

A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to approve Commissioners Court Minutes of March 20, 2012 as presented by the County Clerk. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

27970 APPROVE REJECTION OF THE BID FOR IFB 2012-B02, ROW FENCING FOR MT GAINOR, AND AUTHORIZE PURCHASING TO REBID THE PROJECT

Transportation Director Jerry Borcherding spoke. Purchasing received one bid for this project which was over budget. The RPTP recommended that the changes needed to clarify the specifications where there may have been misunderstandings, and rebid the project. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to approve rejection of the bid for IFB 2012-B02, ROW Fencing for Mt Gainor, and authorize Purchasing to rebid the project. All voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY JUDGE TO EXECUTE A PROJECT GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE FUNDING OF \$3,000.00 FOR TWO VEHICLES IN THE VETERANS SERVICE OFFICE AND AMEND THE BUDGET ACCORDINGLY

On August 9, 2011 the Commissioners Court authorized a grant application to the Texas Department of Transportation, Section 5310 Program for \$3,000.00 in funding for preventive maintenance on two vehicles in the Veterans Service Office, previously purchased through this program. On September 29, 2011 notification was received from TxDot that the project had been approved, pending receipt of federal funds for the program. On January 10, 2012 the Commissioners Court authorized submission of additional documentation (Grant Application Part II) to TxDot for securing these funds. The Project Grant Agreement will formalize acceptance of the funding from TxDot, in the amount of \$3,000.00, for preventive maintenance of two vehicles used for transportation for the total project cost- \$3,750.00- and this was already allocated in the FY12 Budget. Amount Required \$750.00 (already allocated) 001-720-00.5413. A motion was made by Commissioner Ingalsbe, seconded by Commissioner Jones to authorize the County Judge to execute a Project Grant Agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation for preventive maintenance funding of \$3,000.00 for two vehicles in the Veterans Service Office and amend the budget accordingly. 27974 APPROVE BID AWARD FOR IFB 2012-B03 BANK DEPOSITORY TO SAGE BANK

Michele Tuttle Hays County Treasurer and Britney Richey spoke. Purchasing received four bids (1) SAGE, (2) PIONEER, (3) BBVA COMPASS and (4) FROST. The bid award is for a 4 year depository contract for Hays County. The evaluation committee consisted of Michele Tuttle, Bill Herzog, Britney Richey and Cindy Maiorka. After a long evaluation of all the bids it was determined that Sage Bank had the best offer for the County. All of the proposers were evaluated on cost & types of services provided, adherence to application requirements, financial condition of bidder, and interest on deposits. Each proposer offered a very competitive bid. It was very obvious the time and effort that went into each bid and the County appreciated the very competitive/excellent offers from each bank. A motion was made by Commissioner Whisenant, seconded by Commissioner Ingalsbe to pull this item for one week. Commissioner Ingalsbe, Commissioner Whisenant voting "Aye" Commissioner Conley abstained. Commissioner Jones and Judge Cobb voting "No". MOTION FAILED A motion was made by Commissioner Whisenant seconded by Commissioner Jones to approve bid award for IFB 2012-B03 Bank Depository to Sage Bank. Commissioner Ingalsbe voting "No". Commissioner Conley and Commissioner Whisenant Abstained. Commissioner Jones and Judge Cobb voting "Aye". MOTION PASSED

27975 APPROVE THE AMENDED CONTRACT "STATEMENT OF WORK AND PERFORMANCE MEASURES" BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES (DSHS) AND THE PERSONAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT (PHD) FOR THE FY 2012 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS (PHEP) CARRY

FORWARD FUNDS, AND AMEND THE GRANT BUDGET

The purpose of this amendment is to revise due dates for affected reports, extend due dates for equipment purchases, and add carry forward funding of \$23,474 to the original contract. An additional match of \$2,347 is required and is already budgeted. On January 31, 2012 the court authorized the County Judge to approve Carry-Forward application of this grant award. These amendments were requested by DSHS and increase total funding to \$145,902.00 total match to \$14,590, and total Direct Charges to \$160,492.00 Carry-forward funding is available March 1, 2012, and ends with the original contract term on July 31, 2012. Amount required \$2,347.00 (already budgeted). NOVATION AGREEMENT

Carter & Burgess, Inc. (Transferor), a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of Texas with its principal office in Ft. Worth, Texas; Jacobs Engineering Group Inc. (Transferee), a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of Delaware with its principal office in Pasadena, California; and Hays County (Owner), enter into this Agreement as of March 8, 2011.

- (a) The parties agree to the following facts:
 - (1) The Owner has entered into certain contracts with the Transferor, as shown in the attached list marked "Exhibit A" and incorporated in this Agreement by reference. The term "the contracts," as used in this Agreement, means the above contracts and all other active contracts that were executed by the Owner and the Transferor before the effective date of this Agreement. The term "contracts" includes all change orders, task orders or any other modifications or additions to such contracts that were mutually agreed to by Owner and Transferor.
 - (2) The Transferor is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Transferee. As of January 1, 2009, all employees of the Transferor have become employees of the Transferee, and the Transferor is in the process of closing down its business.
 - (3) The Transferee is in a position to fully perform all obligations that may exist under the contracts.
 - (4) It is consistent with the Owner's interests to recognize the Transferee as the successor party to the contracts.
- (b) In consideration of these facts, the parties agree as follows:
 - (1) The Transferee agrees to be bound by and to perform each contract in accordance with the conditions contained in the contracts. The Transferee also assumes all obligations and liabilities of, and all claims against, the Transferor under the contracts as if the Transferee were the original party to the contracts.
 - (2) The Transferee ratifies all previous actions taken by the Transferor with respect to the contracts, with the same force and effect as if the action had been taken by the Transferee.
 - (3) The Owner recognizes the Transferee as the Transferor's successor in interest in and to the contracts. Dear Honorable Sheriff Cutler:

In accordance with subsections 115.002 and 351.0415 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Auditor's office performed an internal examination on the records of the Hays County Sheriff's Jail Commissary for the period of October 1, 2010 to September 30, 2011. The internal examination consisted of reviewing deposits, disbursements, and other supporting documentation.

Based on the internal examination, except for the following finding and recommendation, cash receipts and disbursements appear to be adequately accounted for and related records appear to be accurately maintained in accordance with statutory requirements under subsection 112.001 of the Texas Local Government Code.

The Jail Commissary has been conducting business with a commissary vendor without an executed contract since July 20, 2011.

The previous contract for operation of the Jail Commissary expired on July 20, 2011. The Sheriff's Office accepted new bids from multiple vendors on June 16, 2011 as required by Local Government Code 351.0415. After the review of the bids, the current commissary vendor was selected to provide commissary services. An executed contract has yet to be finalized due to commissary software upgrade issues that have not been remedied.

Recommendation

We recommend that the Sheriff's Office maintain a month to month contract with the current commissary vendor until all software issues have been remedied. We also recommend that the Sheriff's Office execute an official contract as indicated in the bid documents with the commissary vendor once all issues have been resolved.

Management Response

The Sheriff's Office has executed a month to month contract with the commissary vendor to provide Jail Commissary services. Once the software upgrade issues have been resolved, a commissary services agreement will be executed.

We appreciate the cooperation and assistance provided to the Auditor's office during the examination.

SUMMARY:

On August 24, 2010 the Commissioners Court authorized solicitation of an RFQ for the purpose of revising the Hays County Parks and Open Space Master Plan originally developed in 2002, with minor updates in 2006. The firm of Design Workshop was selected to facilitate this process, and the Hays County Parks and Open Space Advisory Board (POSAB) served to oversee the project as per the Bylaws of the group. Public input on the Plan was taken at five public meetings located throughout the County, meetings with key stakeholder groups, and an online survey instrument, with additional data gleaned from local community park master plans and the previous Hays County Plan, as well as other resources. Numerous revisions were made throughout the planning process to address concerns from both the public and the POSAB. A draft of the plan was posted for public comment on the Hays County web site on December 2, 2011, with the comment period closing on January 11, 2012. A subcommittee of the POSAB reviewed the comments from four respondents, and these comments and a Foreword were integrated into the final draft of the plan.

The Plan proposes 10 priorities for parks, open space and natural area projects based on functional, rather than geographic, categories, although some consideration of geographic preference is also related. The Plan also attempts to distinguish between those projects which are more in the realm of local community park development versus those that can be viewed as regional in scope and more suited for County involvement. The Plan suggests partnerships in future park, open space and natural area projects. It is important to keep in mind that this is an evolving document with preferences and priorities changing over time, and serves as a snapshot of the current needs and desires of Hays County residents at this time. The Hays County Parks, Open Space and Natural Areas Master Plan has been posted on the Hays County web site for viewing, and hard copies have been provided to the Commissioners Court members.
