOYEES

Chief Juvenile Probation Officer Ed Cooper introduced **Jennifer Clark** (staff asst) and **Brian Hobbs** (Juvenile Prob Ofcr). Health Dept. Director Nick Icosipentanhos introduced **Rebecca Wiswall** (TB Nurse), **Chris Wentz-Duvall** (Nurse), and **Roger Hull** (Coord. Nurse). Deputy Constable Pct. 1 Steve Velasquez introduced **Sandra Lopez** (Office Admin). Environmental Health Department Allen Walther introduced **Lydia Longoria** (EH Technician), **Sandy Erwin** (Sanitarian in training), **Chris Reed** (Code Enf Ofcr), **Charles Hall** (Sanitarian) and **Roland Vazquez** (Code Enf Ofcr). Commissioner Russ Molenaar introduced **Cindy Henneke** (Office Admin).

PUBLIC COMMENTS

[T1-106] Charles O'Dell (President of Hays CAN) spoke of Hays CAN being a non-profit tax-exempt public education organization – their mission is to educate the public. [T1-153] Rickey Bowen (Rocky Ranch Acres resident) spoke regarding his concern about a deer lease on four acres. He would like to see the court adopt regulations to prohibit discharge of firearms pursuant to Local Government Code §235.022. He spoke of other violations that are occurring. Commissioner Carter spoke of subdivision restrictions that can be enforced as a civil matter.

23678 APPROVE PAYMENT OF COUNTY INVOICES

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve payment of county invoices in the amount of \$454,955.22 as presented by the County Auditor. All voting "Aye".

23679 APPROVE BUDGET AMENDMENT # 06-41

Budgets being amended: Information Technology = \$ 29,302 for needed expenses, Constable Pct. 1 = \$ 25 for balance of phone, Constable Pct. 2 = \$100 for balance of invoice, Commissioner Pct. 1 = \$78 for needed expense, CJD/Juvenile Accountability = \$742 administration fees from Juvenile Accountability grant, Transfer Station/Countywide Operation = \$53,000 transfer for trash hauling, retiree insurance & lease payments from salary savings. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve Budget Amendment #06-41 as proposed by the County Auditor. All voting "Aye".

23680 APPROVE PURCHASE OF A SIGMA 10-20 MM CAMERA LENS (WIDE) FOR \$499 FOR HAYS COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

This camera lens will be used for criminal investigation crime scene photos. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve purchase of a Sigma 10-20mm camera lens (wide) for \$499.00 for the Hays County Sheriff's office. All voting "Aye".

23681 APPROVE SPECIFICATIONS FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT FOR SAWYER RANCH ROAD (CR 164) AND AUTHORIZE PURCHASING TO SOLICIT FOR BID AND ADVERTISE

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve specifications for road improvements project for Sawyer Ranch Road (CR164) and authorize Purchasing to solicit for bid and advertise. All voting "Aye".

23682 APPROVE CONTRACT RENEWAL INTERLOCAL ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT WITH THE REGIONAL AUTO THEFT ENFORCEMENT TASK FORCE FOR FY 2007

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve contract renewal interlocal assistance agreement with the Regional Auto Theft Enforcement Task Force for FY2007. All voting "Aye".



23683 APPROVE CONTRACT CONTINUATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES, COMMUNITY PREPAREDNESS SECTION (BIOTERRORISM PROGRAM) FOR JANUARY 1, 2007 TO AUGUST 31, 2007

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve contract continuation with the Department of State Health Services, Community Preparedness Section (BioTerrorism Program) for January 1, 2007 to August 31, 2007. All voting "Aye".

23684 APPROVE CONTRACT RENEWAL WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES FOR THE HAYS COUNTY IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve contract renewal with the Department of State Health Services for the Hays County Immunization Program. All voting "Aye".

23685 APPROVE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE REIMBURSEMENT CONTRACT WITH THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR \$800,00 TO CONSTRUCT A BIKE/PEDESTRIAN FACILITY FROM RR12 ALONG WINTERS MILL BYPASS TO OLD KYLE ROAD

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve Resolution authorizing the County Judge to execute reimbursement contract with the Texas Department of Transportation for \$800,000 to construct a bike/pedestrian facility from RR12 along Winters Mill By Pass to Old Kyle Road. All voting "Aye".

23686 APPROVE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE REIMBURSEMENT CONTRACT WITH TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR \$4,000 TO CONSTRUCT A BIKE/PEDESTRIAN FACILITY TO CONNECT OLD STAGECOACH ROAD TO NEW STAGECOACH ROAD

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve Resolution authorizing County Judge to execute Reimbursement Contract with Texas Department of Transportation for \$4,000 to construct a Bike/Pedestrian Facility to connect Old Stagecoach Road to new Stagecoach Road. All voting "Aye".

23687 APPROVE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE REIMBURSEMENT CONTRACT WITH TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR \$4,000 TO INSTALL SAFETY FEATURES ON BOTH SIDES OF THE LOW-WATER CROSSING ON POST ROAD FROM CR 136 SOUTHWARD APPROXIMATELY 1,300 FEET

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve Resolution authorizing the County Judge to execute Reimbursement Contract with Texas Department of Transportation for \$4,000 to install safety features on both sides of the low-water crossing on Post Road from CR136 southward approximately 1,300 feet. All voting "Aye".

23688 APPROVE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE REIMBURSEMENT CONTRACT WITH TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR \$4,000 TO INSTALL SAFETY FEATURES ON BOTH SIDES OF LOW-WATER CROSSING ON WAYSIDE AT BENDIGO LANE WEST APPROXIMATELY 500 FEET

A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve Resolution authorizing the County Judge to execute Reimbursement Contract with Texas Department of Transportation for \$4,000 to install safety features on both sides of low-water crossing on Wayside at Bendigo Lane West approximately 500 feet. All voting "Aye".

23689 APPROVE SELECTION OF ENGINEERING AND RIGHT OF WAY FIRMS FOR THE PASS THROUGH FINANCING PROGRAM AS RECOMMENDED BY THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS AND PROGRAM MANAGER, PRIME STRATEGIES

[T1-325] Charles O'Dell, President of Hays CAN, spoke of limited information for public to make a judgment or to participate. He spoke of problem he has with one of the firms and with the process. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve selection of Engineering and Right-of-Way Firms for the Pass Through Financing Program as recommended by the Committee members and Program Manager Prime Strategies. All voting "Aye".



23690 APPROVE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT WITH TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR \$120,000 TO CONSTRUCT A RIGHT TURN LANE ON BEEBE AT DACY LANE

Grants Administrator Richard Salmon spoke of increase in matching funds required from the County (increase from \$51,000 to \$135,000). Commissioner Ingalsbe spoke of this being a safety issue. Grant amount is \$120,000. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to approve Resolution authorizing the County Judge to execute Reimbursement Agreement with Texas Department of Transportation for \$120,000 to construct a right turn lane on Beebe Road at Dacy Lane. All voting "Aye".

23691 [PCT. 2 #05-2-073, 1 LOT] RESUBDIVISION OF GOFORTH HILLS LOT 29 - PUBLIC HEARING AND APPROVAL OF FINAL PLAT [T1-404]

Judge Powers declared the public hearing open. No public input was received and the public hearing was closed. Environmental Health Director Allen Walther gave staff recommendation for final plat approval. A motion was made by Commissioner Carter, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to approve final plat of "Goforth Hills Lot 29". All voting "Aye".

23692 [PCT. 3 #06-3-047, 2 LOTS] BRIDLEWOOD RANCHES RESUBDIVISION OF SECTION I LOT 8 & SECTION II LOTS 17 AND 18 - PUBLIC HEARING AND APPROVAL OF FINAL PLAT [T1-422]

Judge Powers declared the public hearing open. No public input was received and the public hearing was closed. Environmental Health Director Allen Walther gave staff recommendation for final plat approval. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to approve final plat of "Bridlewood Ranches Resubdivision of Section I Lot 8 & Section II Lots 17 & 18". All voting "Aye".

23693 [PCT. 4 #05-4-026] WALT GRAINER UNIT 1 SUBDIVISION - APPROVE EXTENSION OF CONSTRUCTION SURETY [T1-439]

Environmental Health Director Allen Walther gave staff recommendation to approve extension of construction security. A motion was made by Commissioner Molenaar, seconded by Commissioner Conley to approve extension of construction security for "Walt Grainer Unit 1 Subdivision". All voting "Aye".

23694 PUBLIC HEARING AND ACTION TO ESTABLISH TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR GREAT HILLS SUBDIVISION [T1-450]

Judge Powers declared the public hearing open. No public input was received and the public hearing was closed. Road Supt/Engineer Jerry Borcharding recommended a speed limit of 25MPH and STOP signs. A motion was made by Commissioner Carter, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to establish traffic regulations for Great Hills Subdivision as follows: STOP sign on Railyard Drive at intersection of High Road, STOP sign on Stag Horn Pass at intersection of High Road, 2-way STOP sign on Stag Horn Pass at intersection of Railyard Drive, 2-way STOP sign on Mercedes Lane at intersection of Railyard Drive, STOP sign on Sadie Hollow at intersection of Stag Horn Pass, STOP sign on Waterfall Lane at intersection of Railyard Drive, STOP sign on Shasta Cove at intersection of Waterfall Lane, and set speed limit of 25 MPH. All voting "Aye".

23695 ACCEPTANCE OF ROAD CONSTRUCTION AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS IN COUNTY ROW, RELEASE OF THE CONSTRUCTION BOND, AND ACCEPTANCE OF THE MAINTENANCE BOND FOR TWO YEARS FOR BELTERRA SUBDIVISION, PHASE 3, SECTION 11A [T1-465]

A motion was made by Commissioner Molenaar, seconded by Commissioner Conley to accept road construction and drainage improvements in county right-of-way, release the construction bond, and accept the maintenance bond for two years for "Belterra Phase 3 Section 11A" subdivision. All voting "Aye".



ACTION FAILED TO PLACE THE AGENDA BACKUP INFORMATION FOR COMMISSIONERS COURT ON THE HAYS COUNTY WEBSITE, ALONG WITH THE CURRENT LISTING OF AGENDA ITEMS [T1-489]

Commissioner Carter suggested providing agenda backup information on the county website. Judge Powers spoke of problems he sees with this. Commissioner Molenaar spoke of it being difficult on staff and he would like more time to consider this request. IT Director Jeff McGill advised that all the backup would have to be scanned into a PDF format and sent to IT Department. Executive Assistant Brad Bailey spoke of agenda preparation and last minute additions. Special Counsel Jacqueline Cullom Murphy spoke of this being above and beyond what the open meetings act requires and need to be consistent if you start this. Brad Bailey advised that he would like to try this out before a final decision is made. Charles O'Dell (President of Hays CAN) encouraged the court to approve this. **A motion was made by Commissioner Carter, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to place the agenda backup information for Commissioners' Court on the Hays County website, along with the current listing of agenda items. Commissioner Ingalsbe and Commissioner Carter voting "Aye". Judge Powers, Commissioner Conley, and Commissioner Molenaar voting "No". MOTIONS FAILED.**

PRESENTATION AND UPDATE BY NAISMITH ENGINEERING ON ONGOING HAYS COUNTY DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS STAKEHOLDER PROCESS [T1-939]

Tom Brown (Naismith Engineering) provided an update on the ongoing Hays County development standards stakeholder process. A stakeholders meeting was held on August 10, 2006 (63 people in attendance). Eight stakeholder groups were identified: concerned citizens; cities; governmental entities (including school districts and emergency management districts); utility providers (including wholesale and retail water/wastewater providers, electric, gas, telephone & cable providers); neighborhood interests, local environmental/public interest organizations, development & economic interests, and property owner & agricultural interests. At the breakout session these groups selected 3 members and an alternate to serve on the stakeholders committee. Some groups did not select an alternate and they must be appointed by the Commissioners' Court (one for the cities and one for utility providers). Mr. Brown spoke of major items for the milestone report: (1) outline the process (2) outline the issues identified by each stakeholder group (3) examine existing development regulations of the cities in Hays County and comparing with other counties (Comal, Travis, Bastrop, Denton, & Williamson) around the state .

23696 AUTHORIZE SPECIAL COUNSEL TO INFORM PAWS, INC. THAT THE COUNTY WILL NO LONGER UTILIZE ITS FACILITY FOR ANIMAL SHELTERING SERVICES

[T1-1165] Commissioner Ingalsbe spoke of the County not utilizing the PAWS shelter due to an outbreak of distemper and had approved a short-term agreement with the City of San Marcos for animal sheltering services. We are currently paying \$25 per animal to the City of San Marcos. She advised that she will be bringing back a long term agreement with the City of San Marcos for consideration. Commissioner Carter spoke of her concerns and spoke in support of PAWS. **A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to authorize Special Counsel to inform PAWS Inc. that the County will no longer utilize its facility for animal sheltering services. Commissioner Ingalsbe, Commissioner Conley, Commissioner Molenaar, and Judge Powers voting "Aye". Commissioner Carter voting "No".**

23697 AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH LOOMIS AUSTIN, INC., RELATING TO IMPLEMENTATION OF THE HAYS COUNTY REGIONAL HABITAT CONSERVATION PLAN [T1-1285]

Charles O'Dell (President of Hays CAN) voiced his concern about the selection process – he would like to be able to participate. Special Counsel Jacqueline Cullom Murphy spoke of procedure that has been followed. **A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to authorize the County Judge to execute a professional services agreement with Loomis Austin, Inc. relating to implementation of the Hays County Regional Habitat Conservation Plan. Commissioner Ingalsbe, Commissioner Conley, Commissioner Molenaar, and Judge Powers voting "Aye". Commissioner Carter abstained.**

PUBLIC HEARING ON THE FY2007 BUDGET [T1-1469]

Judge Powers declared the public hearing open. Constable Pct. 2 James Kohler spoke in support of a new office building in Precinct 2. Linda Turley (Adult Probation Dept) spoke of need for additional and adequate office space in Kyle. She spoke of increase in caseload in the Kyle area. George Hernandez, Chief Probation Officer, spoke of increase in crime in the IH35 corridor – additional staff is needed, therefore, additional office space is needed. [T1-1574] J.P. Pct. 2 Beth Smith spoke of need for additional office space in Precinct 2 and the conditions at the current location. Boys & Girls Club members spoke in support of their club. Mary Gutierrez spoke of wanting to increase their programs in Hays County. Most of the kids in this club go to a charter school. Health Dept. Director Nick Icosipentarhos spoke of numbers increasing in the Kyle Clinic. Brad Bailey spoke of \$16,000 budgeted for the Uhland VFD – Kyle & Chisum Trail Fire Departments are taking over their area. Asst. Fire Marshal Bo Montague spoke of Uhland VFD no longer being a fire dept. – the budgeted funds could be used to help fund the Kyle Fire Dept. & Chisum Trail Fire Dept. Judge Powers declared the public hearing closed. [T1-2041] Commissioner Molenaar asked for \$4300 for the Hays Child Welfare Board. They requested \$10,000 and received only \$5,700. JP2 Beth Smith spoke of services provided through the Hays Child Welfare Board (CPS).



23698 ACTION TO SET SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES OF HAYS COUNTY ELECTED OFFICIALS FOR FY2007 [T1-2140]

A motion was made by Commissioner Molenaar, seconded by Commissioner Conley to set salaries and allowances of Hays County Elected Officials for FY2007. Commissioner Ingalsbe, Commissioner Conley, Commissioner Molenaar, and Judge Powers voting "Aye". Commissioner Carter voting "No".

23699 ADOPT THE FY2007 HAYS COUNTY BUDGET WITH FINAL CHANGES [T1-2154]

A motion was made by Commissioner Molenaar, seconded by Judge Powers to allocate an additional \$4300 for Hays Child Welfare Board. All voting "Aye".

A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Carter to approve additional position for Road & Bridge Dept. (\$27,720). Commissioner Ingalsbe, Commissioner Carter, Commissioner Conley, and Commissioner Molenaar voting "Aye". Judge Powers voting "No".

[T1-2483] A motion was made by Commissioner Molenaar, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to approve list provided by the County Auditor for consideration with the following changes: fund Sheriff's vehicles (3) in the amount of \$56,394 out of reserves, fund an additional \$5,000 for Vaccines instead of \$25,000, delete District Attorney Investigator (\$35,321), and add \$4,300 to Hays Child Welfare Board. All voting "Aye".

Jeff McGill, IT Department Director, spoke of salary (re-grades) comparisons with Comal County and City of San Marcos. Shari Miller (Human Resources) spoke of matching jobs with the City of San Marcos (no regrade) and 10 other counties (regrade). Jeff McGill spoke of technology level being higher than those being compared to. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Conley to approve regrade of four (4) positions in the IT Department in the amount of \$8,926. All voting "Aye".



[T1-2825] County Auditor Bill Herzog spoke of Beebe Road turn lane at Dacy Lane = \$135,000. A motion was made by Commissioner Molenaar, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to fund \$135,000 out of R&B General Reserves for the Beebe Road turn lane project. All voting "Aye".

A motion was made by Judge Powers, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to fund the \$16,000 budgeted for the Uhland VFD to be allocated to the Kyle Fire Department & Chisum Trail Fire Department as requested. All voting "Aye".

Commissioner Conley spoke of "Angels for Elders" in the Wimberley area that provides transportation services. CARTS will try to get to the area. He spoke of services being provided by Angels for Elders. They are requesting \$3,000. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to fund \$3,000 to "Angels for Elders". Commissioner Ingalsbe, Commissioner Conley, Commissioner Molenaar, and Judge Powers voting "Aye". Commissioner Carter abstained.

Britney Richey spoke of questions regarding merit increases. The court advised the following: 4% merit does not apply to vacant positions – no merit for new employees hired on or after Oct 1st – no merit for County Extension Agents & District Judges. Human Resources Director Dee Dee Baen advised that employees maxed at their grade may be eligible for a lump sum payment that will not extend the grade range. It was stated that performance reviews are required before merit increases are awarded. [T1-3632] A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Judge Powers to approve a lump sum 4% merit for employees that are at the maximum of their grade to be paid October 1st. All voting "Aye".

[T1-3694] A motion was made by Judge Powers, Seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to adopt the FY07 Hays County Budget with changes made this date. Commissioner Ingalsbe, Commissioner Conley, Commissioner Molenaar, and Judge Powers voting "Aye". Commissioner Carter voting "No".

23700 APPROVE AN ORDER ADOPTING THE TAX RATE FOR FY2007 AND LEVY THE TAXES [T2-1

A motion was made by Judge Powers, seconded by Commissioner Molenaar to adopt the tax rate of 45.00 cents for FY2007 and levy the taxes with the breakdown as follows: 31.14 cents for general maintenance and operations, 6.76 cents for general debt, and 7.10 cents for road and bridge maintenance and operations. All voting "Aye".
