28284 APPROVE THE JUNE 2011 TREASURER'S REPORT AND INVESTMENT REPORT

A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to approve the June 2011 Treasurer's Report and Investment Report. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

28285 AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE THE FY12 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS (PHEP) CONTRACT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES (DSHS) AND THE PERSONAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT (PHD) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$122,428.00

The application for this grant was approved by Commissioners Court on July 19, 2011. The County match is 10% of \$12,243 and is within the current PHD budget. This contract between DSHS and the PHD is to provide funding for the FY 2012 Public Health Emergency Preparedness program. The award is for \$122,428.00. The funding is for August 1, 2011 through July 31, 2012. Amount required is \$12,243.00 120-675-00.5230 and 120-675-00.5431. **A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to authorize the County Judge to execute the FY12 Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) contract between the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) and the Personal Health Department (PHD) in the amount of \$122,428.00. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**

28286 ACCEPT THE DELIVERY OF THE INTERNAL EXAMINATION REPORTS FOR THE HAYS COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND THE HAYS COUNTY SHERIFF'S JAIL COMMISSARY

A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to accept the delivery of the Internal Examination Reports for the Hays County Sheriff's Office and the Hays County Sheriff's Jail Commissary. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

28287 AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (TXDOT), SECTION 5310 GRANT PROGRAM FOR UP TO \$3000 FOR MAINTENANCE FUNDS FOR TWO VEHICLES IN THE VETERANS SERVICE OFFICE

Over the past several years, the Hays County Veterans Service Office has utilized funding from the TXDot 5310 program to both purchase and provide periodic maintenance for vehicles to provide transportation services for Veterans to the VA Hospital in San Antonio. This grant application requests funding for preventative maintenance on two vehicles purchased through TXDOT for the Veterans Service Office. Funding, if received, will be utilized for routine maintenance and upkeep of the vehicles, as required under the same program from which the vehicles were purchased. Hays County would be required to provide a 20% match for the project in the amount of \$750.00 that would bring the total project cost to \$3,750.00. The match amount is currently budgeted for FY 2012. The application will be submitted on or before the due date of August 12, 2011. **A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to authorize the County Judge to submit a grant application to the Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT), Section 5310 grant program for up to \$3000 for maintenance funds for two vehicles in the Veterans Service Office. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**

**28288 TRANSFER FUNDS FROM THE LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER PROJECT TO THE IMMEDIATE NEEDS PROJECT FOR PROJECT MANAGEMENT FEES**

On August 24, 2010 the Commissioners Court approved a budget for the LEC Immediate Needs project. The budget included \$50K for project management services. Due to the complexity of the project, additional funds are required. These funds will be transferred from savings identified in the LEC kitchen and roof repair project. No budget amendment is needed. Amount required is \$68,990.12 001-645-00.5741. **A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to transfer funds from the Law Enforcement Center project to the Immediate Needs project for project management fees. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**

28289 ADOPT A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CREATION OF THE 428TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT DRUG COURT

Bill Henry Judge District Judge of the 428th District requested the Commissioners Court to adopt a Resolution for a Drug Court and is asking to retain funds collected for that purpose. Presently the County can retain 10% of the monies collected for that purpose, but if we have a Drug Court then the County would retain 60%. **A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to adopt a Resolution approving the creation of the 428th Judicial District Drug Court. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**

28290 APPROVE THE ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION AGREEMENT WITH AUSTIN COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

Luanne Caraway Tax Assessor Collector spoke of Austin Community College's request. Hays County has been asked to assess and collect the taxes for the Austin Community College District located within the boundaries of the Hays CISD with the exception of those accounts within Travis County. The Agreement has been approved by Dr. Stephen B. Kinslow, President/CEO of Austin Community College District. **A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to approve the Assessment and Collection Agreement with Austin Community College District. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**

28291 EXTEND THE HOURS FOR A TEMPORARY EMPLOYEE AND AMEND THE TREASURER'S BUDGET

Due to unforeseen medical circumstances, the revenue clerk (front receptionist desk) has been out since June 24, 2011 and is not expected to return part-time until the week of August 8. In meantime, the Treasure Department has moved their temporary clerk to the front desk to perform the regular duties of the revenue clerk which includes entering all revenues, processing accounts payable checks and reception duties. At this time the treasure departments is asking for a additional 302 hours for the temporary clerk to complete the projects that are still outstanding as approved by Commissioners Court in January 2011. Amount required is \$3,901.26 in Treasure's Budget 001-620-00.4160_400. **A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to extend the hours for a temporary employee and amend the Treasurer's budget. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**

28292 AMEND EXHIBIT A OF THE PARK BOND FUND AGREEMENT WITH THE HAYS COUNTY YOUTH ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL ELEMENTS MADE POSSIBLE THROUGH SAVINGS IN THE PRIORITY LIGHTING PROJECT

On December 7, 2010 the Commissioners Court awarded partial project funding of \$447,256 in remaining Park Bond funds to the Hays County Youth Association to address safety issues at the facility new Buda. This included priority replacement of the deteriorated wooden poles and sports fields lighting system (Project 1- estimated cost of \$400,000) along with improvements and maintenance equipment for the soccer fields (Project 2 – partial funding is \$47,256). Other requested upgrades in Project 2, including a walking trail around the fields for better access and other needed field improvements, were not included due to the lack of funds. The HCYAA was able to complete the lighting project for \$317,448, resulting in a cost savings in this element, and is requesting that the remaining funds be allocated to other improvements. In addition to the field maintenance equipment and partial field materials/repairs already covered under the agreement, the HCYAA would like to included the walking trail in the project, conduct additional field leveling and resurfacing, perform irrigation system repairs and upgrades to make for more efficient watering of fields, replace goals, purchase a utility cart, and construct an equipment storage building to secure the tractor and implements and other equipment, No additional funding is requested. **A motion was made by Commissioner Jones seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to amend Exhibit A of the Park Bond Fund agreement with the Hays County Youth Athletic Association to include additional elements made possible through savings in the priority lighting project. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**



**28293 AUTHORIZE COMMERCIAL OSSF PERMIT AT 5150 INDUSTRIAL WAY, BUDA, TX;
CONSIDER VARIANCE FROM SECTION 10-M(B) OF THE HAYS COUNTY ON-SITE
SEWAGE FACILITIES ORDER**

Gary Rhodes is replacing an existing (failing) on-site sewage facility for his car dealership at 5150 Industrial Way, Buda, Texas. This on-site sewage facility is designed for 120 gallons per day. The property is 1.859 acres in size. The on-site sewage facility consists of a standard septic tank and a low pressure dosed drainfield. A wastewater meter will be installed so that the system can be monitored. The designer of the system Stan Burrier, PE. is requesting a variance to Section 10-M (B) of the Hays County rules for on-site sewage facilities, which requires a hydraulic equalization tank prior to the treatment on non residential on-site sewage facilities. His justification for variance: The flows are expected to be at a uniform rate throughout the day with no peak surges and the treatment tank is 33% larger than required which will provide more retention time. **A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to authorize commercial OSSF permit at 5150 Industrial Way, Buda, TX; consider variance from Section 10-M(B) of the Hays County On-Site Sewage Facilities order. SEWAGE FACILITIES ORDER**

Gary Rhodes has applied for an on-site sewage facility permit for a proposed furniture store at 5151 Industrial Way, Buda, Texas. This on-site sewage facility is designed for 120 gallons per day. The property is 1.923 acres in size. The on-site sewage facility consists of a standard septic tank and a low pressure dosed drainfield. A wastewater meter will be installed so that the system can be monitored. The designer of the system, Stan Burrier, P.E., is requesting a variance to Section 10-M (B) of the Hays County rules for on-site sewage facilities, which requires a hydraulic equalization tank prior to the treatment tank on non-residential on-site sewage facilities. **28295 AUTHORIZE COMMERCIAL OSSF PERMIT IN PRECINCT 1 AT 7809 CAMINO
REAL (HWY 21) MAXWELL, TX; CONSIDER VARIANCE FROM TITLE 30, TAC
CHAPTER 285.91-TABLE X**

Sac-N-Pac Stores, Inc. has applied for an on-site sewage facility permit for a proposed convenience store at 7809 Camino Real, Maxwell, TX. This on-site sewage facility is designed for 1050 gallons per day. The property is 12.26 acres in size. The on-site sewage facility consists of a grease trap, equalization tank, trash tanks, aerobic treatment units with the effluent dispersed to a multiple zone drip irrigation field. A wastewater meter will be installed so that the system can be monitored. The designer of the system, Greg Johnson, P.E., is requesting a variance to Title 30, TAC Chapter 285.91 – Table X (State of TX rules for OSSF's), which requires 5 feet of separation distance between surface improvements and treatment tanks. Two of the tanks need to be installed underneath a driveway. His justification for variance: These tanks will be constructed with traffic bearing lids and will have at-grade risers with cast iron manhole covers. They will be easily serviceable and are designed for the expected service. **A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to authorize commercial OSSF permit in Precinct 1 at 7809 Camino Real (HWY 21) Maxwell, TX and approve variance from Title 30, TAC Chapter 285.91-Table X. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**

28296 AMEND THE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES BUDGET FOR COMPUTER EQUIPMENT

Clint Garza Development Services Director requested replacement computers. Request is to buy from this year's budget and scratch it from next year's budget. In November 2010CAPCOG awarded the Hays County GIS/911 addressing division of development services with an additional \$15,975 in grant funds for FY 2011. These funds came in after the adoption of the FY 2011, Hays County budget and were arbitrarily assigned to 001-657-99.5211 (Office and Computer Supplies). The GIS department is in need of new computers as the models they are currently using have been upgraded over the past few years and have reached their capacity for the high end processing required for GIS. If approved, this budget amendment will allow the department to purchase replacements which will then allow their former computers to be utilized in the Development Services division for a few more years. All computer equipment purchases must be Commissioner Court approved, during the annual budget process, and as these funds came in some time after budget approval. Expenditure for computer equipment will require an amendment. Budget Amendment: 001-657-99-037.5211 (Office and Computer Supplies) -\$10,000, 001-657-99-037.5712 (Computer Equipment) +\$10,000. **A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to amend the Development Services budget for computer equipment in an amount of \$10,000. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**



28297 AMEND THE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES BUDGET FOR THE PURCHASE OF A LARGE FORMAT PRINTER/SCANNER

Clint Garza Development Services Director requested the purchase of a new large format printer/scanner. The GIS division of Hays County Development Services is in need of a new large format plotter/scanner. The current equipment has been in use for 8 years but has recently seen both an increase in use and a decrease in performance. The scanner/plotter still functions for many purposes however, large print jobs can take in excess of one half hour to complete. Unfortunately more than half of the entire print time is spent waiting on the software to start the print process. Additionally, the wide-format scanner part of this device has had software and hardware problems that cause scanning or copying to be a very slow process. **A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to amend the Development Services budget for the purchase of a large format printer/scanner. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED**
