Two staff members were promoted to Chief Deputy position in the County Clerk's Office. County policy states that when someone is promoted that they are to receive a 6% increase. The problem is that a few of staff that they would be supervising would be earning more that the Chief Deputies would. These ladies have been with the County Clerk's Office for over 12 years and are very knowledgeable. The court is willing to make a exception to the Promotion Salary Administration Policy to the 25th percentile. The request for increase on one of the deputies is 3.95% and on the other deputy it's 8.59% above what they are currently earning. This will come out of salary savings within the County Clerk's budget. This has been reviewed by both Auditor and HR Departments. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to approve the exception of the promotion salary Administration Policy of two staff members of the County Clerk's Office at the 25th percentile effective February 1, 2011. He also spoke of a newly elected officials Emergency Preparedness Training on February 25, 2011 at the Courthouse. Mike Mendoza Veterans Services Officer gave an overview of the duties his office. Since he's been in this position he's seen an increase in the number of Veterans being served.

SUMMARY: This would put the Hays County Commissioners Court on record in support of Travis County's application for pass-through funds to improve FM 1626 from near the Hays/Travis County Line to FM 2304 (Manchaca Road). There is no funding or other effort required from Hays County, except perhaps minimal coordination with our consulting engineers. Travis County Commissioners Court is seeking an agreement with the state to improve this section of FM 1626 in order to enhance regional transportation and take pressure off Brodie Lane. The improvements would link with the study area included in the Hays County FM 1626 pass-through project – and would either link, or come close to linking with actual improvements planned by Hays County. Though some Travis officials have been concerned about Hays County's efforts to improve traffic flow and safety on this corridor – fearing it might lead to more vehicle trips – I think we should be supportive of any effort to improve capacity and safety along either side of FM 1626, and I appreciate Travis County's interest in both improving a regional connector and relieving congestion for their neighborhoods along Brodie Lane. The resolution also supports improvements to Manchaca Road off of FM 1626, a route that could be used by some Hays County commuters as an alternate to Brodie Lane. Those improvements to Manchaca Road are planned to be completed by TxDOT outside of the Pass Through Finance Application.



WHEREAS, Hays County is developing improvements to FM 1626 from FM 967 to near Brodie Lane, across the Travis County Line, as part of the County's Pass-Through Finance Program in cooperation with the Texas Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, FM 1626 is a significant roadway in the regional transportation system serving both residents of northern Hays County and southern Travis County; and

WHEREAS, FM 1626 from near the Hays/Travis County Line to Manchaca Road is a currently heavily traveled two-lane roadway; and

WHEREAS, Travis County is responding to the Texas Department of Transportation's Call for Projects for the Fiscal Year 2011 Pass-Through Finance Program for funding to construct improvements to FM 1626 from near the Hays/Travis County Line to Manchaca Road; and

WHEREAS, these improvements include widening the roadway to four-lane facilities with center turn lanes; and

WHEREAS, the proposed expansion of the roadway would improve the regional roadway system serving northern Hays County and southern Travis County, and could improve both safety and mobility for the general public on both sides of the county line;

SUMMARY: DSHS is amending the term for the FY 2011 Bioterrorism Preparedness contract so that the end date will align with the end of the federal project period per federal guidance. The contract term was 08/01/2010 thru 07/31/2012. The contract term is revised to 08/01/2010 thru 07/31/2011. There is no change in the funding amount for FY 2011.

The Bioterrorism Preparedness contract is what we usually refer to as the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) contract with DSHS that funds our emergency preparedness program. The team is composed of the PHEP Coordinator, Chuck Chapman, and the Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) Specialist (title has been changed from SNS Coordinator). We should have a new person in this position by mid-month. The grant amount for FY2011 is \$145,902. It funds infrastructure, equipment, and supplies to sustain the program, as well as, training, travel, salaries, etc. for these 2 staff to work with other emergency managers, e.g. Jeff Turner, Ken Bell, John Moseley, coordinate activities with our regional partners, e.g. Travis and Williamson Counties, and other agencies to ensure that Hays Co is prepared in the event of a bioterrorist event or other public health emergency.

We are responsible for submitting monthly vouchers for reimbursement, and monthly, quarterly (now semi-annually) and annual reports. These reports provide the state with fiscal information, as well as, narratives of our progression in completing objectives of the work plan.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR PHYSICIAN SERVICES

This Memorandum of Agreement for Physician Services (hereinafter "MOA") is entered into between Hays County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (hereinafter "County"), which has a principal business address at 111 E. San Antonio, Suite 300, San Marcos, Texas 78666, and Dr. Jurairat Molina, whose primary place of business is located at 2500 West William Canon Drive, Suite 204, Austin, Texas, 78745 (hereinafter "Provider").

Provider shall conduct an Allergy Clinic, the purpose of which is to provide allergy evaluations and treatment of allergy diseases including allergic rhinitis, asthma, chronic cough, chronic sinusitis, food allergy, chronic skin allergy and other allergy-related conditions. The Allergy Clinic shall offer allergy skin testing and allergy shot (immunotherapy) as an option for treatment. The Allergy Clinic shall provide a comprehensive treatment for those Medicaid patients and Indigent Hays County resident patients patients screened by the Personal Health Department with allergies and asthma and other allergy-related conditions to promote a better quality of life and to reduce emergency room visits and hospitalization as well as to prevent complications such as respiratory difficulty and infection.

The Hays County <u>Personal Health Department</u> in conjunction with Provider shall provide initial care for allergy-related issues and treatment. This program is intended to effectively eliminate the barriers that exist for many families and provides access to an Allergy Specialist for consultation and treatment.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained and intending to be legally bound hereby, the County and Provider agree as follows:

Section 1. Scope of Work

- 1.1 The County agrees to provide:
 - 1.1.1 Space in which Provider can conduct the Allergy Clinic within the Hays County Health Department facility, located at 401-A Broadway Street, San Marcos, TX 78666.
 - 1.1.2 Scheduling and Pre-screening for Medicaid and Indigent clients.
 - 1.1.3 Direction and guidance regarding which clients may be served in the Personal Health Department Facility.
 - 1.1.3 4 Emergency basic life support.
 - 1.1.4-5 Access to standard office supplies in the County's possession.
- **1.2** Provider agrees to provide:
 - 1.2.1 Patient care to all allergy patients <u>confirmed by County under Sections 1.1.2 and 1.1.3</u>, <u>above</u>, by conducting allergy evaluations, which may include allergy skin testing, pulmonary function testing for evaluation of asthma and other respiratory problems, and treatment which may include allergy immunotherapy.
 - 1.2.2 Medical provider Medicaid client billing.
 - 1.2.3 Any Support staff that Provider needs to conduct the Allergy Clinic.
 - 1.2.4 Professional liability coverage in an amount equal to or greater than the industry standard for a physician practicing in Provider's specialization. Evidence of said professional liability coverage is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein for all purposes.
- 1.3 In exchange for Provider's operation of the Allergy Clinic, the County hereby agrees to meet its obligations under this MOA at no charge to Provider. In exchange for the County's provision of space for the Allergy Clinic, Provider hereby agrees to meet his obligations under this MOA at no charge to County.

Section 2. Term

2.1 The period of performance for activities under the MOA shall be from 02/01/2011 to 01/31/2012, unless this MOA is terminated at an earlier date (See Section 3).

Section 3. Termination

3.1 This MOA may be terminated at any time upon the thirty (30) days' written notification by the party seeking termination.

Section 4. Dispute Resolution

4.1 Any charge disputes arising from this MOA shall first be resolved by informal discussions between the county and provider. Any dispute that cannot be resolved by informal discussions between county and provider within a reasonable period of time of the commencement of such discussions (not to exceed thirty (30) days), may be resolved through mediation. If a dispute cannot be resolved by mediation, then either party to this MOA may seek relief in a Hays County court of appropriate jurisdication.

Section 5. Liability: Indemnification: Waiver of Subrogation

- 5.1 This MOA establishes that this program is not a health insurance program.
- 5.2 Provider agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County, and its directors, officers, employees, agents, shareholders, subsidiaries, and affiliates (collectively, the "Indemnified Persons") for any loss, liability, claim, damage, expense arising from third-party claims (collectively, "Damages") in connection with actions performed by Provider and its agents under this MOA.
- 5.3 Provider hereby waives all rights of subrogation against the County for bodily injury (including death) or any other loss arising from actions performed by Provider under this MOA.

Section 6. Non-discrimination

6.1 In connection with the delivery of services under this MOA, County and Provider agree to comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all other Federal, State or local laws, rules and orders prohibiting discrimination.

Section 7. Governing Laws

7.1 This MOA shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and is subject to all applicable Federal laws, regulations, rules and policies.

Section 8. Assignment

8.1 This MOA may not be assigned, delegated, or transferred by either the County or Provider without the express written consent and authorization by both parties. The provisions of the MOA shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of County and Provider hereto and their duly authorized transferees, successors and assigns.

Section 9. Severability

9.1 The provisions of this MOA are not severable. In the event that anyone or more provisions of this MOA are deemed null, void, illegal or unenforceable, County and Provider shall renegotiate or terminate the remaining provision of this MOA unless mutually agreed otherwise.

Section 10. Proprietary Information

10.1 The parties agree that all materials and information pertaining to this agreement provided to the participating health center, including, but not limited to County's name/trademark, logo, Participating Employee Lists, compensation methodologies and rates, and any other specific administrative details, is the proprietary property of county. Participating Health Center will safeguard such information in accordance with the requirements of state and federal law, and shall not use such information, directly or indirectly, for any purpose other than to accomplish the purposes of this agreement, nor shall participating county disclose or release any information pertaining to this agreement to the media or any third party without the prior written consent of the company. This specifically includes, but is not limited to, use of any of the above referenced materials or information, directly or indirectly, to further the business purposes of any organization or business other than the company to whom the information pertains.
