





**SUMMARY:** The survey work at issue would be taxable if paid by Prime Strategies or Chiang, Patel & Yerby, Inc. directly, but **not** if Hays County pays directly to a surveyor who is contracted by Chiang, Patel & Yerby, Inc.. The following is Counsel's opinion regarding the application of Purchasing and Procurement laws to this case:

#### PROCUREMENT OF SERVICES

If the County were, itself, procuring the services of SAM, Inc., then the County would have to follow the procedures laid out in the Chapter 2254, also known as the "Professional Services Procurement Act." In this case, however, the County is not procuring the services. The services are being procured in a subcontract between SAM, Inc. and Chiang, Patel & Yerby, Inc. It is the duty of Chiang, Patel, & Yearby, Inc. to follow procurement protocols, not Hays County.

#### PURCHASE OF ITEMS

Once it is determined that the Professional Services Procurement Act does not apply to the County's action, then we are left to consider only the requirements of Chapter 262 TLGC, which apply to the "purchase of items" by the County. Under this Chapter, "Items" include services, so, even though the County has not, itself, procured the work, it must find a way to comply with this Chapter. The County is, after all, proposing to pay for (or purchase) those services directly.

Section 262.023 TLGC requires a County to comply with competitive bidding or competitive proposal procedures if the contract or purchase would exceed \$25,000.00 in expenditures. However, Section 262.024 provides that the Commissioners Court may, by its own order, grant an exemption from the requirements of Section 262.023 for, among other purchases, the purchase of personal and professional services. Surveying would qualify as a professional service because the performance of that service requires specialized skill and knowledge. Therefore, the Court may declare this payment exempt from the bidding requirements of Chapter 262.

For the purposes of direct payment, the Hays County Commissioners Court may declare a "Discretionary Exemption" under Section 262.024(a)(4) of the Texas Local Government Code and authorize the Auditor's Office to pay the surveyor directly.

Overview of the firm's specific experience on comparable projects, limit to five (5) and a minimum of three (3) references from similar projects including any experience with Hays County in the past five (5) years. References should include:

- Name of agency/firm, contact person, phone number and email address
- Year the services were provided
- Type of project and scope of services provided

Supporting attachments and/or appendices (related project, graphics, resumes, etc) are not included in the twelve (12) page limit, but should be conservative in their inclusion.

Submittals should address the firm's record and process for delivering high quality services on deadline and within established budgets; and/or its system for alerting clients early to prospective changes in the project budget.

### CODE OF ETHICS FOR HAYS COUNTY

Public employment is a public trust. It is the policy of Hays County to promote and balance the objective of protecting government integrity and the objective of facilitating the recruitment and retention of personnel needed by Hays County. Such a policy implemented by prescribing essential standards of ethical conduct without creating unnecessary obstacles to entering public services.

Public servants must discharge their duties impartially so as to assure fair competitive access to governmental procurement by responsible contractors. Moreover, they should conduct themselves in such a manner as to foster public confidence in the integrity of the Hays County procurement organization.

To achieve the purpose of this article, it is essential that those doing business with Hays County also observe the ethical standards prescribed here.

- 1. It shall be a breach of ethics to attempt to influence any public employee, elected official or department head to breach the standards of ethical conduct set forth in this code.
- 2. It shall be a breach of ethics for any employee of Hays County or a vendor doing business with the county to participate directly or indirectly in a procurement when the employee or vendor knows that:
  - A. The employee or any member of the employee's immediate family, or household has a substantial financial interest pertaining to the procurement. This means ownership of 10% or more of the company involved and/or ownership of stock or other interest or such valued at \$2500.00 or more.
  - B. A business or organization in which the employee, or any member of the employee's family immediate family, has a financial interest pertaining to the procurement.
  - C. Gratuities: It shall be breach of ethics to offer, give or agree to give any employee of Hays County or for any employee to solicit, demand, accept or agree to accept from a vendor, a gratuity of consequence or any offer of employment in connection with any decision approval, disapproval, recommendation, preparation or any part of a program requirement or purchase request influencing the content of any specification or procurement standard, rendering of advice, investigation, auditing, or in any other advisory capacity in any proceeding or controversy, any particular matter pertaining to any program requirement or a contract or subcontract, or to any solicitation or proposal therefore pending before this government.

- D. **Kickbacks:** It shall be a breach of ethics for any payment, gratuity or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor for any contract for Hays County as an inducement for the award of a contract or order.
- E. Contract Clause: The prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks prescribed above shall be conspicuously set forth in every contract and solicitation therefore.
- F. Any effort to influence any employee, elected official, or department head to violate the standards of this code are grounds to void the contract. Please certify by your signature below that you understand the ethics policy of Hays County and in no way will attempt to violate the code.

## A RESOLUTION OF HAYS COUNTY SUPPORTING FULL AUTHORITY FOR THE HAYS TRINITY GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTSRICT UNDER TWC CHAPTER 36

WHEREAS, Groundwater Conservation Districts, as created by Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code (TWC 36) are the State's preferred method of groundwater management; and

WHEREAS, the Hays Trinity Groundwater Conservation District (HTGCD) was confirmed by popular election on May 3, 2003, by a vote of nearly two to one; and

WHEREAS, the HTGCD covers approximately 370 squrae miles, or about 54 percent of Hays County, which has also been designated a Priority Groundwater Management Area (PGMA); and

WHEREAS, extraordinary effort by non-paid elected board members and volunteers has allowed the HTGCD to carry out its mandated duties under TWC 36 for the past six years; and

WHEREAS, Hays County is experiencing rapid population growth, and groundwater availability is becoming a critical issue effecting the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the HTGCD is a voice for property owners of western Hays County regarding groundwater allocations in regional and statewide water planning efforts; and

WHEREAS, clear, flowing surface waters of creeks, streams, and the Blanco, Onion, and Pedernales Rivers, which are sourced by spring flows from the aquifer, give western Hays County is unique sense of place, as well as driving eco-tourism and increasing property values; and

WHEREAS, the restrictive enabling legislation for the HTGCD, as set forth by the Texas Legislature in 1999 and 2001, provides for limited TWC 36 authority, making it very difficult if not impossible for the HTGCD to achieve effective aquifer management and efficient groundwater allocation; and

WHEREAS, restrictions on adequate funding mechanisms afforded under TWC 36 may prevent the HTGCD from successfully realizing its mandated duties for a growing population; and

WHEREAS, the HTGCD strives for equitable management of the resource based on the best available science and an open public process; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Hays County Commissioners Court respectfully requests the Texas Legislature to pass legislation giving the Hays Trinity Groundwater Conservation District full authority under TWC 36 to carry out its duties and manage these challenges by:

- Providing adequate funding mechanisms to carry out the research and mandated business of a TWC 36 Groundwater Conservation District; and
- Achieving effective aquifer management and efficient groundwater alloctaion; and
- Restoring other TWC 36 provisions so that the HTGCD can operate more efficiently, effectively, and on par with other groundwater conservation districts both within and outside of Hays County.
