



### TITLE 2. CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE

### CHAPTER 103. COLLECTION AND RECORDKEEPING

Art. 103.005. REPORT REQUIRED. (a) An officer listed in Article 103.003 who collects money other than taxes for a county shall report to the commissioners court of the county for which the money was collected during each term of the court.

- (b) An officer listed in Article 103.003 who collects money other than taxes for the state shall report to the district court having jurisdiction in the county the officer serves on the first day of each term of the court.
  - (c) The report must state for the reporting period:
  - (1) the amount of money collected by the officer;
  - (2) when and from whom the money was collected;
  - (3) the process by which the money was collected; and
  - (4) the disposition of the money.
- (d) The report must be in writing and under the oath of the officer.
- (e) If an officer has not collected money since the last report required to be filed with the court or the commissioners court, the officer shall report that fact to the court or commissioners court.

review.

#### **FUND BALANCE POLICY**

### **COUNTY OF HAYS, TEXAS**

### Background:

The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) released Statement 54, "Fund Balance Reporting and Governmental Fund Type Definitions," which is effective for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011. The new Statement is intended to improve the usefulness of the amount reported in fund balance by providing more structured classifications. This Statement applies to fund balance reported in the General Fund and does not apply to Enterprise Funds, Internal Service Funds, and extremely restricted reserves.

Currently fund balance is classified as "reserved" or "unreserved." Unreserved fund balance may be further allocated into designated and undesignated. GASB Statement 54 will change how fund balance is reported.

**Purpose:** The purpose of this policy is to establish operating and reporting guidelines for the fund balances of the governmental funds of Hays County, Texas.

**Fund Balance Classification**: The county governmental-fund financial statements will present fund balances classified in a hierarchy based on the strength of the constraints governing how those balances can be spent. These classifications are listed below in descending order of restrictiveness:

- Nonspendable Fund Balance: This classification includes amounts that cannot be spent because they: (a) are not in spendable form (e.g., inventories and prepaid items); (b) are not expected to be converted into cash within the current period or at all (e.g., long-term receivables); or (c) are legally or contractually required to be maintained intact (e.g., the non-spendable corpus of an endowment).
- Restricted Fund Balance: This classification includes amounts subject to usage constraints that have either been: (a) externally imposed by creditors (e.g., through a debt covenant), grantors, contributors, or laws or regulations of other governments; or (b) imposed by law through constitutional provisions or enabling legislation.
- Committed Fund Balance: This classification includes amounts that are constrained to use for specific purposes pursuant to formal action of Commissioners Court.<sup>1</sup> These amounts cannot be used for other purposes unless the Court removes or changes the constraints via the same type of action used to initially commit them.
- Assigned Fund Balance: This classification includes amounts intended by the county for use for a specific purpose but which do not qualify for classification as either restricted or committed. The intent can be expressed by Commissioners Court or by a Court designee (e.g., County Auditor).<sup>2</sup> This classification applies to the positive unrestricted and uncommitted fund balances of all governmental funds except the General Fund.
- Unassigned Fund Balance: This classification applies to the residual fund balance of the General Fund and to any deficit fund balances of other governmental funds.

**Order of Spending:** Where appropriate, Hays County will typically use restricted, committed, and/or assigned fund balances, in that order, prior to using unassigned resources, but it reserves the right to deviate from this general strategy.

Minimum Fund Balance: Hays County generally aims to maintain the following minimum fund balance:

• General Fund: Unassigned fund balance of approximately 3 to 6 months of budgeted expenditures for the fiscal year, to be used for unanticipated needs.

<sup>1.</sup> A commitment of fund balance requires formal action as to purpose but not as to amount; the latter may be determined and ratified by the Court at a later date. This is often important near year-end, when a purpose or need is known but a cost is not.

<sup>2.</sup> An assignment of fund balance implies an intent of Commissioners Court, but operationally, the ability to implement the intent may be delegated to one or more persons.







§ 61.001, Government Code requires the Commissioner's Court to determine the daily reimbursement for jury service.
SB 1 Article 40 provides that jurors receive reimbursements for jury service to the level, or amount provided for in the General Appropriations Act, as opposed to the current guaranteed \$40 a day reimbursement after the first day.
Currently, Hays County pays its petit jurors at the rate of \$6.00 per day for voir dire and \$40.00 per day for service as a member of the jury. Grand jurors are paid \$10.00 for the first day and \$40.00 for each day of service thereafter.
See attached copies of §61.001, Government Code (before amendments), a copy of the pertinent portion of SB 1, a copy of the General Appropriations Act and letter from the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts regarding the changes in juror program beginning September 28, 2011.

### TITLE 2. JUDICIAL BRANCH

### SUBTITLE E. JURIES

### CHAPTER 61. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Sec. 61.001. REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES OF JURORS AND PROSPECTIVE JURORS. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a person who reports for jury service in response to the process of a court is entitled to receive as reimbursement for travel and other expenses an amount:
- (1) not less than \$6 for the first day or fraction of the first day the person is in attendance in court in response to the process and discharges the person's duty for that day; and
- (2) not less than \$40 for each day or fraction of each day the person is in attendance in court in response to the process after the first day and discharges the person's duty for that day.
- (b) In preparing and approving the annual budget for a county, the commissioners court of the county shall determine the daily amount of reimbursement for expenses for a person who reports for jury service and discharges the person's duty. The amount of reimbursement for each day must be within the minimum and maximum amounts prescribed by this section and paid out of the jury fund of the county. The commissioners court may set different daily amounts of reimbursement for:
  - (1) grand and petit jurors; or
  - (2) different petit jurors based on:
- (A) whether a juror serves in a small claims court, justice court, constitutional county court, county court at law, or district court; or
- (B) any other reasonable criteria determined by the commissioners court.

- (c) A person who reports for jury service in a municipal court is not entitled to reimbursement under this chapter, but the municipality may provide reimbursement for expenses to the person in an amount to be determined by the municipality.
- (d) In a specific case, the presiding judge, with the agreement of the parties involved or their attorneys, may increase the daily amount of reimbursement for a person who reports for jury service in that case. The difference between the usual daily amount of reimbursement and the daily amount of reimbursement for a person who reports for jury service in a specific case shall be paid, in equal amounts, by the parties involved in the case.
- (e) A check drawn on the jury fund by the district clerk of the county may be transferred by endorsement and delivery and is receivable at par from the holder for all county taxes.
- (f) A reimbursement for expenses under this section is not a property right of a person who reports for jury service for purposes of Chapters 72 and 74, Property Code. If a check, instrument, or other method of payment authorized under Section 113.048, Local Government Code, representing a reimbursement under this section is not presented for payment or redeemed before the 90th day after it is issued:
- (1) the instrument or other method of payment is considered forfeited and is void; and
- (2) the money represented by the instrument or other method of payment may be placed or retained in the county's jury fund, the county's general fund, or any other fund in which county funds can be legally placed, at the discretion of the commissioners court.

examine the feasibility and potential cost of converting those statutory county courts into district courts, among other provisions. *Effective 1-1-2012, except for certain sections.* 

### Fiscal Matters

SB 1 by Duncan; relating to certain state fiscal matters; providing penalties. SB 1 is omnibus finance legislation addressing financial matters across a broad array of disciplines. The following are summaries of some specific articles within the legislation that are relevant to the operations of county government. Article 6 changes the classification of the Judicial and Court Personnel Training Fund to an account within the general revenue fund. Article 36 provides a homestead exemption for unmarried surviving spouses of veterans. Article 40 provides that jurors receive reimbursements for jury service to the level, or amount provided for in the General Appropriations Act, as opposed to the current guaranteed \$40 a day reimbursement after the first day. Article 41 amends the Code of Criminal Procedure to require counties with a population of 50,000 or greater to participate in the Collection Improvement Program (reversing changes made by HB 2949 during the Regular Session that would have made this participation discretionary).

Article 48 amends Chapter 11 of the Tax Code, regarding property taxation and exemptions, to change the definition of "goods-in-transit" to require that the personal property be stored under a contract of bailment by a public warehouse operator at one or more public warehouses that are not in any way owned or controlled by the owner of the personal property. Article 58 is the mixed beverage tax amendment. It directs the legislature to return the mixed beverage tax reimbursements to cities and counties to 10.7 percent of the tax collected in the biennium beginning September 2013. This will restore to cities and counties more than \$72 million the state appropriated when it reduced the reimbursement rate to 8.2 percent for the coming biennium. Article 62 abolishes the Texas Department of Rural Affairs and creates the Office of Rural Affairs within the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA). This article transfers all of the appropriations, powers, duties, FTEs and performance measures to the new office within TDA. The bill also establishes a "Rural Health and Economic Development Advisory Council" in order to review rural policies and allocations of community development block grant funding. It is mandated that a county official with health care expertise be appointed to this committee, as well.

Article 69 repeals the 15-cent state court cost associated with the offense of failing to secure a child passenger in a motor vehicle. Article 71 directs the Health and Human Services Commission to efficiently leverage state and local funds in order maximize federal Medicaid matching funds. Specifically, the commission would establish a waiver program for individuals eligible to receive service through the county for chronic health conditions. Additionally, Article 75 authorizes the governor to designate an agency to administer the community development block grant program. Effective 9-28-2011, except for certain sections.

Subject: Changes in Juror Program beginning September 28, 2011

On July 19, 2011 the Governor signed SB 1, 82nd Legislature, 1<sup>st</sup> Called Session, which changes the reimbursement rate for jury service after the second day of service. This bill also requires the Comptroller to provide a daily reimbursement rate to the counties based on funding in the General Appropriations Act.

ow much will the daily rate be for the first day of service?

H

As of September 28, 2011, each juror is still entitled to not less than \$6 for the first day or fraction of the first day the person is in attendance in court in response to the process and discharges the person's duty for that day. (Section 61.001 (a-1) (1) of the Texas Government Code.)

ow much is the daily rate reimbursement after the first day of service?

H

As of September 28, 2011 each county will be entitled to an amount not less than the amount as provided in the General Appropriations Act for each day or fraction of each day the person is in attendance in court in response to the process after the first day and discharges the person's duty for that day. (Section 61.001 (a-1) (2) of the Texas Government Code.)

The Comptroller's Judiciary Section has determined that the county reimbursement amount will be \$28 per day or fraction of a day for juror service beginning on the second day. This amount will be reviewed quarterly and is subject to adjustment based on claims filed and remaining funds. SB 1 specifically provides that the Comptroller may permit a different rate of juror reimbursement for each quarterly payment to counties provided the funds available in the General Appropriations Act.

#### **RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, in the adopted FY 2012-FY 2013 budget the Texas Legislature has authorized the Texas Department of Transportation to go to construction for \$3 billion of Proposition 12 bond funded projects; and

WHEREAS, one of the funding categories is a \$1.4 billion allocation that is divided among the department's 25 District offices, with a Austin District's allocation of \$91.3 million, to be approved by the Texas Transportation Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Austin District has developed a candidate list of projects which TxDOT staff has assessed meet project criteria and can be ready to go to construction within the specified FY 2012 – FY 2013 time frame, including two projects in Hays County; and

WHEREAS, the first project is on FM 2439 (Hunter Rd.) from Centerpoint Rd. to Posey Rd. to reconstruct the existing 2-lane roadway to a 2-lane divided roadway; and

WHEREAS, the second project is on IH 35 at Cement Plant Road (Robert S. Light Blvd and Hillside Terrace) to widen the bridge to add 2 lanes and construct turnaround bridges; and

WHEREAS, both projects meet TxDOT Proposition 12 criteria, including increasing safety, relieving congestion, preserving the existing transportation system, and supporting economic vitality; and

WHEREAS, Hays County has applied to the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization to fund additional improvements to IH 35 between Buda and Kyle, which are compatible with and support the TxDOT proposed IH 35 project, and

NOW, THREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Hays County strongly supports the two candidate projects for IH 35 and FM 2439 in Hays County and requests that the Austin District of TxDOT encourages their funding approval by the Texas Transportation Commission;

#### ATTACHMENT A

42. Appropriations from Proposition 12 General Obligation Bond Proceeds for Bridge, Safety, Connectivity, and Congestion Relief Projects.

Out of funds appropriated above, \$3 billion of Bond Proceeds - GO Bonds (Proposition 12, 2007) shall be used to fund projects that will relieve congestion, enhance bridge and roadway safety, and connect the state's population centers.

- a. The Department of Transportation shall use \$300 million of this amount to acquire right of way, conduct feasibility studies and project planning, and outsource engineering work for the most congested roadway segments in each of the four most congested regions of the state that are included in the 50 most congested roads in the state as listed on the State's Top 100 Most Congested Roadways list as of January 1, 2011. These funds shall be allocated by the Texas Transportation Commission to those regions using the formula used to allocate funds among the Transportation Management Areas in Category 2, Metropolitan and Urban Area Corridor Projects, in the department's Unified Transportation Program. The Department of Transportation shall provide \$3 million out of State Highway Funds appropriated above to the Texas Transportation Institute for the purposes of:
- (1) serving as a facilitator and project coordinator of studies to be conducted by the four

most congested regions to:

- i. determine which projects would have the greatest impacts considering such factors as congestion, economic benefits, user costs, safety, and pavement quality;
- ii. identify funding options to support completion of the projects and suggest the best use of future revenues for the projects;
- iii. include implementation of best traffic and demand management practices;
  - iv ensure open and transparent public participation;
  - v. make recommendations to the Department of Transportation at each major decision point for the projects; and
- (2) reporting the preliminary findings and results to the Eighty-third Legislature and the Transportation Commission no later than September 1, 2012.

#### ATTACHMENT A (continued)

- b. The department shall use \$3 million out of appropriations from Bond Proceeds GO Bonds (Proposition 12, 2007) for the purpose of reimbursing State Highway Fund No. 006 for funds provided to the Texas Transportation Institute in subsection (a) of this rider.
- c. The department shall use \$500 million of this amount to fund the bridge projects listed below. These General Obligation Bond Proceeds may only be used to develop and construct the necessary bridge elements as determined by the Texas Transportation Commission. If the amount of General Obligation Bond Proceeds expended for the bridges listed below is less than \$500 million, the Texas Transportation Commission may allocate the remaining General Obligation Bond Proceeds to other eligible bridge projects.

- d. The commission shall allocate \$600 million of this amount statewide to fund metropolitan and urban mobility projects, using the formula used to allocate funds in Category 2, Metropolitan and Urban Area Corridor Projects, in the department's Unified Transportation Program.
- e. The department shall use \$200 million of this amount to fund statewide connectivity projects selected by the commission.
- f. The commission shall allocate \$1.4 billion of this amount statewide to fund rehabilitation and safety projects using the formula used to allocate funds in Category 1, Preventive Maintenance and Rehabilitation, in the department's Unified Transportation Program.

As a member of the Central Texas transportation community, we are seeking your input on candidate projects to be funded with Proposition 12 bonds. The Austin District will be providing a recommendation to the Texas Transportation Commission for consideration and approval at their September 29, 2011 meeting.

In November 2007 Texas voters approved Proposition 12, authorizing the State of Texas to issue bonds backed by the state's general revenue to provide improvements to the State highway system. In July 2009, the Texas Legislature authorized the department to go to contract on approximately \$2 billion of the Proposition 12 bonds. Projects are underway that have been funded with this \$2 billion (a list and status of the projects are available at <a href="https://www.txdot.gov/project\_information/prop12.htm">www.txdot.gov/project\_information/prop12.htm</a>).

In the recently adopted FY 2012-FY 2013 budget, the Texas Legislature has authorized the department to go to construction for an additional \$3 billion of Proposition 12 bond funded projects. Direction provided under Rider 42 of the department's budget (see Attachment A) subdivided the Proposition 12 funding through several categories of work. One of the categories is a \$1.4 billion allocation that is divided among the department's 25 District Offices. The Austin District's allocation is \$91.3 million.

In discussions among our staff, a candidate list of projects has been developed which staff has assessed can be ready to go to construction within the FY 2012 - FY 2013 budget time frame (see Attachment B). As shown at the bottom of Attachment B, we will be considering six evaluation criteria and eight secondary factors to help develop a final list of priority projects.

We seek your input as to your support of the candidate projects as well as your input as to other well deserved projects that you would like the Austin District to consider. We welcome your comments and request that, if you choose to recommend additional projects, you work closely with your Texas Department of Transportation Area Engineer

The Austin District proposes to apply the following criteria for selecting projects for funding that is used for the department's Unified Transportation Program, Chapter 43 of the Texas Administrative Code [43 TAC 16.105(d)(1)(A)] where the Texas Transportation Commission considers the following: The potential of the project to:

- (i) increase the safety of the transportation system for all transportation users;
- (ii) maintain and preserve the existing transportation system
- (iii) provide congestion relief;
- (iv) increase the accessibility and mobility of the transportation system for all transportation users;
- (v) support the economic vitality of the area, especially by enabling global competitiveness, productivity, and efficiency;
- (vi) promote efficient system management and operation

#### SECONDARY CONSIDERATIONS/FACTORS

The Austin District also proposes to use a secondary set of considerations. Many of these secondary considerations may support the primary criteria shown above. Also, consideration will be be given to the timing of bringing projects forward to construction. Issues such as environmental clearance, inclusion in financially constrained portions of the CAMPO 2035 Regional Transportation Plan and consulation with Rural Planning Organizations like CARTPO and AARPO as well as with local elecetd officials, design, and right of way will be considered in project selection.
