The construction of roadways, the improvement, and the development of the land, as proposed by the developers, will increased the tax base of Hays County, which will be of economic benefit to the citizens. Caldwell County and the City of Uhland have approved this. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to adopt a resolution in support of proposed legislation to add subdivision and road powers to Ranch at Clear Fork Creek Municipal Utility Districts No. 1 and No. 2, consent to and support the bill, enter the resolution in the minutes of this Court, and deliver a copy to the State Senator Glenn Hegar, State Representative Jason Isaac, and to any member of the public desiring a copy of the same. AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE CHANGE ORDER #4 WITH HARRIS ROAD COMPANY FOR THE SPRING LAKE (San Marcos Springs) PRESERVE PROJECT

On October 5, 2010 the Commissioners Court awarded the construction contract for the Spring Lake (San Marcos Springs) Preserve project to Harris Road Company of Wimberley, Texas in the amount of \$108,220.00. Change Order #1 was approved by Commissioners Court on December 7, 2010 with no net change to the contract price. Change Order # 2, approved by the Commissioner Court on December 21, 2010 was done at the request of the City of San Marcos, and increased the contract amount by \$11,250.00 to \$119,470.00. Change Order #3, approved by the Commissioners Court on January 11, 2011 was for \$10,750.00 and increased the total contract amount of \$130,220.00. The current Change Order #4 for \$5,000.00 and is to provide additional trail base materials to gain an accessible route (ADA requirements) to an interpretive kiosk constructed as a Scout project, and to provide an additional viewing station near the sundial feature, enhancing park amenities. These improvements are at the request of the City of San Marcos. The total contract amount with approval of the Change Order would be \$135,220.00. The project is an ongoing joint effort between Texas State University (TSU), the City of San Marcos, and Hays County to conserve a significant land resource of 251 acres located over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone near Aquarena Springs, and provide public access to this area. The project includes accessible and primitive trail development, interpretive signage, benches, outdoor amphitheater (sundial), boardwalk/wildlife viewing station over a pond, and other amenities. This project is funded through a grant from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD), with TSU and the City of San Marcos providing additional funding. No County funds have been allocated or are necessary to complete the construction project. A motion was made by Commissioner Conley, seconded by Commissioner Whisenant to authorize the County Judge to execute Change Order #4 with Harris Road Company for the Spring Lake (San Marcos Springs) Preserve project. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED





SUMMARY:

The RM 2325 project, from Carney Lane to Fischer Store Rd., was identified as a key project in Precinct 3 as part of the 2008 Priority Road Bond Program. The project is nearing completion of design in preparation for letting by the Texas Department of Transportation.

Timing of the project letting is crucial due to the proposed roadway and other safety improvements located along the entrance to Jacobs Well Elementary School. The project's goal is to have the work adjacent to the elementary school mostly complete prior to the start of the 2011 / 2012 school year.

As the project is nearing design completion, there have been several requests by TxDOT that were not in the original project scope. As this project is no longer being let by the County, to take advantage of the savings by allowing TxDOT to let the project and provide construction engineering and inspection services, these items need to be addressed. These items include:

- 1) Additional submittals and reviews by TxDOT necessitated by TxDOT letting the project.
- 2) Revision of Environmental Document for updated TxDOT Standards of Uniformity (SOUs)
- 3) Preparation of a full drainage report as requested by TxDOT hydraulics engineer.

In addition, as utility companies are moving forward with the design of their relocations, they are requesting various proposed elements to be surveyed / staked to assist in their design process. As Loomis provided the design survey, it is the most expeditious route to allow the Loomis surveyors to provide these services which also include the preparation of field notes pertaining to a utility easement which was found during the ROW acquisition process.

Supplemental Agreement No. 2 to the Professional Agreement and Supplemental Work Authorization No. 3 to Work Authorization No. 1 are attached for the Court's approval.

PUBLIC HEARING WITH ACTION CALLING FOR AN ELECTION FOR POSSIBLE CREATION OF THE HAYS COUNTY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT NO. 1 AND FURTHERMORE ADOPT AND ORDER UPON HEARING AND GRANTING PETITION REQUESTING CREATION OF THE HAYS COUNTY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT NO. 1 AND APPOINTING TEMPORARY DIRECTORS [T1-475]

Judge Powers declared the public hearing open. Tom Leonard, Attorney representing the petitioners [Coyote Crew Ranch Ltd./Siepela Interests], spoke of order to require an election to be held to confirm the creation of the Hays County Development District No. 1 (HCDD#1). He read language in the Order. The proposed district lies outside the city limits of the City of Dripping Springs. Elizabeth Jick (CIBC Rep) spoke of their role to provide financing for the project. Jim Siepela, Coyote Crew Ranch Ltd/Siepela Interests, spoke of advantages of this district to the county. He stated that they have worked with the City of Dripping Springs and entered into an agreement with them regarding annexation (as each phase of the single family development is complete, the city will annex those properties). The golf course will be built under the Audubon Society signature program. This will attempt to eliminate runoff. [T1-643] Roger Kew (Colony Rd/Hays Co) spoke of concerns for the need to create this district. He feels like we may be setting a dangerous precedent to encourage similar development. He asked for a cost benefit analysis and for greater public input to see what the benefits are and what the cost might be. [T1-681] Elizabeth Sumter (Wimberley) also requested a cost benefit analysis and she asked about environmental impact study and other studies to determine if this district is necessary. She is concerned about a district being created by one voter (the property owner). She spoke of her concerns regarding the agreement for water source. [T1-716] Annice Ellington (Driftwood/property borders Onion Creek) advised that she started a very simple basic petition campaign in the Dripping Springs area and was able to garner about 220 signatures on it in which the public is saying to us that they are not interested in having a golf resort in their area. (Clerk's note: petition was not shown to or submitted to the court) She is concerned about variances that may be granted that may impact people outside this area (housing, traffic, etc.). {T1-753] Susan Pitman (Wimberley) cautioned the court in moving ahead quickly on this matter. She would like to see more about the implications from a CDD and questioned where this is the kind of development Hays County residents want? She felt like the citizens of this county need to be educated and to be given an opportunity to participate in this matter. She spoke of water that is required to maintain a golf course. [T1-806] JoAnn Larivee (Dripping Springs) asked about public notice (30 days prior to the public meeting). She does not feel like there has been enough public input into this project. Judge Powers closed the public hearing and asked Attorney Tom Leonard to answer some of the concerns. Judge Powers advised the audience that the Court had a workshop regarding this project on December 21, 1999 (see Vol. R Pg. 590). [T1-909] Roger Kew advised that he has in his bag 250 signatures and he asked for a public hearing so that all of those people concerned can come along. (Clerk's note: signatures were not provided to the court). Attorney Tom Leonard spoke of his experience in creating a county development district (Denton County) and he spoke of legislation that requires involvement by all landowners affected. He spoke of election required to approve the district. Each person acquiring land in the district will be advised of the district and obligations.

He spoke of eminent domain issues [Sec. 383.063] affecting only the property within the district. To expand the district you must have unanimous approval of the Commissioners Court. He spoke of annexation that will occur pursuant to agreement with the City of Dripping Springs. The district will pay for the first 15 years of road maintenance and they will then become city streets and there will be no county obligation to maintain those roads. Mike Firley (Dripping Springs Councilman)was present. Rick Corman (Dripping Springs City Council Rep) spoke of agreement between Coyote Crew Ranch and the City of Dripping Springs regarding taxes, infrastructure, and annexation (portions of the Development District will be annexed into the city and will extend their ETJ). He stated that the City does not control the water supply company - the City does enforce zoning and subdivision regulations. James Siepela spoke of plans for a wastewater treatment plant. negotiating with the Dripping Springs Water Supply Corp. regarding water supply and possible wastewater James Siepela spoke of possible use of wastewater effluent for the golf course and he spoke of guidelines being used for containment of water runoff (TNRCC & Audubon International). The water supply corporation will serve the single family development and the hotel and there are several wells on site at the golf course that could be utilized. [T1-1208] Jackson Harper (Sr. Hydrologist of PBS&J) spoke of geologic strata in this area of Hays County (Trinity Aquifer & Glen Rose Aquifer). He stated that most of the domestic wells are in the upper aquifer (200-300 ft) - their wells are in the middle aquifer (500-600 ft.). He feels like the effects should be so minimal as to be nil. He spoke of deeper wells that will be utilized. He spoke of location of other wells in the vicinity in the same aquifer. Hays County Environmental Health Director Allen Walther spoke of water development rules. Commissioner Carter spoke of need to address unresolved issues before taking action and to hold an evening public meeting for public input. She would like more documentation prior to taking action. Commissioner Molenaar advised that the Court will address many of these issues during the subdivision process. James Siepela spoke of providing more details during the development process and that creating the district will allow them to obtain the necessary documentation. Commissioner Burnett asked about tax savings/tax break that are being proposed. Attorney Tom Leonard advised that the taxing entities get their full tax collections and some sales taxes. The project will bring additional tax revenue to the various taxing entities. It is like a road district in that the people within the district must repay the debt. New property owners will be notified of the district and the taxing authorized by the district at the time of property closing. JoAnn Larivee asked about rules and regulations for county development districts and the need to execute good projects. Commissioner Molenaar advised that the county cannot make our own rules and regulations regarding County Development Districts, but we do have rules and regulations for subdivision developments. Our subdivision rules had to be approved by the TNRCC. The state regulates what they can do with water and wastewater and Hays County now has standing with TNRCC regarding water availability. A CDD is a way for a developer to obtain financing for infrastructure. Judge Powers spoke of this being a way for quality development that does not cost the taxpayers. Commissioner Molenaar spoke of sales tax that will be generated by users of the conference center/hotel and golf course and people will spend money in the City of Dripping Springs. This will be clean economic development. Roger Kew asked the cost benefit to the citizens of Hays County.

James Siepela stated that the roads will not be maintained by the county and the county will benefit from ad valorem taxes and sales tax.

No tax break is being requested - this project will generate sales taxes and hotel/motel tax. Dave Penn asked what will happen if development does not occur? James Siepela stated that they research what the anticipated

occupancy levels will be and feasibility studies are done. If the interest level is low, they will know well in advance of beginning this project. Commissioner Burnett asked about failure of the development. James Siepela advised that there is no liability on the county - the investors buying the bond issue are the ones affected. Roger Kew advised that the quality of life will be affect in the area. Commissioner Molenaar spoke of need to bring in quality development to this county. [T1-2848] He stated that property owners should be allowed to do what they want with their land as long as they follow rules and regulations that protect the health and safety of the citizens. This development will be within the City Limits of Dripping Springs and they will have to follow their rules and regulations. This property could be developed as a manufactured rental community that would use even more water from the aquifer and possibly pollute Onion Creek. A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the approval of the creation and acts of Hays County Development District No. 1 and its administration, powers, duties, operation, financing and acquisition of its project.

BE ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. (a) The legislature finds that the creation of Hays County Development District No. 1 (the "district") and the project approved by the Hays County Commissioners Court on January 11, 2000 (the "project"), and other improvements projects described in Section 4(a) and (b) herein, will serve the public purpose of attracting visitors and tourists to Hays County and will result in employment and economic activity in the manner contemplated by Section 52-a, Article III, Texas Constitution and Chapter 383, Local Government Code. The creation and continued operations of the district are declared to be essential to the accomplishment of the purposes of Article III, Sections 52 and 52-a, and Article XVI, Section 59, of the Texas Constitution and to the accomplishment of the several other public purposes stated in this Act.

- (b) The Legislature finds that the creation of Hays County Development District No.1 by the Hays County Commissioners Court on January 11, 2000 and all actions heretofore taken with regard to the District are hereby approved. The Legislature further confirms and validates the previous acts and actions of the District, including elections.
- (c) The legislature further finds that the creation and operation of the district and the acquisition or financing of the project by the district serve the purpose of Section 59, Article XVI

and Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution and that all steps necessary to create the district have been taken and the works, projects, improvements, and services that are to be promoted, facilitated, and accomplished by the district under powers conferred by Article III. Sections 52 and 52-a, and Article XVI, Section 59, of the Texas Constitution and other powers granted under this Act will provide a substantial and continuing public use and benefit.

SECTION 2. FINDINGS RELATED TO BOUNDARIES. The District's boundaries are those as found by the Hays County Commissioners Court's Order Upon Hearing Granting Petition Requesting the Creation of Hays County Development District No. 1 and Appointing Temporary Directors dated January 11, 2000. The Legislature finds that these boundaries form a closure. A mistake in field notes or copying the field notes in the legislative process does not affect the organization, existence, or validity of the District, the right of the district to levy and collect taxes, or the legality or operation of the district or its governing body.

SECTION 3. FINDING OF BENEFIT. All of the land and other projects included within the boundaries of the District will be benefitted by the works and projects that are to be accomplished by the District pursuant to the powers conferred by Article III, Section 52-a, Article III, Section 52 and Article XVI, Section 59 of the Texas Constitution. The District serves a public use and benefit.

SECTION 4. IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS. (a) The district may provide, or it may enter into contracts with a governmental or private entity to provide, the following types of improvement projects or activities in support of or incidental to those projects, including purchase:

(1) a supply and distribution facility or system to provide potable and nonpotable water to the residents and businesses of the district, including a wastewater collection facility;

(2) a paved road or street, inside and outside the district as authorized by Section

52, Article III, Texas Constitution;

- (3) the planning, design, construction, improvement, and maintenance of:
 - (A) landscaping:
 - (B) highway right-of-way or transit corridor beautification and

improvement;

- (C) lighting, banners, and signs;
- (D) a street or sidewalk;
- (E) a hiking and cycling path or trail;
- (F) a pedestrian walkway, skywalk, crosswalk, or tunnel;
- (G) a park, lake, garden, recreational facility, sports facility, golf course, open space, scenic area, or related exhibit or preserve;
 - (H) a fountain, plaza, or pedestrian mall; or
 - (I) a drainage or storm-water detention improvement:
- (4) protection and improvement of the quality of storm water that flows through the district;
- (5) the planning, design, construction, improvement, maintenance, and operation of:
 - (A) a water or sewer facility; or
 - (B) an off-street parking facility or heliport;
 - (6) the planning and acquisition of:
 - (A) public art and sculpture and related exhibits and facilities; or
 - (B) an educational and cultural exhibit or facility;
 - (7) the planning, design, construction, acquisition, lease, rental, improvement,

maintenance, installation, and management of and provision of furnishings for a facility for:

- (A) a conference, convention, or exhibition;
- (B) a manufacturer, consumer, or trade show;
- (C) a civic, community, or institutional event; or
- (D) an exhibit, display, attraction, special event, or seasonal or cultural celebration or holiday;
- (8) the removal, razing, demolition, or clearing of land or improvements in connection with an improvement project;
- (9) the acquisition and improvement of land or other property for the mitigation of the environmental effects of an improvement project;
- (10) the acquisition of property or an interest in property in connection with an authorized improvement project;
- (11) a special or supplemental service for the improvement and promotion of the district or an area adjacent to the district or for the protection of public health and safety in or adjacent to the district, including:
 - (A) advertising:
 - (B) promotion;
 - (C) tourism;
 - (D) health and sanitation;
 - (E) public safety;
 - (F) security;
 - (G) fire protection or emergency medical services;
 - (H) business recruitment;

- (I) development:
- (J) elimination of traffic congestion; and
- (K) recreational, educational, or cultural improvements, enhancements, and services; or
- (12) any similar public improvement, facility, or any service or public improvement, facility or service of the type normally performed by a Municipal Utility District and/or a Municipal Management District.
- (b) The district may undertake the project approved by the Hays County Commissioners

 Court on January 11, 2000, in whole or part, or, if the board determines, the district may undertake

 any or all of the items described in subsection (a) above, including both residential and commercial
 activities.
- SECTION 5. GENERAL POWERS REGARDING CONTRACTS. (a) The district may:
- (1) contract with any person to accomplish any district purpose, including a contract for:
- (A) the payment, repayment, or reimbursement of costs incurred by that person on behalf of the district, including all or part of the costs of an improvement project and interest on the reimbursed cost; or
- (B) the use, occupancy, lease, rental, operation, maintenance, or management of all or part of a proposed or existing improvement project; and
- (2) apply for and contract with any person to receive, administer, and perform a duty or obligation of the district under a federal, state, local, or private gift, grant, loan, conveyance, transfer, bequest, or other financial assistance arrangement relating to the

investigation, planning, analysis, study, design, acquisition, construction, improvement, completion, implementation, or operation by the district or others of a proposed or existing improvement project.

- (b) A contract the district enters into to carry out a purpose of this chapter may be on any terms and for any period the board determines.
- (c) Any person may contract with the district to carry out the purposes of this chapter without further statutory or other authorization.

SECTION 6. POWERS. The District has all of the rights, powers, privileges, authority, functions, and duties provided by Chapters 375 and 383, Local Government Code, as amended, to County Development Districts and Municipal Management Districts, and the general laws relating to conservation and reclamation districts created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, except that the district's bonds and other securities are not subject to the jurisdiction or supervision of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality under Chapter 49, Water Code, or other law; including but not limited to:

- (1) The authority to levy, assess and collect ad valorem taxes for the purposes approved at the elections conducted on November 7, 2000.
- boundaries of the District, to levy, assess and collect taxes for maintenance and operating purposes in the manner set forth in Section 49.107(a)-(e), Water Code, as amended, and for the repayment of bonds, notes, warrants, lease purchase agreements, certificates of assessment, certificates of participation in lease purchase agreements, and other interest-bearing obligations in the manner set forth in Section 49.106(a) (d), Water Code, as amended, for all of the purposes for which the District may expend funds. Provided, however, that any prior elections the District conducted

pursuant SB 1823 or the district's creation by the Hays County Commissioners Court on January 11, 2000 related to maintenance and operation taxes are validated and no further election is required.

- (3) To establish, levy and collect special assessments in the manner specified in Sections 375.111 through 375.124, Local Government Code, as amended; provided, however, that Sections 375.161 through 375.163, Local Government Code, as amended, shall not apply to the assessments imposed by the District;
- (4) To utilize funds whether the funds are derived from ad valorem taxes, sales and use taxes, hotel occupancy tax, <u>assessments</u>, revenues from the Project or any other source, for payment of projects or services in the manner authorized by Section 375.181, Local Government Code as amended, <u>Chapter 54</u>, <u>Water Code and/or Chapter 383</u>, Local Government Code as amended;
- agreements, certificates of participation in lease purchase agreements, general obligation bonds and notes and revenue bonds and notes, and combination general obligation and revenue bonds and notes and other interest-bearing obligations in the manner specified in Sections 375.201 through 375.204, Local Government Code, as amended. To enter into these obligations, the District shall obtain only those approvals required for the issuance of obligations by Hays County by Chapter 53, Acts of the 70th Legislature, Second Called Session, 1987.
- (6) To adopt the powers of a road district under Article III, Section 52(b)(3), Texas Constitution in the manner specified in Section 53.029(c) and (d), Water Code, as amended.

 Any prior elections the District conducted pursuant SB 1823 or pursuant to the district's creation

by the Hays County Commissioners Court on January 11, 2000 related to road district powers are validated and no further election is required.

- (7) To levy, assess and collect ad valorem taxes to make payments on a contract under Section 49.108(a) through (d), Water Code, as amended, after obtaining those approvals specified in Section 1 of Chapter 778, Acts of the 74th Legislature, Regular Session, 1995.
- (8) To exercise all of the rights, powers and authority of a road district, a municipal management district, and a municipal utility district; water control and improvement district which are not specifically contradicted by Chapter 383, Local Government Code, as amended;
- this Act, and all of rights, powers and authority granted to the District by this Act, and all of rights, powers and authority granted to the District by Chapter 383 and 375, Local Government Code, and/or Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, which are not contrary to any provisions of this Act or SB 1823, to finance, construct or otherwise acquire the Project or any element of the Project identified in the Commissioner Court Order Upon Hearing Granting Petition Requesting the Creation of Hays County Development District No. 1 and Appointing Temporary Directors dated January 11, 2000, or any improvement project listed in Section 4 above, if built, including, but not limited to a hotel, the golf course, any residential portions of the development, nature trails, commercial activities or endeavors, the water, sewer, drainage and road improvements, the organizational costs and costs of issuance of the obligations of the District.
- (10) Sections 375.207 and 375.208, Local Government Code, do not apply to the district.

 SECTION 7. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION. This Act shall be liberally construed in conformity with the legislative findings and purposes set forth therein. This Act prevails over any provisions of general law that is in conflict or inconsistent with this Act. Specific provisions of

SB 1823 not repealed by this Act remain valid. Provided, however; that any direct conflict between SB 1823 and this Act, this Act prevails.

SECTION 8. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS. The District shall continue to operate administratively as a Municipal Utility District County Development District and, subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth, comply with Subchapters C and D, Chapter 49 and Subchapter C, Chapter 54 Water Subchapter C, Chapter 383, Government Code:

- (a) Each director who takes office after the effective date of this Act shall own land within the boundaries of the District or be a qualified voter within the District;
- (b) A vacancy in the office of director shall be filled by appointment by the remaining members of the board of directors;
- (c) The Board of Directors may designate and establish one or more district offices outside Hays County;
- (d) The Board of Directors may, at any time, on its own motion and shall, if presented with a petition bearing the signatures of a majority of the registered voters of the district gathered within a 30 day time period, call an election to determine whether the Board of Directors of the District will be selected by popular election, rather than being selected by appointment by the Commissioners Court.

The order calling the election under this Section must state:

- (i) the nature of the election; including the proposition that is to appear on the ballot;
 - (ii) the date of the election;
 - (iii) the hours during which the polls will be open;
 - (iv) the location of the poling places; and

(v) any other information-necessary or appropriate to comply with the Election Code, as amended.

Notice of the election shall be given by publishing a substantial copy of the election order once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper with general circulation in Hays County. The first publication must appear no later than the 14th day before the date set for the election.

The election shall be held in accordance with the provision of the Election Code, to the extent not inconsistent with this chapter.

The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the proposition: "The selection of directors of Hays County Development District No. 1 by popular election."

After the election, the presiding judge shall make returns of the result to the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall canvass the returns and canvass the results.

If a majority of the votes cast in the election favor the selection of directors by popular election, then the Board of Directors shall declare the result and enter it into its minutes. Thereafter, the Board of Directors shall take all steps necessary to conduct an election on the uniform election date next preceding the September 1 date on which an appointed director's term of office expires. Each appointed director shall serve until his successor is elected and duly qualifies. The term of office of each elected director shall be four (4) years. The election of directors shall be conducted in the manner authorized by the Election Code.

If a majority of the votes cast in the election are against the selection of directors by popular election, the Board of Directors shall declare the result and enter it into its minutes.

Thereafter, the directors shall continue to be selected by appointment by the commissioners court.

Elections to determine the manner of selection of directors under this Section shall occur no more often than once every 24 months.

A certified copy of the minute order declaring the results of the election shall be sent to the commissioners court.

- (d) No confirmation election or other is required for the Board members who are members on the effective date of this Act;
- (e) The District is not required to conduct any additional elections for any powers granted to the District as a result of this Act;
- (e) The Board of Directors may change the name of the District by a majority vote.

SECTION 9. The Legislature finds that the principal function of the District is to provide for development and operation of the Project to facilitate economic development and to attract visitors and tourists which result in employment and economic activity in Hays County. The Legislature finds that the District may provide water and sewer, landscaping and right of way purchase, drainage and reclamation services to residential retail, entertainment venues or commercial customers. The District is a district described in Section 49.181(h)(4), Water Code, as amended.

SECTION 10. ADDITION AND EXCLUSION OF LANDS

In addition to the authority granted to the District by Section 383.084, Local Government Code, the District may add lands in the manner provided by Section 49.301, Water Code, as

amended, and may exclude lands in the methods provided by Sections 49.303 through 49.308, Water Code, as amended.

SECTION 11. RULES: ENFORCEMENT. (a) The district may adopt rules:

- (1) to administer or operate the district;
- (2) for the use, enjoyment, availability, protection, security, and maintenance of the district's property and facilities; or
 - (3) to provide for public safety and security in the district.
 - (b) The district may enforce its rules by injunctive relief.
- (c) To the extent a district rule conflicts with a city rule, order, or regulation, the city rule, order, or regulation controls.

SECTION 12. USE OF ROADWAY, PARK, OR OTHER PUBLIC AREA OF THE DISTRICT. (a) The board by rule may regulate the private use of a public roadway, open space, park, sidewalk, or similar public area in the district. To the extent the district rules conflict with a rule, order, or regulation of the city, the rule, order, or regulation of the city controls. A rule may provide for the safe and orderly use of public roadways, open spaces, parks, sidewalks, and similar public areas or facilities.

- (b) The board may require a permit for a parade, demonstration, celebration, entertainment event, or similar nongovernmental activity in or on a public roadway, open space, park, sidewalk, or similar public area or facility. The board may charge a fee for the permit application or for public safety or security services in an amount the board considers necessary.
- (c) The board may require a permit or franchise agreement with a vendor, concessionaire, exhibitor, or similar private or commercial person or organization for the limited use of the area or facility on terms and on payment of a permit or franchise fee the board may impose.

SECTION 13. DISSOLUTION OF DISTRICT BY PETITION OF TAXPAYERS

In addition to the method of dissolution of the District set forth in Sections 383.122 and 383.123, Local Government Code, as amended, the District may be dissolved in the following manner:

- (a) A Petition for Dissolution, duly executed by the owners of taxable property equal to at least 60% of the appraised value of property within the boundaries of the District which is subject to ad valorem taxation by the District on the January 1 next preceding the date of the Petition for Dissolution, may be filed with the Board of Directors, if all of the interest-bearing obligations of the District have been paid.
- (b) If a majority of the Board of Directors determines that the Petition for Dissolution is in the form specified by this Section 10 and that all of the interest-bearing obligations of the District have been paid, then the Board of Directors shall enter an order dissolving the District and execute instruments transferring assets of the District to the owners of the property subject to ad valorem taxation by the District on the January 1 next preceding the date of the Petition for Dissolution. If the Board of Directors fails to make the determination necessary to enter the order dissolving the District, it shall dismiss the Petition for Dissolution and set forth its reasons in writing in the dismissal order.
- (c) An order entered pursuant to Section 10(b) of this Act may be challenged only in a state district court proceeding filed by owners of property subject to ad valorem taxation by the District. The proceeding shall be filed in the county in which the District is located, not later than the 10th day after the date of the order. If such a proceeding is not filed within the time specified herein, the order becomes final and may not thereafter be challenged, and each finding in

the order becomes incontestable. The order can be overturned only if the state district court finds that the entry of the order constituted an abuse of discretion by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 14. RETAINAGE OF POWERS AND ACTIONS. The district shall retain all powers and findings from SB 1823 (77th Session). Specific provisions of SB 1823 not repealed by this Act remain valid. Provided, however; that any direct conflict between SB 1823 and this Act, this Act prevails.

SECTION 15. FINDINGS RELATING TO PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS. The Legislature finds:

- (a) The proper and legal notice of the intention to introduce this Act, setting for the general substance of this Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished by the constitution and other laws of this state, including the governor, who has submitted the notice and the Act to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.
- (b) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives within the required time.
- (c) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this state and rules and procedures of the legislature with respect to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled and accomplished.

SECTION 16. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

Section 16. EMERGENCY. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses crate an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended.

Hays County Parks and Open Space Advisory Board Project Comments

Project #1. City of Dripping Springs, Harrison Ranch Park Score: 84.6

- Park is located in a rapidly growing area of the County and is needed
- Meets most Master Plan criteria very well with diversity of elements
- Elements of park good, well-conceived design, serves a variety of users
- The park is supported by the community, with community involvement demonstrated
- Additional land has been donated
- Lots of current activity and interest
- Opportunities for special events revenue generation
- Equity consideration in funding projects in this portion of the County
- Major focus on equestrian facilities not a high priority in Master Plan

Project #2. Trust for Public Land, Purgatory Creek Tracts Score: 80.2

- Property was highly ranked as part of Open Space Call for Projects
- Meets several of the categories listed in the Park Bond Fund language, including water quality, habitat, open space, and park elements
- Adjacent to existing conserved land
- Significant protection of aquifer recharge and endangered species
- Preserves viewshed off of Wonder World Drive in San Marcos
- · Accessible to a fairly large population base
- Could be subject to development should it not be acquired for open space
- Partnership between City of San Marcos, Trust for Public Land, and Hays County
- Builds on Hays County Regional Habitat Conservation Plan goals
- NOTE: Park Bond Funding, if awarded, should be made contingent upon acquisition of grant funds as described in application

Project #3. City of Buda, Bradfield Park/Trail Score: 73.7

- Project scored well under the criteria for evaluation of projects
- Trail projects high priority in Master Plan, as well as other project elements
- Provides connectivity to existing parks and business areas in Buda, and may be linked to schools
- Both street and railway crossings need more thought in engineering/design safety concerns
- Additional funding should be sought through TPWD Trail grant and possible mobility funds

Project #4. City of Buda, Skate Park

Score: 71.7

- Although not a priority in Hays County Master Plan, a high priority in Buda
- A recognized need in Buda, supported by youth and others in addressing skate boarding within the community pro-active solution
- Fairly low cost project in addressing the identified need good investment
- Could potentially get a lot of use, although some consider that skate boarders may grow tired of the facility
- Considered a very good project by POSAB

Project #5. Hays County WCID#2, Bear Creek Greenbelt/Park

Score: 68.9

- Addressed criteria for evaluation well
- Fairly low cost for the improvements proposed
- Facilities would probably be heavily utilized if developed as planned
- Good recreational park, good matching funds
- Public park area needs to be promoted not only in subdivision but in the area if public funds are to be invested concern of neighborhood use only
- Parking/accessibility concern

Project #6. Hays Co. Youth Athletic Assoc., Sports Complex Imp. Score: 68.3

- Project elements not high priorities in existing Master Plan
- Very expensive project with limited matching funds
- Although ranked low on the criteria for evaluation, this is a needed facility that serves a large number of area youth
- Local communities need to consider some support for this facility
- May consider some partial funding for this project
- Located in unincorporated Hays County good location to use county funds

Project #7. Friends of Craddock Park, Craddock Park

Score: 67.7

- Land acquisition only, with no matching funds identified
- Project is essentially conceptual, with formal support needed from the City of San Marcos
- Concept has merit, and would serve a large number of people in this area of San Marcos
- Identified the need for more recreational parks in San Marcos
- Currently under consideration in the San Marcos Parks and Open Space Master Plan (Draft)

Project #8. City of Buda, Whispering Hollow Off-Leash Park

Score: 65.3

- Good idea but didn't rank high in Master Plan priorities or overall need
- Limited user group
- Should solicit funds/contributions from dog owners for such a facility
- Fairly low cost

Project #9. Hill Country Conservancy, Storm Ranch Easement Score: 63.8

- Excellent conservation project, but weak in recreational use and very limited public access
- Fairly low dollar amount in Park Bond funds requested to secure conservation easement on relatively large acreage
- Public access a major concern, although there is an indirect public benefit
- This is a well-established conservation area, with no eminent development

Project #10. Dripping Springs Youth Sports Assoc., Field Improvements Score: 61.2

- Not a high priority in Master Plan
- Matching funds only partially secured
- Somewhat limited public access
- Did not score well under the criteria for evaluation of projects
- City of Dripping Springs should provide partial support
- Has track record of operation
- Relatively low request for the improvements to be made

Project #11. Swimberley, Inc., Wimberley Aquatics Recreation Park Score: 61.1

- Primary purpose of facility is not a priority in the Master Plan
- Extremely high cost, and a market study is needed to assess financial viability and backing
- Very limited matching funds identified at this point
- General concern about cost, short- and long term
- Need for extensions of infrastructure to site water, wastewater, road
- Concern about local funding in area in regards to the ongoing Blue Hole project
- Has some merit in regards to expressed desires for an indoor swimming facility

Project #12. Hays Co. SSTF, Tx Shooting Sports Center Score: 50.1

- Primary purpose of facility is not a priority in the Master Plan
- Funding request is for land purchase only, and exceeds current remaining amount of bond funds available
- There are no matching funds for the land purchase
- Land acreage identified in proposal would only accommodate shooting sports center, and not the parkland/other elements discussed in application
- Road and other infrastructure development needed significant additional cost
- Question revenue stream
- There is definitely a need for a shooting sports complex/range in Hays County, but this is not an appropriate use of the Park and Open Space Bond funds

SUMMARY:

Recently, the City of Kyle requested that Hays County vacate the building that is currently being occupied by (enter date) due to employment growth. Therefore, Commissioner Jones is requesting that Broaddus & Associates be allowed to move forward with design and construction management for the project. On February 14, 2011, Commissioner Jones received a summary of the projected costs of the building and the appraisal for the two building sites that were suggested, Plum Creek and FM 150. The proposed building would include space for the Justice of the Peace, Juvenile Probation, Adult Probation, the Tax Assessor, Sheriff's Office, Public Health, Constable, and Commissioner.

Precinct 2 Office Building

Summary

Broaddus & Associates (B&A) seeks the Court's approval to move forward with solicitation of Statements of Qualification from design-build teams for a new Precinct 2 office building to be located in the Plum Creek development in Kyle, TX. The Plum Creek location was selected by a panel of Precinct 2 stakeholders following a thorough solicitation and selection process involving multiple sites and landowners. The new facility is expected to be approximately 17,000 SF and will house all Precinct functions possibly including Public Health. The following summary provides information regarding the options available to the County to house the Precinct 2 office.

Option 1 - Design-Build Delivery

- Estimated Cost B&A estimates that a not-to-exceed Total Project Cost of between \$225 and \$250 per square foot is appropriate for this facility. Should a Design/Build delivery method be chosen by the Court, the Total Project Cost range would be included in an initial RFQ document. This cost is based on existing County buildings that incorporate architecture and materials similar to those expected to be used in the Precinct 2 office building. Total project cost can decrease as design progresses.
- Estimated Project Timeline (assumes a conservative timeline for Court decisions and third-party consummation of land transaction. Estimate can be accelerated if contract, design and funding decisions are made without delay)
 - March 2011 Procurement process begins, RFQ for Design/Build services published
 - B&A will create the RFQ document, sample contract and scoring matrix;
 B&A will also provide programming documentation
 - B&A will provide a dedicated project website to receive questions from Design/Build teams during the procurement process, respond to those inquiries and publish results





- Collaborate with County Purchasing and County Attorney during procurement
- Conduct RFQ/RFP evaluation and scoring with steering committee
- Conduct RFP finalist interviews
- Post for final approval by the Court
- April 2011 Receipt and evaluation of RFQ submittals, RFP for Design/Build services published
- May 2011 Receipt and evaluation of RFP submittals, Design/Build team selected, commence program evaluation and design
- o June 2011 Complete three-party land swap with Plum Creek and City of Kyle
- o July 2011 Design/Build contract finalized, project funds available
- o October 2011 GMP established, construction documents completed
- November 2011 Construction commences
- August 2012 Substantial completion
- September 2012 Occupancy
- o November 2012 Close-out complete

Option 2 - Continued rental from City of Kyle

The City of Kyle, which currently leases space to the County for the existing Precinct 2 office, has expressed a strong interest in utilizing the space for its own purpose. The City recently renewed the existing lease at a monthly rate of \$7500 until December 1st, 2011 at which time the rent escalates to \$10,000 per month for one option period of six months.

Option 3 - Lease (and retrofit) existing space from a third party

- Based on a LoopNet search of available property in The City of Kyle and the City of Buda
 it appears that there is a lack of adequate space to accommodate a Precinct 2 office
 facility. The County should consider the following when reviewing potential spaces for
 rent from third parties:
 - Occupancy will be contingent on owner approval of all County uses
 - County will likely incur construction costs to retrofit certain facilities to accommodate County uses
 - Asking rental rates for office and retail space, regardless of availability to County, are likely to be higher than current rates paid to City of Kyle in existing Precinct 2 office facility
 - Currently available space may not provide County with adequate ingress/egress for law enforcement vehicles and constituent traffic flow


Option 4 - Public-Private Partnership

- Private financing of a Precinct 2 office facility is an available option. There are many different methods of structuring a public-private partnership; however, in general, the County can expect to lease space from a private development team for a period of time (likely 15-20 years) followed by a reversion of ownership to the County at the end of the lease period
- The County could also build in a right to purchase the facility prior to expiration of the tenant lease if so desired
- A private developer could potentially construct a Precinct 2 office facility for a lower total project cost than the County will incur via a Design/Build method as a result of the following:





- Reduced procurement time via ability to bypass government procurement procedures and approvals
- Elimination of need for court approval to move forward at critical points in project timeline
- o Reduction in amount of input and oversight from steering committee
- End result is a facility constructed to a performance specification with input from the County only at defined points in the project timeline ... project is constructed faster and, potentially, at less cost than traditional methods
- A private developer's cost of capital will be greater than that at which the County can borrow
- If a private developer obtains debt financing as part of its capital structure, the lease form and associated documentation will likely be generated by the lender/developer team (i.e., there might be less flexibility for the County to use internal forms and procedures)



Summary of Precinct 2 stakeholder interviews – February 16th, 2010

- 1. Beth Smith, Justice of the Peace
- Chief clerk needs separate office and three additional clerks need work spaces in large room
- Shared staff bathroom is fine
- Courtroom and jury deliberation room sizes in original program are sufficient
- Jury deliberation room can also be used for other purposes: attorney meetings, juvenile court accommodations, etc.
- Sheriff's office needs to have total access to the JoP suite (also needs to be in proximity to the Constable's office)
- A back door is needed in order for the JoP to be designated as a Juvenile Magistrate (Judge Smith also prefers a separate personal entrance if possible)
- Judge Smith prefers a multi-use, de-centralized facility; i.e., no central secretary/receptionist, phone system, etc.
- Judge's office door should NOT face the chief clerk's office
- Storage space and copy/break room area is needed for JoP team
- Preference is for clerks to have separate ingress/egress from public
- Judge's bench, jury box and witness stand all need special access delivered by special permit
- If possible, separate (small) restroom facility for JoP
- A multi-use meeting room is a good idea original program size of 480 SF should suffice
- A space for MHMR is preferred (secretary and psychiatrist's office)

Total Justice of the Peace employees: 5 JP employees and 2 MHMR = 7 Estimated DGSF: 2,629 SF

- 2. Ed Cooper and Shelly Williams, Juvenile Probation
- One office and one juvenile waiting room are fine, as in original program
- Evening juvenile programs have up to 15 offenders (with two officers) and would meet in multi-purpose training room
- Prefer to be next to Sheriff for security reasons
- Separate bathroom for drug testing is preferred (can be shared with Adult Probation and JoP)
- 12-passenger van transports offenders (on occasion)

Total Juvenile Probation employees: 2 Estimated DGSF: 324 SF

3. Luanne Caraway, Tax Assessor

- Needs to close early to count money; arrangement should try to take account of this such that customers aren't left standing in line
- A combined office (i.e., a site north of Kyle that would allow for closure of the Buda office) would need to accommodate four clerks; a separate office would need to allow for three clerks
- A vault is needed with enough room to count money
- A drive-thru window would be nice if possible
- Each clerk has TWO CPUs and TWO printers (one keyboard and one monitor)
- Each clerk needs two distinct cash drawers
- Needs to be as far away from the Probation offices as possible

- Separate access would be nice (not necessary but nice)
- Means of egress should be away from customers if at all possible
- A "bank" set-up would be best; however, thick glass with speakers has presented a problem in the Precinct 4 office
- At least one workstation needs to be handicapped accessible
- A drop-box built into the façade would be nice
- Enough room for customers to wait and queue is necessary

Total Tax Assessor employees: 4
Estimated DGSF: 1115 SF

- 4. Mike Davenport, Sheriff's Office
- Office space needs to be doubled. New needs are: FOUR offices (one supervisor and three other
 officers) along with ONE additional office for DPS. Preference is for office doors to open to Patrol Room
- Patrol room needs to be bigger (should accommodate six officers and a large area with a common table for 8 persons). Patrol room should also have a substantial supply closet
- One interview room is sufficient, as in original program
- Separate entrance would be nice
- Needs to be away from Probation offices so that detainees do not cross paths with Probationers
- Designated parking is needed
- Need reception to be barrier to public; can share with other offices

From our stats, we served approximately 1500 clients from Jan 2010 thru Dec 2010. Of these, 1140 were immunization clients only so may have been in just 1 or 2 times. However, the remaining 360 clients have had multiple clinic visits. These clients would be primarily maternity and well child clients. Maternity clients start with an application visit, 1 visit per month and progress to 1 visit per week. Well child clients have 12 visits between birth and 2 years then annual visits thereafter. We have 6-7 staff at that clinic.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE AUTOMOBILE BURGLARY & THEFT PREVENTION AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the County of Hays is a member of the Sheriff's Combined Auto Theft Force, a Multi-County Law Enforcement Agency that is funded by a grant made available by the Texas Automobile Burglary & Theft Prevention Authority (ABTPA); and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Combined Auto Theft Task Force performs investigations and Public Awareness related to the theft of motor vehicles along with assisting law enforcement agencies that do not have auto theft units; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Combined Auto Theft Task Force performs 68-A inspections on vehicles and trailers in which there are questions about the validity of the Vehicle Identification Number; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Combined Auto Theft Task Force has recovered more than 2,651 vehicles valued at more than 33 million dollars, 6,454 agency assists, 2,410 68-A Inspections, 4,463 cases worked; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Automobile Burglary and Theft Prevention Authority has been in existence since the 72nd Legislative Session in 1991 (HB640) and is funded by a \$1.00 assessment to auto insurance policies. These dedicated funds were then used by the Authority to assist local law enforcement agencies to develop task forces to combat theft of motor vehicles and other related motor vehicle crimes; and

WHEREAS, during the 75th Legislative Session in 1997, with the passing of House Bill 1387, ABTPA lost dedicated funds status and since that time the millions of dollars that have been collected by the insurance industry have been diverted to the general revenue fund of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, since the inception of the ABTPA motor vehicle theft has been reduced by over 60%; the recovery of stolen motor vehicles has increased by 20%; and the ABTPA task forces have recovered over 1.6 million stolen vehicles. The total value of vehicles and other properties recovered by the ABTPA task forces has exceeded \$11.6 billion dollars; and

WHEREAS, the 82nd session of the Texas Legislature has recommended zero funding for the Automobile Burglary & Theft Prevention Authority; and

WHEREAS, Hays County has resolved to support no unfunded mandate legislation and will not be able to support this program locally; and

WHEREAS, the lack of funding to the Automobile Burglary & Theft Prevention Authority would require the services performed by the Sheriff's Combined Auto Theft Task Force be tasked to the local law enforcement agencies within Hays County and require local residents to travel to Austin or San Antonio for a 68-A Inspection.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

The County of Hays, requests that the 82nd Legislature, Regular Session:

- 1. Restore funding to the Automobile Burglary & Theft Prevention Authority: and
- Dedicate all funds received, for the purposes of combating auto theft and reducing the number of stolen vehicles, to the Automobile Burglary & Theft Prevention Authority for the purposes intended.

ADOPTED THIS 8TH DAY OF MARCH, 2011



Task Force Functions and Duties

- 1. Conduct investigations regarding Commercial Auto Theft to include Stripping Operations, Salvage Switch Operations and Insurance Fraud cases. (NOTE: with the exception of the major police agencies such as Houston and Dallas no one has specialized units to investigate cases involving Salvage (VIN) switching operations and stripping operations. These are usually what are described as CHOP SHOPS. With DPS MVTS gone the ABTPA Task Forces are the only resource for a vast majority of Texas Law Enforcement to handle these type of investigations.)
- 2. Carjacking investigations (NOTE: Carjacking cases are usually handled as robberies or even homicides in some cases. Again, in the major cities the detectives that handle violent crimes or robberies will work these. However, in the urban or rural areas the ABTPA Task Forces are routinely called in to provide assistance to the local agencies.)
- 3. Vehicle Arson Investigations (NOTE: Vehicle fires are very unique incidents and in many cases local Fire Marshal's are not versed in working them. It is also common that when vehicles are burned the VIN numbers have been removed. Many of the ABTPA Task Forces have certified Arson Investigators who specialize in vehicle fires. They are routinely called out by law enforcement statewide to assist. Also, in many cases the ABTPA Task Forces are summoned to the scene to assist in identifying the vehicle.)
- 4. Tracking and identifying patterns of criminal activity relating to vehicle crimes to include; burglary of motor vehicle, unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, theft of motor vehicles, theft of ATV's, RV's, boats, personal watercraft, trailers and heavy equipment. (NOTE: With most crimes you have a crime scene and starting point. With vehicle thefts all you have is an empty parking space. Therefore, to be successful in having successful investigation and bait operations you must try and predict the criminal activities. Thus, reviewing reports and development of criminal patterns of activities is routinely a function of the ABTPA Task Forces statewide. This type of crime analysis has resulted in many major investigation and recoveries and arrest.)
- 5. Investigations concerning the theft of Commercial Cargo and Commercial Vehicles. (NOTE: The theft of cargo in Texas is increasing at alarming rates. In just the past couple of years the ABTPA Task Forces have become increasingly involved in these types of investigations. Stolen and altered commercial vehicles are extremely difficult to identify with they have been altered. Again, with DPS MVTS no longer operating the ABTPA Task Force are for a vast majority of the entire state the only specialized units with the expertise and training to work these types of investigations.)
- 6. Assist in investigations concerning gang activity, homicides, narcotics, weapons, smuggling of illegal aliens, property crimes, identity theft and all others when stolen vehicles are used as part of the criminal activity. (NOTE: Stolen vehicles have always been a major tool of the trade for gangs and smuggling operations. However, in more recent times this has become part of the normal course of business, especially as it pertains to the drug war in Mexico. Having said that, it is common place for the ABTPA Task Forces to assist the Federal, State and Local law enforcement agencies along the entire border of Texas on a daily basis. The ABTPA Task Forces are truly an instrumental part of the Homeland Security efforts. Stolen vehicles are also being used by both foreign and domestic gangs in their daily activities.)
- 7. Conduct inspections of Vehicle Storage facilities to insure compliance with appropriate State and Federal statutory and regulatory laws and rules. (NOTE: Vehicle storage facilities are virtually in every community in the State of Texas. There are rules and regulations by the State that there are required to operate within. With DPS MVTS no longer operating the ABTPA Task Forces are virtually the only enforcement organization in the state to conduct compliance inspections and deal with citizen complaints.)

- 8. Conduct inspections of licensed and unlicensed Vehicle Salvage Dealers to insure compliance with appropriate State and Federal statutory and regulatory laws and rules. (NOTE: As with VSF's salvage dealers (junk yards) are in every community and there are literally thousands across the State of Texas. These facilities are routinely used as methods to destroy and hide stolen vehicles. The routine purchase stolen vehicles for parts. They are routinely nothing but a front for a chop shop. With DPS MVTS no longer operating the ABTPA Task Forces the only groups conducting investigations and inspections involving these facilities in the urban and rural areas as well as many of the major metro areas. Inspections of these types of facilities are very specialized and require high trained personnel. They also require many man hours to regulate.)
- 9. Conduct inspections of in-bound and out-bound vehicles at land and sea ports in cooperation with Customs and Border Protection and other Homeland Security agencies. (NOTE: As mentioned in item #6 the role of the ABTPA Task Forces is crucial in many investigations. The use of stolen vehicles in smuggling operations of persons, narcotics, weapons, cash and other illegal contraband is routine. There is no one better that can examine a vehicle and determine it has been altered that a trained auto theft investigators. It is common place for the ABTPA Task Forces to assist the Federal and State agencies along the Mexican border with vehicle examinations. The ABTPA Task Forces also provide the same services and experience to Customs and Border Protection in the examination of vehicles being shipped through the sea ports in the State of Texas.)
- 10. Assist law enforcement agencies regarding the execution of Search Warrants, Arrest Warrants, Revocation Warrants and Parole Warrants that are connected to persons with a history of engaging in motor vehicle crimes. (NOTE: The ABTPA Task Forces routinely assist local agencies with warrant sweeps and execution of arrest warrant on persons with a history of motor vehicle crimes.)
- 11. Provide analytical assistance to law enforcement agencies as it pertains to vehicle crimes, organized criminal activity and crimes against persons in connection to tracking, identifying and locating suspect vehicles. (NOTE: With their expertise in identifying vehicles the ABTPA Task Forces are routinely contacted by local agencies in identifying vehicles used in all forms of criminal activity. This could range from reviewing a store video and confirming model and make of a vehicle to tracking partial license plates to specific vehicles or suspects. The ABTPA Task Forces also use License Plates Recognitions Systems and routinely collect data on hundreds of thousands of vehicles. This information has proven invaluable to local law enforcement in a number of criminal activities. Again, in a majority of the State of Texas the ABTPA Task Forces are the only resource for these types of services.)
- 12. Provide instructors/speakers for civic organizations, schools, citizen academies and law enforcement agencies. Conduct Public Awareness activities to included HEAT registrations and VIN etchings to educate and provide citizens with methods to protect their property. (NOTE: The Texas ABTPA Task Forces are the ONLY source in the State of Texas that provides public education materials and public awareness programs as it pertains to motor vehicle crimes. The ABPTA Task Forces are also the primary trainers statewide as it pertains to training Law Enforcement officers in the investigation of motor vehicle crimes and the recognition of stolen and altered vehicles.)
- 13. Provide electronic and technical assistance as it pertains to covert operations and investigations that are related to vehicle crimes or crimes involving public health and safety. (NOTE: The ABTPA Task Forces are responsible for the operation of a vast majority of the bait cars programs throughout the state. Throughout the state to include the major metro areas the ABTPA Task Forces are responsible for covert undercover operations statewide.)
- 14. Provide expertise and assistance in processing of vehicles for evidence of criminal activity (NOTE: The proper processing of stolen vehicles for evidence to secure prosecution is more important today and ever before. However, not all agencies have the training or resources to process stolen vehicles. Many of the larger cities do not have the resources to process that many vehicles. Therefore, it is common practice for many of the ABTPA Task Forces to provide forensic assistance to the local agencies.)

- 15. Conduct inspection of vehicles as required by various laws and rules with the Department of Motor Vehicles (NOTE: This has become a major issue and responsibility of the Texas ABTPA Task Forces. There are many reasons that require by Statue that an Auto Theft Investigator examine a vehicle to confirm its identity. This is done via form 68A. For years DPS MVTS handled a majority of these inspections. They are a very serious matter and require a lot of time to do properly. DPS actually had inspection stations set up around the state for citizens to take the vehicle to for the proper inspection. In recent years those stations were closed and DPS MVTS is not longer in operation. With that, the TABTPA Task Forces are virtually the ONLY resource for citizens to have this service done in a vast majority of the entire state. In just the past couple of years the number of inspections done by the ABTPA Task Forces has gone from about 4000 to 9000. This service is truly a necessary evil that is mandated to be done and they are the ones with the training and expertise to do it properly.)
- 16. Provide assistance to the Department of Motor Vehicles and local Tax Assessor Collector offices as it pertains to inspection of questioned vehicles and documents and fraudulent motor vehicle transactions. (NOTE: Many major motor vehicle crime investigations begin with a fraudulent of questioned document that someone has attempted to pass at a Tax Office. The Tax Office's throughout the entire State of Texas have come to refer citizens or make direct referrals to the Texas ABTPA Task Forces. This problem is so prevalent that several of the Tax Office's along the border with Mexico have ABTPA funded investigators assigned to their offices. In a majority of the State of Texas the ABTPA Task Forces are the ONLY resource for these types of investigations for the Tax Office's.)
- 17. Conduct investigations concerning complaints involving new and used car dealers. (NOTE: Virtually every community in the State of Texas has many new and/or used car dealers. Also, with the new world of Ebay Motors, Craigs List and others, scams on the sale of vehicles are more prevalent than ever before. With DMV only having handful of investigators to cover the entire state the Texas ABTPA Task Forces have become the go to source to handle investigations stemming from scams or dealer issues. In a vast majority of the State of Texas the ABTPA Task Forces are the ONLY resource for these types of investigations. Also, due to the fact that many of the internet scams are multi-jurisdictional it is very easy for the ABTPA Task Forces to work these cases and to share their resources statewide.)
- 18. Provide assistance in the tracking of stolen vehicles with On-Star, Lo Jack and other tracking sources. (Note: The use of theft recovery systems such as On-Stat and Lo Jack have increased dramatically in more recent years. A vast majority of the Texas ABTPA Task Forces are equipped with Lo Jack receivers. It is very common for vehicles to be located via a local patrol officer. However, instead of just recovering the vehicle it is common practice to notify the Texas ABTPA Task Forces and seek their assistance in providing surveillance on the located vehicles in an effort to capture and prosecute the persons responsible for the theft. I many areas of the State of Texas the ABTPA Task Forces are the only source for Lo Jack tracking.)
- 19. Conducting joint investigations with authorities of foreign countries in the retrieval of stolen vehicles. (NOTE: Prior to the creation of the Texas ABTPA and the Border Auto Theft Information center (BATIC) the repatriation of vehicles from the country of Mexico were rare. BATIC has been responsible for the identification and recovery of approximately \$300 million in stolen vehicles from Mexico. Also, the ABTPA Task Forces have forged tremendous working relationships with Mexican Police and have had greatly increased success in getting stolen vehicles return to the U.S. Also, there has been an increase in vehicle stolen in Mexico and being re-tagged and sold in Texas and throughout the U.S. These same relationships have been responsible for assisting Mexican authorities in the recovery of Mexican stolen vehicles. Through the ABTPA Border Solutions Committee the relationships between many levels of Mexican authorities from Attorney Generals to Police Commanders has greatly improved communications between the two countries. These relationships have proven beneficial in a variety of investigations of all types all along the entire border.)

SUMMARY:

This License Agreement proposes that the First Baptist Church in Wimberley allow the public to use parking space as a means of accessing the Winter's Mill Hike and Bike Trail. The Agreement calls for the County to maintain cleanliness in the parking lot during the term of the License. This parking area is the best means of public access to the Hike and Bike Trail on its northern side.

HAYS COUNTY

LICENSE AGREEMENT

HAYS COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("COUNTY"), and First Baptist Church Wimberley, a Texas tax-free church organization ("Licensor"), enter into this License Agreement ("Agreement") on this the ______ day of ______ 2011, upon the terms and conditions set forth below.

I. PURPOSE OF LICENSE AGREEMENT

The Licensor grants to COUNTY, its successors and assigns, permission to use the Licensed Property for the following purposes only:

To allow public parking in or on the Licensed Property expressly for public access to the hike and bike trail along Winters Mill Parkway, and to allow the COUNTY to provide periodic upkeep to ensure a tidy, orderly, and safe public environment.

The above-described property, hereinafter referred to as the "Licensed Property," is described in <u>Exhibit</u> "A" attached to this Agreement and incorporated by reference for all purposes.

The Licensor makes this grant solely to the extent of its right, title and interest in the Licensed Property, without any express or implied warranties.

The COUNTY agrees that all usage and upkeep permitted by this Agreement shall be done in compliance with all applicable County, State and/or Federal police, traffic, building, health and safety ordinances, laws and regulations existing at the time said construction and maintenance is performed.

II. ANNUAL FEE

The Licensor, its governing body, and its respective successors and assigns agree that no annual fee shall be assessed for the license and permission herein granted to the COUNTY.

III. <u>LICENSOR'S RIGHTS TO LICENSED PROPERTY</u>

This Agreement is expressly subject and subordinate to the present and future right of the Licensor, its successors, assigns, lessees, grantees and licensees, to construct, maintain, use, operate and renew any improvements on, beneath or above the surface of the Licensed Property described in Article I above.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to limit, in any way, the power of the Licensor to alter or improve the Licensed Property subject to this Agreement pursuant to official action by the governing body of the Licensor or its successors. The Licensor does, however, agree to give COUNTY at least thirty (30) days' written notice of such action.

Notwithstanding any provision in this Agreement to the contrary, the Licensor retains the right to enter upon and use the Licensed Property, at any time and without notice, assuming no obligation to COUNTY.

IV. <u>INSURANCE</u>

The County shall, at its sole expense, provide a risk pool insurance, written by a company or organization acceptable to the COUNTY and licensed to do business in Texas, with a combined single limit of not less than Three Hundred Thousand and No/l00 Dollars (\$300,000.00). This insurance coverage shall cover all perils arising from the activities of COUNTY, its officers, directors, employees, agents or

contractors, relative to this Agreement. COUNTY shall be responsible for any deductibles stated in the policy.

V. INDEMNIFICATION

To the extent permitted by law, COUNTY will indemnify and hold harmless the Church, and its directors, officers, employees, agents, shareholders, subsidiaries, and affiliates (collectively, the "Indemnified Persons") for any loss, liability, claim, damage, expense arising from third-party claims (collectively, "Damages") that is in connection with any negligent or willful act or omission of COUNTY and its agents.

VI. <u>CONDITIONS</u>

A. <u>Upkeep</u>. The COUNTY shall periodically maintain the Licensed Property by keeping the area free of debris and litter. Removal of trash or debris shall be handled by COUNTY at its expense, as may be requested by the Licensor.

B. <u>Default</u>. In the event that COUNTY fails to maintain the Licensed Property or otherwise comply with the terms or conditions as set forth herein, then the Licensor shall give COUNTY written notice thereof, by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the address set forth below. COUNTY shall have ten (10) days from the date of receipt of such notice to take action to remedy the failure complained of and, if COUNTY does not satisfactorily remedy the same within the 10-day period, the Licensor may perform the work or contract for the completion of the work. COUNTY agrees to pay, within thirty (30) days of written demand by the Licensor, all costs and expenses incurred by the Licensor in completing the work.

VII. COMMENCEMENT: TERMINATION BY ABANDONMENT

This Agreement shall begin with the date set forth in the introductory paragraph of this Agreement, and continue thereafter for so long as the Licensed Property shall be used for the purposes set forth herein. If COUNTY abandons the use of all or any part of the Licensed Property for such purposes set forth in this Agreement, then this Agreement, as to such portion or portions abandoned, shall expire and terminate following thirty (30) days' written notice to the COUNTY if such abandonment has not been remedied by COUNTY within such period; the Licensor shall thereafter have the same complete title to the Licensed Property so abandoned as though this Agreement had never been made and shall have the right to enter on the Licensed Property and terminate the rights of Licensee, its successors and assigns hereunder. All installations of Licensee not removed shall be deemed property of the Licensor as of the time abandoned.

VIII. <u>TERMINATION</u>

This Agreement may be terminated by either Party by delivering written notice of termination to the non-terminating party not later than thirty (30) days before the effective date of termination.

IX. APPLICATION OF LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. If the final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction invalidates any part of this Agreement, then the remaining parts shall be enforced, to the extent possible, consistent with the intent of the parties as evidenced by this Agreement.

X. <u>VENUE</u>

Venue for all lawsuits concerning this Agreement will be in Hays County, Texas.

XI. COVENANT RUNNING WITH LAND: WAIVER OF DEFAULT

This License Agreement and all of the covenants herein shall run with the land; therefore, the conditions set forth herein shall inure to and bind each party's successors and assigns. Either party may waive any default of the other at any time, without affecting or impairing any right arising from any subsequent or other default.

XII. ASSIGNMENT

The COUNTY shall not assign, sublet or transfer its interest in this Agreement without the written consent of the Licensor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Subject to the assignee's compliance with the insurance and Security Deposit requirements set forth herein, if any, COUNTY shall furnish to the Licensor a copy of any such assignment or transfer of any of COUNTY'S rights in this Agreement, including the name, date, address and contact person.

XIII. <u>NOTICES</u>

All notices, demands and requests for delivery of documents or information hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been properly delivered and received as of the time of delivery if personally delivered, as of the time deposited in the mail system if sent by United States certified mail, return receipt requested, and postage prepaid, or as of the time of delivery to Federal Express (or

comparable express delivery system) if sent by such method with all costs prepaid. All notices, demands and requests hereunder shall be addressed:

- 15. Prior to the vacation of the Premises, Tenant will return the Premises to a "like condition" as existed upon the commencement of the Lease.
- 16. Tenant, at its own cost, may make improvements to the Premises after obtaining Landlord's consent, as to the nature of the improvements.
- 17. Tenant will allow Landlord the exclusive use and possession of the utility storage area for an office and storage area by the utility door, with access

- during normal business hours of the Tenant and on weekends using the rear utility door for access.
- 18. Tenant shall pay the monthly service charges for the private security system to be installed by the Landlord.

B. Tenant agrees not to:

- 1. Use the Premises for any purpose, other than that stated in the Lease.
- 2. Create a nuisance.
- 3. Permit any waste.
- 4. Use the Premises in any way that is extra hazardous, would increase insurance premiums, or would void insurance on the Premises.
- 5. Change Landlord's lock system without Landlord's approval.
- 6. Alter the Premises without approval of the Landlord.
- 7. Allow a lien to be placed on the Premises.
- 8. Assign this Lease or sub-lease any portion of the Premises without Landlord's written consent.

C. Landlord agrees to:

- 1. Lease to Tenant the Premises for the entire Term beginning on the Commencement Date and ending on the Termination Date.
- 2. Obey all laws, ordinances, orders, and rules and regulations applicable to the Use, condition and occupancy of the Premises.
- 3. Provide normal utility service connections to the Premises.
- 4. Repair, replace, and maintain the (a) roof, (b) structural soundness of the exterior walls, doors and windows, and (c) other structures or equipment serving the Premises.
- 5. Insure the Premises against all risks of direct physical loss in an amount equal to at least 90 percent of the full replacement cost of the Premises as of the date of the loss and liability. Tenant will have no claim to any proceeds of Landlord's insurance policy.
- 6. Install a locking door between the storage area and the rest of the Premises. Landlord will have no key for access through this door.
- 7. Install a locking door in the hallway adjoining the restrooms to allow Landlord's invitees and guests to be able to access the restroom facilities on weekends. Landlord shall have no key to this door,
- 8. Landlord will pay the cost for the installation of a private security system for the Premises.

D. Landlord agrees not to:

- 1. Interfere with Tenant's possession of the Premises, as long as Tenant is
- Unreasonably withhold consent to a proposed assignment or sublease.

E. Landlord and Tenant agree to the following:

1. Alterations. Any physical additions or improvements to the Premises made by Tenant will become the property of the Landlord. Landlord may require that the Tenant, at termination of this Lease, and at Tenant's expense, remove any physical additions and improvements, repair any alterations, restore the Premises to the condition existing at the Commencement Date, normal wear and tear excepted.

2. Casualty/Total or Partial Destruction

- a. If the Premises are damaged by casualty and can be restored within ninety days, Landlord will, at its expense, restore the Premises to substantially the same condition that existed before the casualty. If Landlord fails to complete restoration within ninety days from the date of written notification by Tenant to Landlord of the casualty, Tenant may terminate this Lease by written notification.
- b. If the Premises cannot be restored within ninety days, Landlord has the option to restore the Premises. If Landlord chooses not to restore, this Lease will terminate. If Landlord chooses to restore, Landlord will notify Tenant of the estimated time to restore and give Tenant an option to terminate this Lease by notifying Landlord within ten days. If Tenant does not terminate this Lease, the Lease will continue and Landlord will restore the Premises, as provided in section a. above.
- c. To the extent the Premises are untenantable after the casualty and Tenant did not cause the damage, the Rent will be adjusted, as may be fair and reasonable.

3. Condemnation/Substantial or Partial Taking

- a. If the Premises cannot be used for the purposes contemplated by this Lease because of condemnation or purchase in lieu of condemnation, this Lease will terminate.
- b. If there is a condemnation or purchase in lieu of condemnation and this Lease is not terminated, Landlord will, at Landlord's expense, restore the Premises, and the Rent payable during the un-expired portion of the Term will be adjusted, as may be fair and reasonable.
- 4. Default by Landlord/Events. Defaults by Landlord are failing to comply with any provisions of this Lease within thirty days after written notice

- 5. Default by Landlord/Tenant's Remedies. Tenant's remedies for Landlord's default are to sue for damages and, if Landlord does not provide an Essential Service for thirty days after default, terminate this Lease.
- 6. Default by Tenant/Events. Defaults by Tenant are (a) failing to timely pay Rent, (b) abandoning the Premises, and (c) failing to comply within ten days after written notice with any portion of this Lease other than the defaults set forth in (a) and (b) above.
- 7. Defaults by Tenant/Landlord's Remedies. Landlord's remedies for Tenant's default are to (a) enter and take possession of the Premises, after which Landlord may re-let the Premises on behalf of Tenant and receive the rent directly by reason of the re-letting, and Tenant agrees to reimburse Landlord for any expenditures made in order to re-let; (b) enter the Premises and perform Tenant's obligations; and (c) terminate this Lease by written notice and sue for damages. Landlord may enter the Premises and take possession of the Premises by self-help, by picking or changing locks if necessary, and may lock out the Tenant or any other person who may be occupying the Premises, until the default is cured, without being liable for damages.
- 8. Default/Waiver/Mitigation. It is not a waiver of default if the nondefaulting party fails to declare immediately a default or delays in taking any action. Pursuit of any remedies set forth in this lease does not preclude pursuit of other remedies in this Lease or provided by law. Landlord and Tenant have a duty to mitigate damages.
- 9. Security Deposit. If Tenant defaults, Landlord may use the Security Deposit to pay arrears of Rent, to repair any damage or injury, or to pay any expense or liability incurred by Landlord as a result of the default.
- 10. Holdover. If Tenant does not vacate the Premises following termination of this Lease, Tenant will become a "tenant at will" and must vacate the Premises on receipt of notice from Landlord. No holding over by Tenant, whether with or without consent of Landlord, will extend the Term.
- 11. Alternative Dispute Resolution. Landlord and Tenant agree to mediate in good faith before filing a suit for damages.
- 12. Attorneys' Fees. If either party retains an attorney to enforce this Lease, the party prevailing in litigation is entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and court and other costs.

- 13. Venue. Venue is in Hays County, Texas, the county in which the Premises are located.
- 14. Right of First Refusal. Deleted
- 15. Entire Agreement. This Lease is the entire agreement of the parties and there are no oral representations, warranties, agreements, or promises pertaining to this Lease.
- 16. Amendments of Lease. This Lease may be amended only by an instrument in writing and signed by the Landlord and Tenant.
- 17. Notices: Any notice required or permitted under this Lease must be in writing. Any notice required by this Lease will be deemed to be delivered (whether actually received or not) when deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to the intended recipient at the address shown in this Lease. Notice may also be given by regular mail, personal delivery, courier delivery, facsimile transmission, or other commercially reasonable means and will be effective when actually received. Any address for notice may be changed by written notice delivered as provided herein.
- 18. Abandoned Property. Landlord may retain, destroy, or dispose of any property left in the Premises at the end of the Term.
- 19. Extension Option. Tenant shall have the right to extend the Term of the Lease for additional One (1) year terms at the Expiration of the then current Term. This Lease will automatically renew on a month-to-month basis unless Landlord or Tenant provides the other party written notice of termination not less than 30 days before the Expiration Date.
- Termination. Tenant shall have the right to terminate this Lease upon the giving of written notice to Landlord at least ninety (90) days prior to the date of termination.
