ALERRT Day PROCLAMATION

January 19, 2010

WHEREAS, the County of Hays in association with Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERRT) of Texas State University, recognize January 19, 2010 as ALERRT Day in Hays County.

WHEREAS, ALERRT, since 2002, has trained more than 22,000 first responding law enforcement officers across the nation in ALERRT's Active Shooter Response training and nearly 500 agencies are on the request list. Additionally, more than 5,000 officers have received second generation, certified instructor-led training.

WHEREAS, the recent active shooter situation at Fort Hood was stopped by officers trained by the ALERRT staff.

WHEREAS, ALERRT has received more than \$4 million dollars for training across the nation in FY10, through the Department of Defense, Bureau of Justice Assistance and the Texas Governor's Office of the Criminal Justice Division.

WHEREAS, the states of Alabama, Iowa, Louisiana, Mississippi and South Carolina have made ALERRT Active Shooter Response Training their state wide law enforcement standard and ALERRT training is mandatory in law enforcement curriculum.

On August 18, 2009 Hays County awarded the bid (#2009-B17) for Five Mile Dam Park Phase 2 (Building) construction to Harris Road Company, Inc., in the amount of \$338,027.00. This Change Order #1 is for \$19,800 for excavation/installation of properly compacted base material for the building as recommended by geotechnical investigations, as well as to elevate the building pad to the proper grade as acceptable within the flood plain. SUMMARY:				

Background: On August 18, 2009, the Commissioners Court adopted the new Hays County Development Regulations. Numerous new forms and processes have been implemented by the Development Services Division to effectively implement the provisions of the Regulations, and this has brought to light a concern regarding the documentation of tax status in order to obtain a Development Authorization. As written, this Subchapter requires that there be no "outstanding tax liabilities" on (1) the Subject Property, (2) any other property in Hays County owned by the Owner of the Subject Property, and (3) any property in Hays County owned by an Applicant representing the Owner of the Subject Property. This effectively required that once taxes became due for 2009, the Property Owner or the Applicant was required to pay his/her taxes even before they were officially due because they were technically outstanding. Even without this additional burden during the property tax season, there has been considerable concern expressed by Applicants and Property Owners alike regarding the requirement for proof of taxes paid on property other than the Subject Property.

Possible Actions:

- 1. Place a moratorium on the enforcement of portions of Subchapter 5 of Chapter 701 of the Hays County Development Regulations to (1) provide that property taxes on the Subject Property only not be delinquent and (2) that Property Owners and Applicants for Development Authorizations not be required provide evidence that any other property they respectively own in Hays County does not have any outstanding or delinquent taxes.
- 2. Direct staff of the Development Services Division to review the Hays County Development Regulations and make recommendations to the Commissioners Court for other possible revisions thereof.

Sub-Chapter 5 - Outstanding Tax Liabilities

§5.01. Applicant and Permittee Requirements

Applicants and Permittees identified on Applications submitted under these regulations shall be current on all outstanding tax liabilities with the County. This requirement is independent of whether the Subject Property included in the Application is owned by the Applicant or Permittee.

§5.01. Property Requirements

Subject Properties for which an Application is submitted under these regulations shall be current on all outstanding tax liabilities with the County. This requirement is independent of whether the Subject Property included in the Application is owned by the Applicant or Permittee.

§5.01. Documentation of Tax Status

Applications submitted under these Regulations shall provide any applicable identification numbers from the Hays Central Appraisal District (HCAD) or other duly appointed tax assessing entity for the Applicant, Permittee and the Subject Property. The Department and/or its designated representatives may independently investigate the status of payment of County taxes for the Applicant, Permittee and/or the Subject Property. The Department may require the Applicant to submit tax certificates for the Applicant, Permittee and the Subject Property.

§5.01. Suspension of Processing

The County may suspend processing of any Application submitted under these regulations if the County becomes aware that either the Applicant, the Permittee or the Subject Property are delinquent in payment of any County tax liability.

§5.01. Payment of Delinquent Taxes Prior to Issuance

Payment of any delinquent taxes (including penalties, interest, late fees, etc) on behalf of the Applicant, Permittee and/or Subject Property shall be required prior to the issuance of any Development Authorization under these Regulations. As approved or delegated by the Commissioners Court, the County may settle or adjust the required payments to satisfy this requirement.

§5.01. Disputed Tax Situations

In situations where the amount of tax owed to the County is in dispute, payment of all non-disputed amounts will be required. If the dispute is resolved while the Application is under consideration, payment of the final resolution amount shall be made prior to the County issuing the Development Authorization. Any payments made to the County in excess of the final resolution amount may be credited towards other amounts due the County (e.g. review and inspection fees, payments-in-lieu, etc) or they may be refunded, at the option of the person making the excess payment.

On November 3, 2009 the Commissioners Court ratified a grant contract with the Texas Water Development Board to initiate a flood protection planning study associated with waterways in northern Hays County that drain into the Colorado River. This grant provided partial funding to begin studies on Onion, Bear and Little Bear Creeks and tributaries. The current application will address funding necessary to complete studies on the above, as well as address both the Pedernales and Barton Creek drainage basins. The final grant request dollar amount will be presented during discussion of the item.		
Discussions are ongoing with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) to finalize a Project Management Plan (PMP) that will address both the scope and projected cost of the study, allowing the Corps to cost-share for 50% of total project costs. The Texas Water Development Board has been involved to ensure that the PMP addresses all requirements of the grant. Upon approval of the PMP by the Corps and Hays County, an Interlocal Agreement will be developed between the Lower Colorado River Authority and the County for participation in the Lower Colorado River Basin studies program, to which the Corps is a partner. It is anticipated that these agreements can be finalized within a month. Halff Associates, who is preparing the application and has been involved in study coordination, will be available to answer any questions.		
Approximately \$130,000 of County funding is needed annually to address the costs for the study over the next 3 years.

INTERLOCAL DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

This INTERLOCAL DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made as of the ___ day of ____, 20_ (the "Effective Date"), by and between The City of San Marcos, a Texas Municipality ("City"), and Hays County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("County"). City and County are hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties" or "the Parties to this Agreement."

WHEREAS, -County intends to construct, as part of the Project, a local government facility that will exceed 230,000 square feet and provide space for many of Hays County's staff and governmental services.

WHEREAS. City recognizes that the construction of a government center as part of the Project would enhance business and economic development in the area.

- 2.7. Waiver of Certain Fees City hereby agrees to waive any and all utility connection fees, tap fees and development fees related to the development and construction of the improvements on the 26.981 acre tract.

ARTICLE III: County Terms and Conditions.

- 3.1. Payment of Certain Fees. The County hereby agrees to pay the City the cost of all-building permits at the then published rates, and along with the fees related to the replatting, which are estimated to be approximately process of \$360.00.
- 3.2. City Wastewater Easement. County hereby agrees to dedicate, and collaborate with City regarding the location of, a utility easement on the Project that will serve a Citymaintained wastewater line.

ARTICLE IV: Interlocal Agreement.

LETTER OF INTENT AND AGREEMENT

RE: Hays County, Texas Law Enforcement Center Improvements (the "Project")

Dear Judge Sumter:

As you know, JE Dunn Construction Company ("JE Dunn" or "Design-Builder") has been requested to act as Design-Builder on behalf of Hays County, Texas (the "County") in connection with the above-referenced Project. The Project is generally understood to be limited to the remodel of the existing kitchen facility of the Hays County Law Enforcement Center in San Marcos, Texas. The Project shall be designed and built by Design-Builder and CasaBella Architects ("Designer"). JE Dunn and the County may be collectively referred to herein as "the Parties."

The Parties are presently negotiating the terms of an agreement. However, due to the Parties' desire to commence services promptly, this Letter of Intent and Agreement ("Agreement") is being entered into as a precursor to finalizing terms of a permanent contract that is anticipated in the very near future. On or about December 23, 2009, Broaddus & Associates, Inc., on behalf of the County, notified Design-Builder in writing to commence preconstruction services, procure a mobile kitchen and perform certain other work to ensure that the mobile kitchen can be used by the Hays County Sheriff's department beginning on January 19, 2010. JE Dunn is willing to do so pursuant to the following terms:

- 1. This Agreement confirms that the Parties intend to enter into a final agreement between the County and Design-Builder in connection with the Project, the terms of which are being negotiated.
- 2. While the terms of a final agreement as referenced in Paragraph 1 above are being negotiated and until such is executed by the parties, the County agrees to pay Design-Builder for any and all costs incurred by the Design-Builder in connection with the Project ("Cost[s]"), plus a Fee (see below). Among the Costs to be incurred are Design-Builder's general conditions costs. Design-Builder's general conditions costs, and Design-Builder's Fee shall be calculated, as follows until such time as the parties executed a final agreement:

3. Design-Builder agrees to invoice the County, and the County will make payment to Design-Builder within 30 days of the County's receipt of Design-Builder's invoice.

4. Design-Builder will provide the County copies of invoices, receipts or other supporting documentation of Costs invoiced during the time of this Agreement. The County may withhold payment for a specific Cost that is not reasonably documented until such time as the County has received supporting documentation that reasonably establishes that the Cost was made or incurred for the Project. If payment is withheld on a specific Cost, payment for an entire invoice shall not be withheld.

5. Design-Builder will provide the County with certificates of insurance evidencing the amounts and types of insurance the parties agree upon in writing as the services progress. The County shall be named as an additional insured on Design-Builder's General Liability, Automobile and Umbrella/Excess Liability insurance policies. Design-Builder agrees that its subcontractors engaged in this Project will have liability and workers' compensation coverage. The County agrees that insurance and bonds are Costs to be invoiced and reimbursed under the terms of this Agreement.

6. In consideration of the County's agreements herein, Design-Builder agrees to continue performing the services commenced on January 15, 2010 based on the County's December 23, 2009 Notice to Proceed.

7. Finally, to provide for mutual waiver of subrogation, it is agreed that the County and Design-Builder waive all rights against (a) each other and any of their subcontractors, subsubcontractors, agents and employees, each of the other, and (b) the Designers for the Project (i.e. Designer, Designer's consultants, Engineers, etc.) for claims and damages to the extent such are covered by insurance obtained by County, Design-Builder, Designers or other insurance applicable to the work, the Project or the premises, except such rights as they have to proceeds of such insurance. This waiver of subrogation shall be effective as to a person or entity even though that person or entity would otherwise have a duty of indemnification, contractual or otherwise, did not pay the insurance premium directly or indirectly, and whether or not the person or entity had an insurable interest in the property damaged.
