General Counsel, Mark Kennedy spoke. A date for transfer of the DY7 UC payment has been announced. All LPPF funds are collected from Hays County Hospitals and are budgeted. Though the IGT of these funds do not require specific Court approval, having them approved (If sufficient notice is given by the State) or ratified (if sufficient notice is not provided by the State) ensures the Court and the public are informed of the process. IGT amount (settlement date of 12-7-18): The IGT amount is not to exceed the LPPF account balance. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Shell to approve the Intergovernmental Transfer (IGT) of Local Provider Participation Funds (LPPF) for the DY7 Uncompensated Care (UC) payment, IGT amount is not to exceed the LPPF account balance to the State of Texas through the TexNet electronic payment system pursuant to Chapter 355 of the Texas Administrative Code. 33289 AUTHORIZE THE HISTORICAL COMMISSION TO PURCHASE OR LEASE CHRISTMAS DÉCOR FOR THE HAYS COUNTY GOVERNMENT CENTER UTILIZING DONATED FUNDS AND AMEND THE BUDGET ACCORDINGLY

The Historical Commission Director has received donation commitments from various foundations and individuals for the purchase or lease of Christmas decorations for the Hays County Government Center. The Director will coordinate with the Auditor's Office to acquire quotes for the purchase or lease of Christmas decorations to ensure competitive pricing and procurement policies are met. If a rental agreement is determined to be the best option, the Director will consult with the Office of General Counsel to negotiate the terms of the contract and execute the agreement. The cost to purchase or lease the Christmas decorations will not exceed the amount of donations received for this project. Additionally, the purchase or lease will not take place until all donated funds are received. No County funds are required. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Shell to authorize the Historical Commission to purchase or lease Christmas Décor for the Hays County Government Center utilizing donated funds and amend the budget accordingly. AUTHORIZE THE HAYS COUNTY AUDITOR'S OFFICE TO CONDUCT THE AUDIT REQUIRED BY ARTICLE 59.06 OF THE TEXAS CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE FOR THE HAYS COUNTY CONSTABLE PRECINCT 2 CHAPTER 59 ASSET FORFEITURE FUNDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018 AND FOR FUTURE FISCAL YEARS

Per the Texas Code of Criminal Procedures Section 59.06, it is necessary for the Commissioners Court to grant authorization to the Auditor's Office for the performance of a Chapter 59 audit. This item will grant that authority for FY 2018 and all future Fiscal Years unless authorization is rescinded by Commissioners Court. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Shell to authorize the Hays County Auditor's Office to conduct the audit required by Article 59.06 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure for the Hays County Constable Precinct 2 Chapter 59 Asset Forfeiture Funds for Fiscal Year 2018 and for future Fiscal Years. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

33291 AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION OF A SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH ELECTRONIC COMMERCE LINK, INC. (DBA E-GOV LINK) RELATED TO THE COUNTY WEBSITE REDESIGN PROJECT AND AMEND THE BUDGET ACCORDINGLY

On June 26, 2018 the Commissioner's Court approved a contract with E-Gov Link for the County Website Redesign in response to RFP 2018-P04. Due to additional content migration, additional funds and a time extension is needed to complete the final design elements and required staff training. Budget Amendment: Decrease Co-Wide Contingencies - 001-645-00.5399 Increase County Wide Operations Software_Capital - .5718_700. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Shell to authorize the execution of a Supplemental Agreement with Electronic Commerce Link, Inc. (dba E-Gov Link) related to the County Website Redesign Project and amend the budget accordingly. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

33292 AUTHORIZE TRANSFER OF DEPUTY CONSTABLE POSITION 0885-001 FROM CONSTABLE PRECINCT 1 TO CONSTABLE PRECINCT 5, ALONG WITH ALL EQUIPMENT, PER THE AGREEMENT OF ALL PARTIES EFFECTIVE 11/16/18 AND AMEND THE BUDGET ACCORDINGLY

Rodrigo Amaya, resident of San Marcos, made public comment. General Counsel, Mark Kennedy spoke. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Shell to authorize transfer of Deputy Constable position 0885-001 from Constable Precinct 1 to Constable Precinct 5, along with all equipment, per the agreement of all parties effective 11/16/18 and amend the budget accordingly. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

33293 AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY AUDITOR'S OFFICE TO PROCESS NECESSARY EXPENDITURES RELATED TO INCOMING ELECTED OFFICIALS

Per Local Government Code, Sec. 152.907 the commissioners court of a county may authorize payment of reasonable continuing education expenses incurred by a county or precinct officer if the expenses are related to the officer's official duties, including expenses incurred by the officer between the general election at which the officer is elected and the beginning of the officer's term of office. The County Auditor's Office would like authority to approve expenditures related to incoming elected officials for continuing education expenses or necessary



supplies to ensure a seamless transition. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Shell to authorize the County Auditor's Office to process necessary expenditures related to incoming Elected Officials. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

33294 RELEASE OF THE MAINTENANCE BOND #1036862 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$858,565.00, AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF ROADS INTO THE COUNTY ROAD MAINTENANCE SYSTEM FOR SUNFIELD SUBDIVISION, PHASE 2, SECTION 5

Transportation Director, Jerry Borcherding spoke and gave staff recommendation. Staff recommends acceptance of the roads into the county road maintenance system. The roads include: Kerr Drive (219 ft.), Betony Loop (2,543 ft.), Cenzio Drive (955 ft.), Esperanza Drive (722 ft.), Rayburn Drive (314 ft.), and a segment of Campo Del Sol Parkway (538 ft.). A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to release the maintenance bond #1036862 in the amount of \$858,565.00, and the acceptance of roads into the county road maintenance system for Sunfield subdivision, Phase 2, Section 5. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to approve the execution of an Advance Funding Commitment Agreement (AFCA) between Hays County and Perry Homes, LLC regarding the construction of a right turn lane on FM 967 in Precinct 2. 33296 ACCEPT LETTER OF CREDIT NO. 1018 FOR STREET AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS FOR 6 CREEKS PHASE 1 SECTION 1 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$280,830.45

The final plat for the 6 Creeks Phase 1 Section 1 Subdivision has been reviewed under the interlocal cooperation agreement with the City of Kyle and has been approved by County staff. While the plat has been approved administratively, formal acceptance of fiscal surety is required by Commissioners Court action. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Shell to accept Letter of Credit No. 1018 for street and drainage improvements for 6 Creeks Phase 1 Section 1 in the amount of \$280,830.45. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

33297 APPROVE THE SELECTION OF FREESE & NICHOLS TO MANAGE TCEQ'S MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORMWATER SYSTEM PROGRAM (MS4) FOR HAYS COUNTY AND TO AUTHORIZE STAFF AND COUNSEL TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACT

Later this year, TCEQ will come out with new permitting requirements. Activities required to maintain compliance with the County's TPDES permit and prepare for the new permit include: Public education/outreach program Public involvement process Illicit discharge detection and elimination program Construction site stormwater runoff control Post-construction stormwater management Pollution prevention and good housekeeping for County operations. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Shell to approve the selection of Freese & Nichols to manage TCEQ's Municipal Separate Stormwater System program (MS4) for Hays County and to authorize staff and counsel to negotiate a contract. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

33298 AUTHORIZE A SALARY EXCEPTION FOR THE COUNTY COURT AT LAW VETERANS COURT PROGRAM MANAGER SLOT 0449-001, FUNDED THROUGH THE TEXAS VETERAN'S COMMISSION GRANT PROGRAM

The Veteran's Treatment Court Program Manager position was filled on August 21, 2018 at the minimum grade 113 salary of \$45,375.13 pursuant to county promotion policy. The candidate has served in the capacity of Veterans Treatment Court Coordinator for the past 22 months and brings vast and complete experience in the operation of Hays County's Veterans Court processes and procedures. The grant funding from the Veterans



Treatment Court grant is sufficient to award the requested salary of \$51,563. This requested salary is at 27.27 percentile of the grade 113 range. No county funds are required. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Shell to authorize a salary exception for the County Court at Law Veterans Court Program Manager slot 0449-001, funded through the Texas Veteran's Commission grant program. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

33299 AUTHORIZE A SALARY EXCEPTION FOR THE COUNTY COURT AT LAW VETERAN'S COURT COORDINATOR SLOT 0447-001, FUNDED THROUGH THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR VETERAN'S COURT GRANT PROGRAM

The Veteran's Court Coordinator position was filled on October 1, 2018 at the minimum grade 110 salary of \$34,091.28 with a candidate that brings past work experience and familiarity with the administrative duties associated with court scheduling and updating the court's case management system. The candidate has worked as a Military Veterans Peer Network counselor and Jail Liaison Specialist supporting Hays County Veterans Treatment Court as well as holding a Bachelor of Science in Human Development and Family Services. The grant funding from the Veterans Treatment Court grant is sufficient to award the requested salary of \$35,459. This requested salary is at 8.02 percentile of the grade 110 range. No county funds are required. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to authorize a salary exception for the Courty Court at Law Veteran's Court Coordinator slot 0447-001, funded through the Office of the Governor Veteran's Court grant program. All present voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED
