#### CONSERVATION STAKEHOLDER CHARRETTE- COUNTY STRATEGIC POLICY PLAN

Judge Sumter spoke of reason for the meeting. The County is working with LCRA, TSU, Pedernales Electric and Bluebonnet Electric to gather information from stakeholders county-wide in developing a Strategic Plan for the County. A number of different stakeholder groups have been identified and are being asked to meet to provide information to the County. This particular group is concerned with conservation. A series of general-public meetings will also be held. Judge Sumter introduced Kirk Scanlon of LCRA, who presented the major portion of the meeting. He gave a brief powerpoint presentation that showed population growth and projections for the county and cities. He then conducted an exercise, asking the group to offer 5 headlines that Hays County will be seeing in 2018, 10 years from now. As this was a group composed primarily of conservationists, the headlines centered around water, building and energy. Lists of strengths and weaknesses were developed and the group was asked to develop 5 primary issues facing the County from that list. Those offered were: Water (quality, supply, storm); Transportation/Infrastructure; Land Use; Conservation and Education. The group then offered ideas of how the County could address these issues and take part in resolving them.

Court was adjourned.

Commissioner Barton explained that this action simply transfers the amount of money that we would be reimbursed on one section of I-35 to another section of I-35, meaning local dollars will pay for all improvements on the FM2001/Overpass Road section of I-35. That, in turn, means we can expedite that portion of the project, saving time and money because we don't have to comply with certain bureaucratic restrictions. Total reimbursable amount to Hays County does not change. A motion was made by Commissioner Barton, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to adopt a Resolution to amend the Pass-Through Agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation to provide for Transfer of Reimbursement from the IH 35/FM 2001 (Overpass Road) Project to the IH 35 at Kyle Crossing Project and to authorize the County Judge to execute the Amendment. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

APPROVE PURCHASE OF AN EVIDENCE STORAGE SAFE (\$499.00), PAPER SHREDDER (\$259.00), AND TWO VEHICLE DIRECTION LIGHTS (\$1552.00) FOR CONSTABLE, PCT 4 AND TO AMEND BUDGET ACCORDINGLY [T1-1095]

All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO SEND NOTICE OF TERMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT FOR THE PROVISION OF ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITY INSPECTION AND ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH & SANITATION WHICH WAS ORIGINALLY EXECUTED BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF WIMBERLEY AND HAYS COUNTY ON AUGUST 28, 2000 [T1-1520]

Commissioner Conley spoke of it being time for the Village of Wimberley to perform their own services to be effective January 1, 2010. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Ford to authorize the County Judge to send Notice of Termination of the Agreement for the provision of On-Site Sewage Facility inspection and Environmental Health and Sanitation which was originally executed between the Village of Wimberley and Hays County on August 28, 2000 — to be effective on January 1, 2010. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

DISCUSSION REGARDING ROAD IMPROVEMENTS TO CR 119 AND TURNERSVILLE ROAD, THE POSSIBLE CREATION OF A TAX INCREMENT REINVESTMENT ZONE (TIRZ) RELATED TO FINANCING THE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS, AND A POSSIBLE AGREEMENT WITH U.S. FOODSERVICE AND/OR RELATED ENTITIES CONCERNING THE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS AND PROVIDING FOR U.S. FOODSERVICE TO LOCATE AT OR NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF CR 119 AND TURNERSVILLE, TO CREATE JOBS, AND TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ROAD IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT [T1-1575]

Commissioner Barton spoke of error in posting notice – referenced CR119 (Old Goforth Road) instead of CR118 (unnamed gravel road) – therefore no action will be taken today. Court will take action on August 4, 2009. Commissioner Barton gave an update on the project since the July 7<sup>th</sup> Commissioners Court session. He spoke of MUD agreement with the City of Buda and annexation issue. RPTP Director Jerry Borcherding spoke of standard road improvements versus the type of road that is being requested. City of Buda has applied for a Texas Capital Fund grant to fund part of the road upgrade. U. S. Foods is proposing that the county finance the remaining \$1,750,000 needed with a TIRZ backstopped by U.S. Foods. [T1-1969] Carol Urban made public comment. David Patterson made public comment.

DISCUSSION REGARDING CONTINUANCE OF THE USGS JOINT FUNDING AGREEMENT INTO THE NEXT FISCAL FOR THE PURPOSE OF WATER QUALITY MONITORING ON CERTAIN CONTRIBUTING ZONE CREEKS AND WATERS WELL IN THE BARTON SEGMENT OF THE EDWARDS AQUIFER [T1-2233]

Commissioner Ford explained that the joint funding of a USGS water quality study was approved by the court on Oct. 28, 2008 and includes LCRA, City of Austin, Dripping Springs, and BSEACD. Due to drought the study was not able to complete the base flow sampling. It has been recommended by our partners to extend the study into the next USGS fiscal, but partners will make final payments within this fiscal. No action was taken.

EXECUTIVE SESSION PURSUANT TO SECTION 552.131 OF THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE, RELATED TO A POSSIBLE OFFER OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVES TO GRIFOLS, INC. FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A BIOMEDICAL FACILITY IN HAYS COUNTY. POSSIBLE ACTION MAY FOLLOW IN OPEN COURT [T1-2294]

Court convened into closed executive session at 11:45 a.m. and reconvened into open meeting at 12:43 p.m. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Conley to offer an economic development incentive under Chapter 381 of the Texas Local Government Code to Grifols, Inc. in the form of refunds of 75% of personal property and inventory taxes paid annually for 10 years on each phase over a term of 15 years for an estimated total of \$2,080,695 in exchange for the location of a biomedical facility employing 190 full-time employees with an estimated average wage of \$38,571 in the City of San Marcos, Hays County and authorize Commissioner Ingalsbe and staff to negotiate the terms and conditions of a Chapter 381 Economic Development Agreement with Grifols, Inc. consistent with such offer in the event such offer is accepted by Grifols, Inc. with the final contract coming back to Commissioner's Court for approval. Commissioner Ingalsbe, Commissioner Barton, Commissioner Conley, and Commissioner Ford voting "Aye". Judge Sumter was not present to vote. MOTION PASSED

#### DISCUSSION REGARDING THE FINDINGS OF THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS

Commissioner Ford spoke of Commissioner Court meeting on June 2, 2009 and citizens requesting an evening public meeting away from the Courthouse. She spoke of the Court not taking action today, but listening to the concerns from the public. Grant Jackson of Naismith Engineering spoke of changes made in Chapter 741 concerning OSSF recommendations by RPTP Department (ie: hydraulic flow). He also spoke of set of proposed findings/order. The Court suggested the easement not be located in a park and not for public use. The Court discussed Chapter 741 regarding spray applications. Commissioner Barton asked about criss-cross index and illustration and ease of understanding of all the rules. The Court discussed road speed limits and setbacks for building off different size roadways. The Court discussed lot size averaging and members of the court gave their preference.



#### **SUMMARY:**

Dripping Springs Ranch is a subdivision located off of Sunset Canyon Drive in Precinct 4. Phase 2 of Dripping Springs Ranch was platted in 1997 and at that time consisted of 11 large residential lots. Currently there are 19 residential lots and the proposed replat of Tract 4 will increase the density to 26. Tract 4 is 56.77 acres in size and the developer has proposed 7 residential lots averaging 8.11 acres in size.

The developer plans on constructing a new privately maintained roadway, Horse Trail Drive, to serve these 7 lots as well as 2 lots adjacent to Tract 4. Horse Trail Drive begins at lot 7 and is accessed via Cattle Trail Drive. Cattle Trail Drive is a private road currently maintained by the existing owners in Dripping Springs Ranch, Phase 2. The maintenance of the road is coordinated through the Dripping Springs Ranch Road maintenance association. The developer has met with the members of the RMA and agreed on the lot configuration, maintenance concerns, and deed restrictions. All new lots using Cattle Trail Drive will contribute to the maintenance of that road; only the newly platted lots will maintain Horse Trail Drive.

The developer has mandated the use of rainwater collection on each lot, but has completed the necessary steps to allow for individual wells to be drilled. Each lot will also be served by an individual OSSF. There are no variances and the division is located in the ETJ of Dripping Springs. A public hearing is required prior or concurrent with final plat approval.
