Programs Manager Development Services, Clint Garza gave staff recommendation for approval. Pioneer Ranches is an unrecorded/unplatted subdivision located off of Pioneer Trail in Pct 4. The original tracts were all 10 acres or greater in size, however there have been re-subdivisions which triggered the plat requirement for those previously exempt parcels. The owner of tract 7 is in the process of purchasing 4.99 acres from the owner of tract 9. The reduction in size will require the platting of the newly created 5.00 acre portion of tract 9. This lot will be served by a water well and existing on-site sewage facility. A motion was made by Commissioner Ford, seconded by Commissioner Barton to approve preliminary plan of Tract 9 Pioneer Ranches Subdivision. ACCEPT CONSTRUCTION OF THE STREET AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS IN THE DRIPPING SPRINGS RANCH SUBDIVISION, REPLAT OF TRACT 4. RELEASE CONSTRUCTION SURETY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$140,760

Programs Manager Development Services, Clint Garza gave staff recommendation for approval. The replat of Tract 4 Dripping Springs Ranch Subdivision was final platted on August 4, 2009. At that time the court approved the acceptance of construction surety in the form of a cash bond for the improvements serving newly platted lots in Dripping Springs Ranch, Tract 4 and Rancho Bella Subdivision. At this time the developer has satisfied Hays County construction requirements and would like the surety to be returned. As this is to remain a private road, no maintenance surety is required. A motion was made by Commissioner Ford, seconded by Commissioner Conley to accept construction of the street and drainage improvements in the Dripping Springs Ranch Subdivision, replat of Tract 4, release construction surety in the amount of \$140,760. The plan must be updated every five years to maintain eligibility for various FEMA grant programs, the current Flood Protection Planning grant from the Texas Water Development board, and requirements regarding the County Emergency Management Department. Our plan will expire in October, 2011 and considerable time is necessary for plan preparation an approval by FEMA. It is critical that the plan be revised, with or without grant funding, to maintain current commitments as well as eligibility for future funding opportunities. Funding, in the amount of \$56,250 has been awarded through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), for preparation of the plan. A 20% local match (\$18,750) is required, for a total project amount of \$75,000. It is expected that other participating partners will contribute to the local match, although these amounts have not yet been determined. CODE OF ETHICS FOR HAYS COUNTY

Public employment is a public trust. It is the policy of Hays County to promote and balance the objective of protecting government integrity and the objective of facilitating the recruitment and retention of personnel needed by Hays County. Such a policy implemented by prescribing essential standards of ethical conduct without creating unnecessary obstacles to entering public services.

Public servants must discharge their duties impartially so as to assure fair competitive access to governmental procurement by responsible contractors. Moreover, they should conduct themselves in such a manner as to foster public confidence in the integrity of the Hays County procurement organization.

To achieve the purpose of this article, it is essential that those doing business with Hays County also observe the ethical standards prescribed here.

- 1. It shall be a breach of ethics to attempt to influence any public employee, elected official or department head to breach the standards of ethical conduct set forth in this code.
- 2. It shall be a breach of ethics for any employee of Hays County or a vendor doing business with the county to participate directly or indirectly in a procurement when the employee or vendor knows that:
 - A. The employee or any member of the employee's immediate family, or household has a substantial financial interest pertaining to the procurement. This means ownership of 10% or more of the company involved and/or ownership of stock or other interest or such valued at \$2500.00 or more.
 - B. A business or organization in which the employee, or any member of the employee's family immediate family, has a financial interest pertaining to the procurement.
 - C. Gratuities: It shall be breach of ethics to offer, give or agree to give any employee of Hays County or for any employee to solicit, demand, accept or agree to accept from a vendor, a gratuity of consequence or any offer of employment in connection with any decision approval, disapproval, recommendation, preparation or any part of a program requirement or purchase request influencing the content of any specification or procurement standard, rendering of advice, investigation, auditing, or in any other advisory capacity in any proceeding or controversy, any particular matter pertaining to any program requirement or a contract or subcontract, or to any solicitation or proposal therefore pending before this government.

- D. **Kickbacks:** It shall be a breach of ethics for any payment, gratuity or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor for any contract for Hays County as an inducement for the award of a contract or order.
- E. Contract Clause: The prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks prescribed above shall be conspicuously set forth in every contract and solicitation therefore.
- F. Any effort to influence any employee, elected official, or department head to violate the standards of this code are grounds to void the contract. Please certify by your signature below that you understand the ethics policy of Hays County and in no way will attempt to violate the code.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

This Interlocal Agreement for Roadway Repair and Maintenance ("Agreement") is hereby entered into by and between the City of Woodcreek, Texas, a Type-A general-law municipality, hereinafter referred to as "City", and the County of Hays, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to as "County."

ARTICLE I. RECITALS

- WHEREAS, County and City desire to provide safe and well maintained roads, streets, alleys, and rights-of-ways for the use and benefit of the public and future generations; and
- WHEREAS, the County and City desire to cooperate in the maintenance and repair of roads, streets, alleys, and rights-of-ways within the County and City; and
- WHEREAS, the County and City desire to allocate by mutual agreement the responsibilities for governmental functions and services which are or may become necessary in providing safe and well-maintained roads, streets, alleys, and rights-of-ways that are of consistent quality of pavement along the whole length of roads that are part of the County or City road system, even those County Roads that lie within the City limits (see Attorney General Opinions ww-1401, H-1018 and H-1019); and
- WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act (Chapter 791, Texas Government Code) (the "Act") empowers the Parties to contract with each other in the performance of governmental functions; and
- WHEREAS, road and street maintenance are governmental functions within the meaning of the Act; and
- WHEREAS, the City and County are "local governments" within the meaning of the Act; and
- WHEREAS, specifically, Section 791.032 permits, with the approval of the governing body of a municipality, a county to enter into a interlocal contract with the municipality to finance the construction, improvement, maintenance, or repair of streets or alleys in the municipality, including portions of the municipality's streets or alleys that are not an integral part or a connecting link to other roads or highways; and
- WHEREAS, section 251.012 of the Texas Transportation Code expressly allows a commissioners court of a county to spend county money to finance the construction, improvement, maintenance, or repair of a street or alley; and further, subsection (b)(3) permits the county work may be done or financed by the county as an independent contractor with the municipality; and

- WHEREAS, Hays County has budgeted funds sufficient for the general maintenance of roads in the County Road System that lie within the City limits; and
- WHEREAS, the total expenditure of municipal funds under this Agreement is expected to be less than \$50,000, exempting the City from compliance with the competitive bid procedures of chapter 252 of the Local Government Code; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration for the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, as well as other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, both the City and County agree to do as follows:

ARTICLE II. MAINTENANCE SERVICES

2.1 Definition.

The "Maintenance Services" to be provided by the County to the City hereunder are services, including, the maintenance and repair of asphalt and pavement of the streets and roads and corresponding maintenance and repair to the subsurface and surface of roads and streets as designated herein, as appropriate to Hays County and as specifically agreed to by and between the County and City, namely, those services specified herein.

2.2 Term

a. Unless terminated as provided herein, the Initial Term of this Agreement will commence on the date of execution of the last party to sign the Agreement (hereinafter the "Effective Date"). The Initial Term shall be for one (1) year, commensurate with the fiscal year of the City. In the event that the City and the County execute this Agreement after the beginning of the City's fiscal year, the Initial Term shall be from the Effective Date to the end of the City's fiscal year.

2.3 <u>Current Funds</u>

Funding from each party for the performance of this Agreement will be provided from current revenues available to the parties. Further, the City assures the County that funds are available (and, unless written notice is provided by the City, will continue to be available) to reimburse the County, as the City is obligated to do under the terms of this Agreement. After written notice from the City that no City funds are available or if this Agreement is terminated in a budget year, the City shall not be obligated to reimburse the County for the cost of any labor or materials related to any maintenance or repair or any County Road or City Road incurred by the County after its receipt of the written notice from the City, unless the project was already undertaken at the time of the written notice.

2.4 <u>Maintenance Services</u>

- a. <u>County Road System Roadways</u>. In regards to all roads within the City limits that are identified by the County as roads that are part of or integral to the County Road System (hereinafter "County Roads"), and as more particularly identified on Exhibit "A" (There are no County roads within the City of Woodcreek as of February 10, 2010), attached and incorporated by reference, the Parties agree as follows:
 - 1. County shall be responsible for providing the labor and equipment required for maintenance and repair of County Roads.

- 2. City agrees to pay for all actual materials costs related to the maintenance and repair of County Roads, as defined in 2.4(a).
- 3. City may request the maintenance and repair of specific County Roads, but County shall, with or without request by the City, (i) identify County Roads that are in need of maintenance and repair, (ii) provide thirty (30) days prior written notice to City of maintenance and repair that County intends to perform on County Roads, and (iii) unless City objects to the maintenance and repair within ten (10) days of receiving notice under this Section, maintain and repair all County Roads, in a similar fashion and to a similar quality as is customarily performed on other roads within Hays County.
- 4. If City desires that a specific County Road be maintained, repaired, or upgraded to a higher quality or higher standard than is customarily performed by the County on other county roads within Hays County, City may, at no expense to the County, contract with a third party for the maintenance, repair, and/or upgrade of that specific County Road. In the alternative, the City may request the County to perform the maintenance, repair, and/or upgrade of that specific County Road to the specification desired by the City, if County has the resources available to perform to those specifications.
- 5. If City requests that County perform the maintenance, repair, and/or upgrade of a specific County Road under subsection 2.4(a)(3) of this Agreement, County shall provide an estimate to the City for the proposed work, and the parties shall follow the procedures set forth for the City Roads, below. County's estimate under this section shall account for the cost of materials it would take to maintain, repair, and/or upgrade that specific County Road to a higher quality or higher standard than is customarily performed by County on other county roads within Hays County.
- b. <u>City Roadways</u>. In regard to all roads within the City limits that are NOT identified by the County as roads that are part of or integral to the County Road System (hereinafter "City Roads"), the parties agree as follows:
 - 1. County shall, at the request of the City, provide City with a written estimate and proposed Start Date for the maintenance, repair, and/or upgrade of specific City Roads. The written estimate shall include reasonable compensation for County's labor, equipment, and material costs associated with the maintenance, repair, and/or upgrade of any specific City Road as to the standards specified by the City.
 - 2. City shall, within thirty (30) days receipt of the written estimate from the County, request that County (i) perform the maintenance, repair, and/or upgrade of that specific City Road as estimated by the County, or (ii) inform the County that the City desires to wait until a later date upon which the County can provide the City with a new estimate and available Start Date for that specific City Road. City may, at any time, contract with a third party for the maintenance, repair, and/or upgrade of any City Road.
 - 3. If City requests that County perform maintenance, repair, and/or upgrades under subsection 2.4(a)(3) above, County shall commence performance of the maintenance, repair, and/or upgrade within ten (10) days of the proposed Start Date cited in subsection 2.4(b)(1) above. If City waits for a period longer than thirty (30) days to respond to

ARTICLE III. PAYMENT

3.1 Payment.

All invoices related to Maintenance Services for County Roads and City Roads shall be provided by County on a monthly basis for all costs that are the obligation of the City under this Agreement. The City shall pay said invoices no later than thirty (30) days after receipt, or the following business day of the thirtieth day falls on a weekend or state holiday.

ARTICLE IV. TERMINATION

4.1 Termination.

This Agreement may be terminated by either party, for any reason whatsoever, by providing sixty (60) days written notice to the non-terminating party. If, upon providing or receiving notice of termination under this Section, County has begun the performance of Maintenance Services or upgrade of any roadway under this Agreement, County shall complete the work on that specific roadway, and City shall pay, as may be required by the terms of this Agreement, for the completion of work on that specific roadway before either party is released from the terms and obligations of this Agreement.

ARTICLE V. MISCELLANEOUS

5.1 Notice.

Any notice required or permitted to be given by either party under the terms of this Agreement shall be deemed given, whether or not received, three (3) days after it is deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, certified mail with return receipt requested, to the address for notice as set forth below, or the last address for notice which the sender has for the recipient at the time notice is sent, with a copy sent on the same day by facsimile, or on the date notice is delivered if hand-delivered, with a written acknowledgement of receipt obtained.

5.2 <u>Cooperation, Reservation of Rights.</u>

The City and County agree to cooperate with each other, in good faith, at all times during the term of this Agreement in order to achieve the purpose and intent of the Agreement. The parties agree to do all acts and things and to execute and deliver such further written instruments, as may be from time to time reasonably required to carry out the purpose and the provisions of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to interfere with the County and City's legal right to autonomously repair and maintain roads that have been identified as part of each entity's respective road system, particularly if the condition of said road, in the Party's opinion, poses a safety or mobility concern.

5.3 Entire Agreement, Amendments.

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties respecting the subject matter hercof, and supersedes all prior understandings and agreements between the parties regarding such matters. This Agreement may not be altered, amended, or modified except in writing signed by all parties to this Agreement. No official, agent, employee, or representative of either the County or City has the authority to alter, amend, or modify the terms of the Agreement, except in accordance with express authority as may be respectively granted by either the County Commissioners Court or the City Council.

5.4 Interpretation.

The parties acknowledge and confirm that this Agreement has been entered into pursuant to the authority granted under the Interlocal Cooperation Act. All terms and provisions hereof are to be construed and interpreted in consistently with the Act.

5.5 Severability.

City of Woodcreek Road Maintenance Hays County Road Maintenance Interlocal Agreement Any clause, sentence, paragraph, or article of this Agreement which is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect shall not be deemed to impair, invalidate, or nullify the remainder of this Agreement if the Agreement can be given effect without the invalid portion.

5.6 Applicable Laws.

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas.

5.7 <u>Authorization.</u>

Each party to this Agreement acknowledges and represents that this Agreement has been duly authorized by its respective governing body. This Agreement shall not be come effective until approved by the City Council of the City and the Hays County Commissioners Courts, and signed by both parties.

5.8 Indemnity.

The City agrees that it will, to the extent permitted by applicable law, save, protect, defend, and hold harmless the County from any and all suits, claims, or causes of action which may arise out of, or in any manner be connected with the negligence, recklessness, or intentional misconduct of City employees, agents, or servants in performing the City's obligations under the terms of this Agreement.

The County agrees that it will, to the extent permitted by applicable law, save, protect, defend, and hold harmless the County from any and all suits, claims, causes of action, or public liability which may arise out of, or in any manner be connected with County operations or programs, and the negligence, recklessness, or intentional misconduct of County employees, agents, or servants in performing or failing to perform the County's obligations under the terms of this Agreement.

Nothing herein shall be deemed in any manner to constitute a waiver of any immunity or affirmative defense which may be asserted by the County or City pursuant to law. Nor shall this provision be in any manner construed to create a cause of action for the benefit of any person not a party to this Agreement, not otherwise existing at law.

5.9 <u>Duplicate Original Counterparts.</u>

This Agreement may be executed in duplicate original copies by the parties. Similar agreements by and between the City and County and other contracting entities may be made; each such separately executed version of this Agreement is and shall constitute a separate and distinct agreement between the City or County and the particular other entity, but does not create obligations or rights as between contracting entities.

5.10 Alternative Dispute Resolution.

It shall be a prerequisite to either party seeking legal or equitable relief for any disputes arising under or related to this Agreement or the Maintenance Services that mediation be conducted. If they are unable to agree to a mediator and mediation process, the parties agree to use the Dispute Resolution Center of Austin, Texas, as the provider of mediators for mediation as described in the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, section 154.023. Unless both parties are satisfied with the results of any such mediation, it will not constitute a final and binding resolution of the dispute; provided, however, that any mutually agreed settlement reached in any such mediation may be enforced by a court of competent jurisdiction. All communications within the scope of

City of Woodcreek Road Maintenance Hays County Road Maintenance Interlocal Agreement mediation are and shall be confidential as provided in said section 154.023 unless both parties agree in writing to waive such confidentiality.

5.11 Non-waiver.

Any act of forbearance by either party will not constitute and will not have the effect of an amendment to this Agreement. The failure of any party to exercise a right under this Agreement under certain circumstances does not imply a waiver of such right under like circumstances later occurring.

5.12 <u>Interpretation and Reliance</u>.

No presumption will apply in favor of either party in the interpretation of this Agreement or in the resolution of any ambiguity of any provisions thereof.





SUMMARY:

Section 2 of the F&W Subdivision is a platted 2-lot division of approximately 8.32 acres of land located off of Fitzhugh Road in Precinct 4. The original plat was approved in 2004 and consisted of one 5.44-acre lot and one 2.88-acre lot. The original property owner still owns Lot 3 and wishes to vacate/cancel 4.32 acres and add 1.12 acres to Lot 4. The 4.32 acres will be added to their adjoining 125+ acres of raw land. The new configuration will leave 1 lot of 4 acres (lot 4A). The average lot size for this replat is 4.0 acres. Lot 4A will be served by an existing private well and individual on-site sewage facility.

Although this is not an increase in density, the Texas Local Government code requires a public hearing prior to final plat approval. The subdivision is located outside of the limits of any cities ETJ.





Congratulations on your grant award from Governor Rick Perry's Criminal Justice Division (CJD). It is important to make you aware of a few things to consider as you implement strategies to successfully manage your program. For more information and resources, refer to the Grant Resources section of eGrants available online at https://cjdonline.governor.state.tx.us:

Financial Reporting - Financial Status Reports must be submitted to CJD via eGrants. Financial Status Reports may be submitted monthly but must be submitted at least quarterly. Financial Status Reports are due after each calendar quarter, regardless of when the grant was awarded. Due dates are:

April 22 (January-March quarter)
July 22 (April-June quarter)
October 22 (July-September quarter)
January 22 (October-December quarter)

The final Financial Status Report must be submitted to CJD on or before the grant liquidation date or funds will lapse and CJD will provide them as grants to others who need the funding.

Payment Authorization – Payments will be generated based on expenditures reported in the Financial Status Reports. Upon CJD approval of the Financial Status Report, a payment will be issued through direct deposit or electronic transfer.

Generated Program Income - Any income generated as a direct result of the grant activities must be reported to CJD through the Financial Status Report and grant adjustment processes. Program income must be expended prior to seeking payments from CJD. Program income must be accounted and used for the purposes of the grant activities as awarded.

Grant Funded Personnel – Staff whose salaries are supported by this award must be made aware that continued funding is contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds as well as the outcome of the annual application review conducted by CJD.

Project Changes – Grantees may submit a request for grant adjustment via eGrants for any proposed budgetary or programmatic changes, including updating contact information for grant officials.

Equipment – Equipment purchased with grant funds must be used for the purpose of the grant and as approved by CJD. Monitoring – Grantees must readily make available to CJD or its agents all requested records. CJD may make unannounced monitoring visits at any time. The grantee must make every effort to resolve all issues, findings, or actions identified by CJD within the time frame specified by CJD.

Supplanting - Awarded funds must be used to supplement existing funds for program activities and not replace (supplant) funds that have been appropriated for the same purpose. Grant monitors and auditors will look for potential supplanting during reviews. Violations may result in a range of penalties, including suspension of future funds, suspension or debarment from receiving federal or state grants, recoupment of monies provided under the grant, and civil or criminal penalties. The regulation regarding hours of eligibility for overtime does not apply to an officer who volunteers to work on his regularly scheduled days off provided he complies with the grantee agency's requirements for hours worked prior to eligibility for overtime pay. (2) Hours worked is defined as physical hours on the job and does not include paid annual leave, compensatory leave, sick leave, holiday leave or other paid leave. (3) On-call hours should not be included in physical hours worked or as eligible hours for

overtime.

- (4) Personnel receiving grant funds for overtime must maintain time and activity reports for all time physically worked. The activity description should include detailed information about the actual activities performed.
- (5) Time should be recorded to the nearest quarter hour.
- (6) Grantee records must include a clear calculation in how the overtime was computed.
- (7) Overtime payments issued outside this policy are the responsibility of the grantee agency.

Cancellation for Awards - Grantees must take reasonable steps to commence project activities upon receiving notice of a grant award:

Commencement Within 60 Days. If a project is not operational within 60 days of the original start date of the award period or grant award date as noted on this memorandum, whichever is later, the grantee must report by letter to CJD the steps taken to initiate the project, the reasons for delay, and the expected revised start date.

Commencement Within 90 Days. If a project is not operational within 90 days of the original start date of the award period or grant award date as noted on this memorandum, whichever is later, the grantee must submit a second statement to CJD explaining the implementation delay. Upon receipt of the 90-day letter, CJD may cancel the project and redistribute the funds to other project areas. CJD may also, where extenuating circumstances warrant, extend the implementation date of the project past the 90-day period.

Public Information Requests - Grantees must immediately notify and provide a copy to CID of any Public Information Request received by the agency related to this grant award.

Prohibited Acts of Agencies and Individuals - Grant funds may not be used in connection with the following acts by agencies or individuals employed by grant funds:

- Grant funds may not be used to finance or otherwise support the candidacy of a
 person for an elected local, state, or federal office. This prohibition extends to the direct
 or indirect employment of a person to perform an action described by this subsection. In
 addition, grant-funded or grant-leased motor vehicles may not be used for the purpose
 described above.
- Grant officials or grant funded employees may not use official authority or influence
 or permit the use of a program administered by the grantee agency of which the person is
 an officer or employee to interfere with or affect the result of an election or nomination of a
 candidate or to achieve any other political purpose.
- Grant funded employees may not coerce, attempt to coerce, command, restrict, attempt to restrict, or prevent the payment, loan, or contribution of anything of value to a person or political organization for a political purpose.
- Grantees must comply with the federal Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. §§ 1501-1508) which restricts the political activity of some state and local employees who work in connection with federally funded programs. Covered state and local employees may not: I) be candidates for public office in a partisan election; 2) use official authority or influence to interfere with or affect the results of an election or nomination; or, 3) directly or indirectly coerce contributions from subordinates in support of a political party or candidate.

Employment of a Lobbyist - Grant funds may not be used to employ, as a regular full-time or part-time or contract employee, a person who is required by Chapter 305 of the Government Code to register as a lobbyist. WHEREAS, The Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) was Conceived in Calamity, Birthed in Controversy and matured to Benefit its constituents in the Colorado River Valley, and

WHEREAS, Major destruction and misery were the results of the frequent floods, and

WHEREAS, Due to massive flooding, the City of Austin (COA) lost successive dams in 1900 and 1915 and the lower basin continued to suffer from the frequent floods, and

WHEREAS, A new major economic enterprise has been created in the lower counties that would benefit from a more assured supply of water for irrigation as well as relief from massive flooding, and

SUMMARY:

The purpose of this supplemental to the Professional Services Agreement (PSA) and Work Authorizations (WAs) is to address the additional work being requested of Rogers Design Services due to recent changes to improve the projects.

RM 1826 @ RM 967

During preliminary design for the County improvements to the intersection of RM 1826 at RM 967 stakeholder meetings were held. During these stakeholder meetings, it was brought to light that there was a proposed enhancement for the entrance to the Salt Lick (dedicated right turn lane) as well as a proposed development just to the north of the intersection. Subsequent meetings with these stakeholders and TxDOT found that it would be preferred to perform all of these construction activities at one time under one traffic control plan versus having three separate projects spread out over several months. Currently the County is working towards an interagency agreement with the Driftwood Economic Development Municipal Management District to define the improvements to be funded by the Municipal Management District such that the costs of the additional improvement are not born by the County.

Implementing these other proposed project enhancements will require additional work by Rogers Design Services for incorporating the work of the developer's engineer into the County project. This work includes the following: additional surveying to extend the project limits further to the northeast approximately 400', development of additional plan, profile and cross section sheets as well as review of the developer design for consistency with TxDOT plans and specifications.

Supplemental Amount - \$20,971

RM 1826 @ Darden Hill Road

During the preliminary design phase for this project, it was determined that the initial alignments developed that minimized the amount of ROW to be purchased by the County directly impacted several large oak trees near the corner of the property. Further discussions with the affected property owner found a desire to minimize or avoid impacts to these trees. Discussions were held concerning relocating the trees, but it was found to be cost prohibitive.

Further investigation found that the alignment could be adjusted to accommodate the trees with a minimal amount of additional ROW. The revised alignment falls at the edge of the original survey limit, thus Rogers Design Services will need to collect additional survey, update project exhibits, and revise previously developed plan sheets to reflect the preferred Darden Hill alignment.

Supplemental Amount - \$12,689

The original Professional Services Agreement (PSA) not to exceed amount of \$295,000 was set \$5,638 above the initial work authorization amounts.

Requested supplemental amount is \$28,500 to bring the new PSA not to exceed amount to \$323,500.





The intersection of RM 967 and Ruby Ranch Road was identified as an intersection which warranted safety improvements as part of the 2008 road bond program. It was prioritized to move forward provided savings could be identified elsewhere and once the county could reasonably project that funding would be available.

At this time, with the current program reserves that have been identified by HDR from bringing projects in under budget and because TxDOT has agreed to provide construction review and inspection services, HDR recommends that the County authorize and proceed with procurement of design phase services for this project. The Court would need to take additional action to authorize any construction on this project at a later date – again depending on availability of funds. Recall that on this project KBDJ quarry has offered to donate material to the project.

One Work Authorization (WA) has been prepared for this project. The current estimated construction for safety improvements at RM 967 and Ruby Ranch Road is \$750,000.

EXHIBIT B

SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE ENGINEER

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The services to be provided by the Engineer under this Work Authorization shall consist of engineering, survey and environmental documentation services for the preparation of plans, specifications and construction estimates (PS&E) for the implementation of various safety improvements along RM 967 at the intersection of Ruby Ranch Road in Hays County, Texas.

Project Description

The proposed improvements to RM 967 include:

- Widening RM 967 with a 12 foot left turn lane, 10 foot right and 4 foot left shoulder from approximately 250 feet West to 450 feet East of Ruby Ranch Road;
- If authorized, widening RM 967 with a 12 foot left turn lane, 10 foot right and 4 foot left shoulder from approximately 250 feet West to 450 feet East of the Quarry Road approximately 0.25 miles West of Ruby Ranch Road. If so authorized, all services will be performed in conjunction with and at the same time as the widening at Ruby Ranch Road. All survey, geotechnical, environmental and design will be incorporated into the same documents as the Ruby Ranch Road project;
- Existing ROW determination; and
- Safety treatments of extending parallel and cross culverts, replacing culvert headwalls, and installing safety end treatments and guardrail as required.

The project lies within the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone.

I. Project Management and Coordination

- A. Attend six (6) project coordination meetings. Prepare and submit a meeting agenda one day prior to each meeting, and submit draft meeting notes for the County's review and approval three days following each meeting. The meetings shall include the following:
 - 1. Initial Kick-off Meeting
 - Conceptual Schematic review after completion of the conceptual schematic, attend a
 coordination meeting with the County and TxDOT to obtain concurrence on proposed
 design prior to beginning development of the PS&E package.
 - 3. Utility Coordination Meeting

- 6. 95% Plan Review Meeting with County and TxDOT.
- B. Coordinate with Hays County, TxDOT, TCEQ and other agencies as necessary.
- C. Provide Project Administration and Controls.
 - Prepare and submit a monthly invoice package, which shall include the engineer's
 invoice, a progress status report, and updated project schedule reflecting progress
 accomplished during the past month. Project schedule shall be developed using
 FastTrack Schedule 9 or other compatible scheduling software.
 - 2. Subconsultant coordination, prepare subconsultant agreements and task orders, review invoices.

II. Survey

- A. The Engineer shall develop a list of current property owners and attempt to obtain Right-of-Entry Agreements for all affected parcels for the purpose of gaining access for survey, and environmental investigations.
- B. The Engineer shall establish the limits of the existing RM 967 and Ruby Road right-of-way utilizing available record information and field data.
- C. Establish horizontal and vertical control for the project. Horizontal control shall be based on Texas State Plane Coordinate System, Central Zone, NAD-83. Vertical Control shall be based on NGVD-88. Establish benchmarks in locations that shall not be disturbed by construction and tie benchmark elevation to known USGS reference mark.
- D. Provide location of permanent project benchmarks and traverse points (description, coordinates and elevations). Topographic map and profile from the existing ROW for the project limits on RM 967 and 100' along Ruby Ranch Road ROW. Provide topographic map plot at a scale of not less than 1"=100', depicting all surface features, legible text and 1-foot contour lines indexed at even 5-foot intervals. Show existing rights-of-way along RM 967 and Ruby Ranch Road. Provide hard copy plots and digital files (digital files shall be in MicroStation V8 (3D format) on CD-ROM. Provide a separate drawing file that contains 3D breaklines, existing ground triangulation network and contours with elevations. Provide digital ASCII file (on CD-ROM) and hard paper copy of all survey points in (point number, northing, easting, elevation, description) format.
- E. Locate all mailboxes (single, double, etc.), signs including size, types, location and verbiage. Measure all guardrail and permanent erosion control measures. Collect the required miscellaneous information including; measurements of riprap, retaining walls, driveways, drainage culverts and note types, sizes and shapes, etc.

- F. Sufficient survey shall be gathered as necessary to determine drainage patterns. Cross-section Quarry Road from ROW to ROW for a distance of approximately 40'from centerline of RM 967 to ensure development of a detailed DTM to determine actual field conditions.
- G. ROW Maps The Engineer will research public tax and deed records to establish ownership and record limits of parent tracts. Any easements uncovered during this process will also be obtained and located, if possible. The Engineer will make a reasonable effort to recover pertinent record data, however this does not imply a complete abstracting of the parent tracts or warranty that all encumbrances will be discovered or shown.
 - 1. Utilizing the record information and field data obtained, establish the limits of the existing RM 967 and Ruby Ranch Road right-of-way and affected parent tracts.

H. Survey Deliverables

- Standard level menus, font tables, pen tables, color tables and legends, as provided by TxDOT Austin District, will be utilized in developing all graphics files which will be in MicroStation V8 format. Map scale for this project will be 1" = 100' with all text and cells scaled accordingly.
- Upon project completion, digital files of the individual right-of-way map sheets and all related reference files will be furnished to the County on a compact disk (CD) in Microstation format.

III. Right-of-Way (ROW)

Right-of-Way (ROW) services are not included in this scope of services. Any ROW services deemed necessary will either be added to this scope of services by a supplemental to this work authorization or performed by consulting firms selected by the County.

IV. Utility Coordination

- A. The Engineer will establish contact with existing utilities within and adjacent to the Project limits and set up a utility coordination meeting to present the project to the utility companies and identify potential conflicts.
- B. Provide Quality Levels C (Site Investigation), and D (Research) SUE Investigations. Quality Levels B (Horizontal Locates) and A (Vertical Locates) are not currently part of this scope of services but may be added by a supplemental to this work authorization if determined necessary at a later date.
- C. The Engineer shall also mark utilities a minimum of 50' up Ruby Ranch Road.

- D. The Engineer shall prepare an existing utility layout in Microstation V8 format with line styles defined in a legend.
- E. Show existing utility locations on conceptual schematic and construction documents with the same line styles used on the existing utility layout. Conflicts between existing utilities and the proposed project shall be clearly identified on the conceptual schematic and construction documents.
- F. The Engineer shall prepare and maintain a contact list for all utilities adjacent to the Project. Contact list shall also identify all utility conflicts and proposed resolutions to the utility conflict (relocate, abandon in place, etc.).
- G. The Engineer shall provide project construction plans to the affected utility companies at each submittal. The Utility companies will be responsible for the design of any required utility adjustments.

V. Environmental Studies

- A. The Engineer shall prepare the necessary environmental documentation for this project.
- B. The Engineer will coordinate with the County and TxDOT as necessary to ensure compliance with necessary environmental requirements and law.
- C. All correspondence with TxDOT, the County and resource agencies shall be preserved in electronic PDF format for inclusion in the environmental document. In addition, the County Program Management Consultant will be included in all correspondence to TxDOT, the County or resource agencies.

CODE OF ETHICS FOR HAYS COUNTY

Public employment is a public trust. It is the policy of Hays County to promote and balance the objective of protecting government integrity and the objective of facilitating the recruitment and retention of personnel needed by Hays County. Such a policy implemented by prescribing essential standards of ethical conduct without creating unnecessary obstacles to entering public services.

Public servants must discharge their duties impartially so as to assure fair competitive access to governmental procurement by responsible contractors. Moreover, they should conduct themselves in such a manner as to foster public confidence in the integrity of the Hays County procurement organization.

To achieve the purpose of this article, it is essential that those doing business with Hays County also observe the ethical standards prescribed here.

- 1. It shall be a breach of ethics to attempt to influence any public employee, elected official or department head to breach the standards of ethical conduct set forth in this code.
- 2. It shall be a breach of ethics for any employee of Hays County or a vendor doing business with the county to participate directly or indirectly in a procurement when the employee or vendor knows that:
 - A. The employee or any member of the employee's immediate family, or household has a substantial financial interest pertaining to the procurement. This means ownership of 10% or more of the company involved and/or ownership of stock or other interest or such valued at \$2500.00 or more.
 - B. A business or organization in which the employee, or any member of the employee's family immediate family, has a financial interest pertaining to the procurement.
 - C. Gratuities: It shall be breach of ethics to offer, give or agree to give any employee of Hays County or for any employee to solicit, demand, accept or agree to accept from a vendor, a gratuity of consequence or any offer of employment in connection with any decision approval, disapproval, recommendation, preparation or any part of a program requirement or purchase request influencing the content of any specification or procurement standard, rendering of advice, investigation, auditing, or in any other advisory capacity in any proceeding or controversy, any particular matter pertaining to any program requirement or a contract or subcontract, or to any solicitation or proposal therefore pending before this government.
 - D. **Kickbacks:** It shall be a breach of ethics for any payment, gratuity or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor for any contract for Hays County as an inducement for the award of a contract or order.
 - E. Contract Clause: The prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks prescribed above shall be conspicuously set forth in every contract and solicitation therefore.
 - F. Any effort to influence any employee, elected official, or department head to violate the standards of this code are grounds to void the contract. Please certify by your signature below that you understand the ethics policy of Hays County and in no way will attempt to violate the code.
