PRESENTATION ON THE HAYS COUNTY-TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM FM 150 WEST CHARACTER PLAN PROJECT

Joe Canteloupo, Sr. Vice President of K. Friese & Associates gave a PowerPoint presentation on the FM 150 West Character Plan Project. The Hays County-Texas Department of Transportation Partnership Program was formalized by an Advance Funding Agreement (AFA) executed between Hays County and the Texas Department of Transportation on December 18, 2013 and Texas Transportation Commission action on August 29, 2013 identifying project development funding (corridor study, schematic development, right-of-way preservation) for the FM 150 West Character Plan for FM 150 between Arroyo Ranch Road and RM 12. On May 20, 2014, the County entered into a professional services agreement with K. Friese & Associates for the development of a Corridor Plan and Nature & Character Plan for the FM 150 corridor from Arroyo Ranch Road northwest through the County to RM 12 in Dripping Springs. Since that time, the County established a Phase 1 Citizens Advisory Panel (CAP) which met 11 times, and hosted three Public Meetings. Presentations to the Court on the status of the project were made on January 13, 2015, December 15, 2015 and April 5, 2016. At the April 5, 2016 presentation, the Commissioners Court acknowledged and accepted the final report of Phase 1, the "FM 150 West Character Plan: Features and Themes Report." Since that time, Phase 2 of the project was initiated with a Phase 2 CAP. The CAP met seven times and the County hosted two Public Meetings. A presentation to the Court on the status of Phase 2 of the project was made on March 21, 2017. This presentation will provide information regarding the progress of Phase 2 and the final report of the project study process, the "FM 150 West Character Plan: Final Report and Master Plan." For the FM 967 upgrade project from the Union Pacific Railroad in downtown Buda to I-35, Hays County would provide engineering to accommodate the TxDOT District Office to improve the roadway and bring it up to standards before transferring it to the City of Buda. The roadway would be transferred to the City of Buda for operation and maintenance and the Robert S. Light Extension, another Hays County-TxDOT Partnership Program project, would be added to the State Highway System for operation and maintenance by TxDOT. This arrangement was agreed-to by the County and TxDOT during the development of the Partnership Program and recent Advance Funding Agreements. TxDOT has funds available for both the maintenance project and construction of the Robert S. Light Extension from FM 1626 to I-35.
