# 31717 AUTHORIZE COMMERCIAL OSSF PERMIT AT 1635 COTTON GIN ROAD, KYLE, TEXAS 78640

Armando Garcia is proposing an OSSF to serve a 1200 square foot kitchen/concession stand that will accommodate 3 recreational soccer fields to be used on weekends and holidays. This 20.67 acre tract of land will be served by a public water system. The system designer, Stan Burrier, P.E., has designed a treatment system which consists of a grease tank, a septic tank, a flow equalization tank, and an aerobic treatment unit. After treatment, the effluent will be dispersed by gravity into two evapotranspiration beds for a maximum daily usage rate of 500 gallons. The Commissioners Court already approved the contract for demolition of the Civic Center building. #### 31720 AUTHORIZE THE CONSTABLE PRECINCT 4 TO PURCHASE ONE NEW STORAGE CARGO BOX FOR A 2015 CHEVROLET TAHOE AND AMEND THE BUDGET ACCORDINGLY

The Constable Precinct 4 Office would like to utilize capital vehicle savings to purchase a storage box for a 2015 Tahoe currently in their fleet. The additional storage is needed to allow Deputy Constables to carry needed tools and supplies to assist the public as needed. No additional county funds required. Amount required \$872.00; Decrease Vehicles\_Capital .5713\_700; Increase LE Eqpt .5717\_400. #### 31721 AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE AMENDMENT ONE (1) CONTRACT TO THE FY16 TUBERCULOSIS PREVENTION AND CONTROL (TB) STATE PROGRAM WITH THE DEPARTMENT STATE HEALTH SERVICES (DSHS) TO INCREASE AMOUNT BY \$25,875.00

On May 16, 2016 Development Services Department prepared and submitted the budget summary to DSHS for theFY17 TB Program and the application would follow at a later date. We recently received the application and will be submitting the application along with the amendment to DSHS for processing. The funding is provided to local health departments for the identification and treatment of those persons with, or exposed to, tuberculosis (TB). The available funding for the State portion of the grant is \$25,875, with a 20% match (\$5,175) required of the County for participation in the program, for a total of \$31,050. The match will be budgeted within the Health Department for fiscal year 2017 from existing salaries, benefits, and operating expenses. The funding period for this program is extended to August 31, 2017. Attached is the Amendment One (1) Contract and acceptance is done. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to authorize the County Judge to execute Amendment One (1) Contract to the FY16 Tuberculosis Prevention and Control (TB) State program with the Department State Health Services (DSHS) to increase amount by \$25,875.00. ### 31724 AUTHORIZE A BUDGET AMENDMENT FOR DEVELOPMENT AND COMMUNITY SERVICES FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION EXPENSES AND OFFICE SUPPLIES

Funds from fuel have been identified and are needed to cover various expenses related to continuing education and cost of office supplies for remainder of fiscal year. In order to satisfy the licensing requirements, two of the environmental health specialist will need to attend the 2016 Fall Texas Flood Plain Management Association conference in Lost Pines on September 7th through September 9th. We would also like for three additional environmental health specialist to attend a Basic and Intermediate Environmental Law Training course to further their knowledge base and receive continuing education hours as well. This particular course will be held in Austin on August 23rd and 24th. Amount required \$3,950; Decrease Expense 001-657-00.5271 Fuel (\$2,500.00); Increase Expense 001-657-00.5551 Continuing Education \$2,500.00; Decrease Expense 001-657-00.5271 Fuel (\$1,450.00); Increase Expense 001-657-00.5211 Office Supplies \$1,450.00. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to authorize a budget amendment for Development and Community Services for continuing education expenses and office supplies. ## 31725 AUTHORIZE THE HAYS COUNTY JUVENILE CENTER TO INCREASE THE PART-TIME LICENSED VOCATIONAL NURSE, SLOT 1140-005 HOURS FROM 1,164 ANNUALLY TO 1,284 ANNUALLY FOR THE REMAINDER OF FISCAL YEAR 2016

The Juvenile Center part-time nursing staff is currently budgeted at 1,164 hours annually and has maxed her budgeted hours due to staffing coverage needs. The Center has one full time LVN that is active military duty and has been on leave throughout the year, requiring the part-time LVN to cover additional shifts. The additional 120 hours requested will cover other planned military leave as well as medication oversight during peak times at the facility when needed for the remainder of fiscal year 2016. Amount required \$2,534; line item 070-685-00. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to authorize the Hays County Juvenile Center to increase the part-time Licensed Vocational Nurse, slot 1140-005 hours from 1,164 annually to 1,284 annually for the remainder of fiscal year 2016. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

### 31726 APPROVE THE APPOINTMENT OF TIM VON KENNEL TO REPLACE BOB LOVE AS A REPRESENTATIVE ON THE HAYS COUNTY ESD #6

Mr. Von Kennel has agreed to take the place of Bob Love who has resigned from the ESD #6. Tim Von Kennel's term will be effective immediately and end on December 31, 2016. 31727 REMOVE FROM THE HAYS COUNTY TRANSPORTATION PLAN NF8 (CRADDOCK ST. EXTENSION TO LIME KILN ROAD/HILLIARD ROAD) AND NF12 (FM1826 EXTENSION TO ELDER HILL ROAD) AND INSTRUCT STAFF TO INFORM CAMPO, MAKING APPROPRIATE CHANGES TO THE REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Since the adoption of the County Transportation Plan (Plan) in January of 2013 the County has moved toward and continues implementation of the Plan with the construction of various projects throughout the County and has initiated more specifically targeted studies such as the FM 150 West Corridor Character and Nature Plan and the FM 150 West Realignment Study. In response to these efforts the County has and continues to receive input on the County transportation system and how it should evolve to address future travel demand resulting from continued growth and development The County has further thought through how some of the projects recommended and contemplated in the Plan should proceed, if at all. While there are likely to be more changes

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to the County Transportation Plan as the County continue to grow and develop, there are currently two projects County staff believes can and should be removed. The extension of FM 1826 from FM 150 at FM 1826 west to some point on Elder Hill Road. This is shown as New Facility (NF) 12 on the Hays County Transportation Plan Map, last revised on June 25, 2013; and, the extension of Craddock Avenue from SH 80 to Hilliard Road. This is shown as New Facility (NF) 8 on the Hays County Transportation Plan Map last revised June 25, 2013. Therefore this is to request Court approval that instructs County Transportation Department staff to: Remove the extension of FM 1826 from FM 150 at FM 1826 west to some point on Elder Hill Road from the Hays County Transportation Plan Map and Plan; Remove the extension of Craddock Avenue from SH 80 to Hilliard Road from the Hays County Transportation Plan Map and Plan; Amend the Hays County Transportation Plan Map and Plan accordingly and publish amended versions to the County website; and, Create and file an amendment to the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) for its next regular plan amendment cycle to amend the CAMPO 2040 Regional Transportation Plan to remove both projects from the CAMPO 2040 Regional Transportation Plan. A motion was made by Commissioner Whisenant, seconded by Commissioner Conley to remove from the Hays County Transportation Plan NF8 (Craddock St. extension to Lime Kiln Road/Hilliard Road) and NF12 (FM1826 extension to Elder Hill Road) and instruct staff to inform CAMPO, making appropriate changes to the Regional Transportation Plan. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

#### 31728 AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE A PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH COBB FINDLEY AND ASSOCIATES FOR THE DESIGN OF INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS FOR WINTERS MILL PARKWAY AND AMEND THE BUDGET ACCORDINGLY

This project will design necessary safety improvements for the intersections of FM3237 and RR12 at Winters Mill Parkway. Amount required \$225,755.00. Increase Contract Services Consultant 020-710-00.5448\_008 - \$225,755; Decrease Salary Savings - (\$53,425); Decrease Road Material and Supplies 020-710-00.5351 - (\$172,330). A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to authorize the County Judge to execute a Professional Service Agreement with Cobb Findley and Associates for the design of intersection improvements for Winters Mill Parkway and amend the budget accordingly. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

#### 31729 AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE A RESOLUTION AND ADVANCED FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO THE CR 266/SH 80 INTERSECTION

This Advanced Funding Agreement is for the Design and Construction of improvements to the intersection of SH 80 and CR 266. Hays County's contribution to the project in the form of providing engineering, environmental clearance, and ROW acquisition is limited to \$300,000. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to authorize the County Judge to execute a Resolution and Advanced Funding Agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation for improvements to the CR 266/SH 80 intersection. ### 31730 SUB-562 SHADOW CREEK REVISED PRELIMINARY PLAN (1656 LOTS) APPROVE PRELIMINARY PLAN

Caitlyn Hairell, County Planner spoke. The original preliminary plan for the Shadow Creek subdivision was approved in February 2003 with a total of 1541 lots. Since that time, 19 sections with a total of 1054 lots have received final plat approval. The revised preliminary plan includes a new configuration for the remaining acreage within the 5-1 portion of Shadow Creek. The lots will go from 50' to 40' width, which will result in an additional 21 lots being created. All residential lots will be served by the GoForth Special Utility District for water service and North Hays County MUD #1 for wastewater service. Since Argyle Security had already (by way of competitive procurement) installed the security devices at the Hays County Government Center, Hays County Building Maintenance is requesting that the Court waive the 3-quote requirement and recognize that, even if the contract cost had exceeded \$50,000, it would have been subject to a discretionary exemption from Purchasing requirements under 262.024(a) (7) (D), which identifies Argyle as the sole-source for a county-wide system. Road Materials Savings has been identified to fund this request. Reduce .5351 Road Materials; Increase .5719\_700 Misc Capital Equipment. NTE \$35,807. Judge Cobb gave the Hays County Jail report and Dan Wegmiller of Specialized Public Finance Inc. spoke an update. Hays County's current maximum jail capacity is 362 inmates. Jail Standards recommends holding approximately 10% of capacity open. That lowers our capacity to 311. The jail's daily average was 256 and peak was 268 on July 24th for the week of July 24 to July 30, 2016. The maximum female capacity is 76 inmates. Last week's average was 65 and peak was 67 on 7/26/2016. The maximum male capacity is 256 inmates. Last week's average was 191 and peak was 202 on 7/24/2016. Inmate at Guadalupe County: <u>97</u>; Inmate at Bastrop County: <u>34</u>; Inmate at Caldwell County: <u>0</u>; Inmate at Walker County: <u>0</u>; Inmate at Blanco County: <u>6</u>; Inmate at Gillespie County: <u>15</u>.
