ON THIS THE 5^{TH} DAY OF MAY A.D., 2009, THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF HAYS COUNTY, TEXAS, MET IN REGULAR MEETING. THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS WERE PRESENT, TO-WIT:

AND THE FOLLOWING PROCEEDINGS WERE HAD, THAT IS:

Pastor Mike Schlimgen of Solid Rock Church gave the invocation and Commissioner Barton led the court in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flags. Judge Sumter called the meeting to order.

PRESENTATION BY ADAN MUNOZ, JR., EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, TEXAS COMMISSION ON JAIL STANDARDS [71-57]

Texas Commission on Jail Standards Executive Director Adan Munoz Jr. spoke of inspection of the Hays County Jail. There is a major deficiency in the roof, structural problems in the facility, and there is space in cell areas for transfer of contraband. He stated that the facility is outdated. The kitchen area has mold and mildew and there is rust in various parts of the building. This was a special inspection requested by the Sheriff and not a normal inspection. A plan of action in response to items found is required. Court discussed need for a facilities assessment and assistance from Jail Standards personnel. Roof issue to be addressed under another agenda item

PRESENTATION OF HAYS COUNTY STRATEGIC PLANNING PROCESS BY CHRIS HOLTKAMP, AICP FROM LCRA, COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT [T1-4-14]

Chris Holtkamp, AICP from LCRA, spoke of having met with the majority of county department heads and elected officials. He spoke of holding a charette with local elected officials in Wimberley to determine what is going on at the city level with input at the county level as well. There will also be a series of town hall meetings for input from the citizens. He spoke of needs heard during the meetings with county officials & department heads: new government center, upgrade computer systems, jail issues, automated ticket writing, hot-mix equipment, etc. Judge Sumter spoke of partners in the plan and members of the committee. Chris Holtkamp spoke of various population projections for 2040 (Habitat Plan = 357,873; Texas State Data Center = 469,394/with explosive growth & 276,103/with significant drop in migration; and Texas Water Development Board = 272,543).

PRESENTATION - UPDATE ON HAYS SHOOTING SPORTS TASK FORCE (SSTF) [T1.805]

Stephen Marlow appeared representing the Shooting Sports Task Force (SSTF). He gave a powerpoint presentation. Their primary mission is to provide youth and adults with learning, a safe location to receive shooting sports instruction and safety training, a central location to practice shooting sports safely, opportunities to compete in shooting sports matches and special events, with youth and family activities emphasized. One of the goals is to reduce the need or desire to shoot on private property with ill-prepared or non-existent target backstops and dedicated zones of safety. The charge of the SSTF shall be (1) to establish criteria for, solicit and review potential sites or locations for a shooting sports facility located in Hays County, (2) to make recommendations to the Commissioners Court concerning these sites and (3) to assist county staff in outreach efforts throughout the county; and to pursue funding options, stakeholders, and ideas for operation and on-going administration of a shooting sports facility. He presented the property criteria for the complex and showed the court various facilities throughout the state in Bexar County, Harris County, Kerrville, & Travis County. Mr. Marlow spoke of monthly meetings held at Cabela's, contacts through Commissioners, advertised in news papers, email listing and word of mouth. They have been reviewing potential sites: 380 acres near Kyle on Onion Creek (Searcy), 350 acres on 1626 & 967 (Dahlstrom), and 505 acres on IH35 (Yarrington). Mr. Marlow spoke of funding options, stakeholders, operation and administration. He stated their conclusion in viewing the data on various websites one becomes aware of the social aspects of shooting sports and the strong family and youth orientation being promoted. Small facilities limit the number of shooting sports offered. Gary Connor made public comment in support of this facility.

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PUBLIC COMMENT

[T1-1483] Andrew Backus (Hays Trinity Groundwater Conservation District) gave an update on Chapter 36 legislation.

PRESENTATION FROM CONSTABLE DARRELL AYRES FROM THE CONSTABLE PRECINCT 3 OFFICE [T1-1550]

Constable Pct. 3 Darrell Ayres gave a presentation showing his county website which includes the history of the constables office and fees charged (set by Commissioners Court). He spoke of his fulltime deputies and his reserve deputies. He spoke of years of experience in his office and he spoke of duties being performed.

PRESENTATION TO THE COURT BY STEVE STARTZELL, OF NATIONAL SIGN PLAZAS, REGARDING THE OPPORTUNITY FOR A DIRECTIONAL SIGN PROGRAM AND INFORMATIONAL KIOSKS [T1-1875]

Steve Startzell, National Sign Plazas, spoke of their business working in the directional sign and homebuilding industry for over 30 years. Developers rent/lease space/panels on the signs and the county receives an administration fee. Signs are placed in county right-of-way. The county would be able to utilize space on the signs for county services.

26102 AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF A VEHICLE FOR THE SHERIFF'S DEPT.

Sheriff Tommy Ratliff spoke of funds available to purchase a new vehicle for patrol from savings in the vehicle line item. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Ford to authorize the purchase of a vehicle in the amount of \$21,641.00 for the Sheriff's Department. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

ACCEPT DONATION OF EQUIPMENT FROM MCCOY'S BUILDING SUPPLY IN EXCHANGE FOR BANNER PLACEMENT AND THE USE OF THE CIVIC CENTER FOR SIX (6) ONE-DAY MCCOY'S SPONSORED EVENTS PRIOR TO DECEMBER 31, 2010 [T1-2145]

Civic Center Manager Barry Nelson spoke of request from McCoy's Building Supply. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Barton to accept donation of equipment from McCoy's Building Supply in exchange for banner placement and the use of the Civic Center for six one-day McCoy's sponsored events prior to December 31, 2010. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE USE OF AN AIRCRAFT, BETWEEN THE HAYS COUNTY SHERIFFS OFFICE, THE SHERIFFS ASSOCIATION OF TEXAS AND THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE IT1-22501

Sheriff Tommy Ratliff spoke of this agreement allowing the Sheriff's Department to access and use of an aircraft to assist in law enforcement. Comal County Sheriff's Department will also have access to this aircraft. Special Counsel Mark Kennedy spoke of the MOU. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Conley to authorize the County Judge to execute a Memorandum of Understanding for the use of an aircraft between the Hays County Sheriff's Office, the Sheriffs Association of Texas and the United States Department of Justice National Institute of Justice. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

Collections Manager Judy Seim spoke of legislation that will help the collections department. HB1215 will allow the Collections Department to collect fines and court costs. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Ford to adopt a resolution in support of HB 1215, HB 572 and HB 2272 regarding county collections. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

CODE OF ETHICS FOR HAYS COUNTY

Public employment is a public trust. It is the policy of Hays County to promote and balance the objective of protecting government integrity and the objective of facilitating the recruitment and retention of personnel needed by Hays County. Such a policy implemented by prescribing essential standards of ethical conduct without creating unnecessary obstacles to entering public services.

Public servants must discharge their duties impartially so as to assure fair competitive access to governmental procurement by responsible contractors. Moreover, they should conduct themselves in such a manner as to foster public confidence in the integrity of the Hays County procurement organization.

To achieve the purpose of this article, it is essential that those doing business with Hays County also observe the ethical standards prescribed here.

- 1. It shall be a breach of ethics to attempt to influence any public employee, elected official or department head to breach the standards of ethical conduct set forth in this code.
- 2. It shall be a breach of ethics for any employee of Hays County or a vendor doing business with the county to participate directly or indirectly in a procurement when the employee or vendor knows that:

 - C. Gratuities: It shall be breach of ethics to offer, give or agree to give any employee of Hays County or for any employee to solicit, demand, accept or agree to accept from a vendor, a gratuity of consequence or any offer of employment in connection with any decision approval, disapproval, recommendation, preparation or any part of a program requirement or purchase request influencing the content of any specification or procurement standard, rendering of advice, investigation, auditing, or in any other advisory capacity in any proceeding or controversy, any particular matter pertaining to any program requirement or a contract or subcontract, or to any solicitation or proposal therefore pending before this government.
 - D. **Kickbacks:** It shall be a breach of ethics for any payment, gratuity or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor for any contract for Hays County as an inducement for the award of a contract or order.
 - E. Contract Clause: The prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks prescribed above shall be conspicuously set forth in every contract and solicitation therefore.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF "THE BIG PUSH"

WHEREAS, the arrival of the 2009 ozone season brings critical challenges for Central and South Central Texas, where rapid population growth threatens to compromise air quality by raising ozone-forming emissions; and

WHEREAS, high levels of ground-level ozone can be a health hazard, especially for children, seniors, and people who suffer from lung disease or are active outdoors; studies link excessive ozone exposure to lung irritation and inflammation, breathing difficulties, headaches, nausea, aggravated asthma, reduced lung capacity, and increased susceptibility to such respiratory illnesses as pneumonia and bronchitis; chronic high-level exposure can cause permanent lung damage; and

WHEREAS, to protect the health and well-being of the public, the Environmental Protection Agency strengthened its National Ambient Air Quality Standard for ground-level ozone in 2008; monitored ozone levels in the Capital Region, which includes Travis, Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays, and Williamson Counties, slightly exceeded the new standards in 2006-2008, putting the area at risk of receiving a "non-attainment" designation when the EPA makes its final determinations in March 2010; this designation would trigger federal requirements for transportation and industry that could in turn increase costs for businesses and delay regionally significant transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Region can avert the non-attainment designation if they decrease ozone levels to 77 parts per billion or less; an unprecedented level of regional cooperation is needed to meet this goal; consequently, the Central Texas Clean Air Coalition, the Air Improvement Resources Committee, local governments in the Capital Area Council of Governments, and the CLEAN AIR Force of Central Texas have created an initiative called The Big Push to build on voluntary efforts already in place; and

WHEREAS, in support of The Big Push, the Central Texas region is implementing an outreach campaign to encourage everyone to be an Ozone Action Hero and to pledge to do what they can to voluntarily reduce ozone-forming emissions from April through October 2009; and

WHEREAS, because many small actions can combine to produce a significant result, the coalition is asking all area governments, agencies, businesses, and citizens for their assistance; individuals can help through such measures as driving less, idling their vehicles less, and waiting until evening to fuel vehicles or use gas and diesel yard equipment; many area employers have committed to join this effort by establishing policies to reduce their vehicle and operational emissions and by implementing such measures as ozone watch/warning programs and assisting employees in reducing the impact of their commutes through teleworking, carpooling, using mass transit, bicycling, or scheduling a compressed workweek; and

WHEREAS, Hays County can play a vital role in the Big Push by conducting evaluations of fleet usage, providing preferential parking for ride sharing and low-emissions vehicles, limiting use of gas and diesel equipment early in the day and on ozone watch/warning days, and enacting other policies to reduce harmful emissions; and

WHEREAS, by joining the Big Push to reduce ozone-forming emissions in Central Texas, the Hays County can protect the health of residents and help avoid a non-attainment designation from the EPA, thus preventing enforcement of burdensome regulatory requirements that would add to the cost of doing business in our community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Hays County will voluntarily initiate emission reduction policies and programs in order to help Central Texas meet the 2008 National Ambient Air Quality Standard for ground-level ozone.
