Nahum Melendez gave the invocation. Judge Becerra led the court in the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States and Texas flags. Judge Becerra called the meeting to order.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Dan Lyon, resident of San Marcos objected to various disbursements, saying the people of Hays County need tax relief. Mike Lee, Criminal Defense Attorney, complained of not receiving timely notification when his clients are moved to another location, and of the difficulties of providing good representation to inmates so far away. Ben Moore, District Attorney's Office, requested additional staff in the DA's office to handle the growing felony caseload. Angie Roberts of the District Attorney's Office – Civil Division—requested more money and approval of a paralegal to help with the growing workload of mental health cases. Matt Ocker, resident of Buda, opposed increasing the District Attorney's staff. Rodrigo Amaya, resident of San Marcos, commended Commissioner Smith for his concern for new election equipment that would accommodate Spanish speakers. David Crowley, resident of Wimberley, opposed the purchase of Hartintercivic voting machines.

PRESENTATION OF THE 2018 TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION'S DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD TO THE HAYS COUNTY HISTORICAL COMMISSION

Kate Johnson, Chair of the Hays County Historical Commission gave a brief summary of the Distinguished Service Award. Less than a third of the Counties in Texas qualify for this award. The Historical Commission has several committees that help the preservation and restoration of Hays County. One of the biggest projects is the restoration of the old Hays County Jail. Hays County Historical Commission has earned this award for 12 years in a row. In Recognition of its active and well-balanced preservation program. Rodrigo Amaya, resident of San Marcos, criticized the failure to repair the Courthouse fountain. Director of Countywide Operations, Tammy Crumley, said the work unerway to restore the brass fountain.



- (b) Each deputy constable must qualify in the manner provided for deputy sheriffs.
- (c) The constable is responsible for the official acts of each deputy of the constable. The constable may require a deputy to post a bond or security. A constable may exercise any remedy against a deputy or the deputy's surety that a person may exercise against the constable or the constable's surety.
- (d) A person commits an offense if the person:
 - (1) serves as a deputy constable and the person has not been appointed as provided by Subsection (a); or
 - (2) is a constable and issues a deputyship without the consent and approval of the commissioners court.
- (e) An offense under Subsection (d) is punishable by a fine of not less than \$50 or more than \$1,000.

EXCEPT AS PROVIDED FOR FEE SERVICES OR WORK-ORDER BASED SERVICES, THE ATTACHED SCOPE OF SERVICES SHALL INCLUDE A PRODUCTION SCHEDULE REFLECTING A TIMELINE FOR THE EXECUTION OF THE PROJECT.

FM 1626 Design Services

FM 1626 is a TxDOT roadway being developed by Hays County as a Pass-Through Finance project. The project schedule and construction phase tasks previously defined and approved have exceeded anticipated scope and budget. Below is the additional scope of services required for the ENGINEER to continue construction phase services through the remainder of construction.

PROJECT MANAGEMENT SERVICES

The ENGINEER shall continue to coordinate with the COUNTY, GEC (HNTB), TxDOT and sub consultants to address project related items needed to complete the FM 1626 Improvements Project. The ENGINEER shall meet with the team as needed to provide updates on design items associated with construction plan revisions.

The ENGINEER shall implement a QA/QC program throughout the project for any plan revisions requested by the County and shall provide documentation of QC reviews upon request.

The ENGINEER shall provide monthly status reports and invoices to cover work completed as of the billing period for the remainder of the project. It is anticipated that the project will be completed and closed out in April 2020.

CONSTRUCTION PHASE SERVICES

The ENGINEER shall continue to provide construction phase services outlined in Work Authorization #7. These services include:

- Review and response to contractor's Requests for Information (RFI's) to address specific known or unrecognized design constraints in the field. The original number of anticipated RFI's has greatly exceeded our planned estimate of reviews, some requiring additional design revisions described below.
- Attendance at regularly scheduled construction meetings (3hrs/month) and weekly coordination with RS&H (General Construction Consultant responsible for Construction Inspection).

- 3. Modify construction plans to accommodate design revision requests from TxDOT, COUNTY and GEC not included in the original construction plans and bid documents. Each design request will be evaluated to determine a level of effort to complete the modifications and discussed with the COUNTY prior to updating the plans. Current requested design revisions include:
 - a. Modification of Phase 2 traffic control plans that include an additional step to shift traffic onto recently constructed pavement in Phase 1 from Kahlbau Pond to the north terminus of the project (RM 967).
 - b. Modification of the drainage design around Kahlbau Pond to the proposed reinforced concrete box cross culvert system at FM 1626. Assumptions in the drainage redesign include regrading of the pond and ditch design outside of the existing road right-of-way to provide natural conveyance to the previously constructed cross culvert.
- 4. Development of final project construction documents meeting LGPP requirements including the Certificate of Construction Completion, Certification of Materials Used, Engineering Certification of Compliance and as-built record drawings. Record drawings will include the contractor's mark-ups in addition to revised drawings submitted with RFI's and Change Orders throughout construction.

Additional Design Associated with Project RFI's

Several RFI's received from the contractor over the last year have required significant redesign and plan revisions to accommodate TxDOT/County requests, unforeseen field conditions or contractor field adjustments. Below is a description of those items which have impacted the construction phase budget.

RFI 15 – Update the Construction Plans (Sheets and Quantities) to reflect the change to full depth reconstruction for FM 1626 areas which were originally planned to be widened.

RFI 35 – Update Traffic Control Plans for Phase 2 to modify the pavement sections by an additional 4-feet to accommodate a shift in traffic for Phase 3 construction. Also modify the headwall for Culvert 1 to account for the pavement adjustment.

RFI 37 – Update the RM 967 intersection to reflect updated survey and to toe into the east leg of FM 1626 due to inconsistencies between the as-built plans and the existing field conditions of the intersection.

Detour Plan Modifications - Traffic Control Plan Modifications for the adjustment to the detour plan adjacent to the Kahlbau property.

Culvert 7 Revisions – Modify the Culvert 7 layout to reflect new survey at FM 967 and accommodate existing field conditions varying from existing survey data.

Additional Driveways – Add 3 new driveways to the Buck's Property originally not included in the construction plans.

Bridge Column Modification – Coordination with TxDOT, COUTNY, GEC and Construction Inspection Engineer on the analysis and revision to the design drawings for the bridge columns on the Mustang Creek Bridge. Provide multiple options to maintain the previously constructed drill shafts and new column design.

Median Modifications – Update design plans and quantities to accommodate requests from TxDOT to adjust median layouts and striping transitions.


SUMMARY



History of Precinct-Based Voting

- Historically, this type of voting is necessary to give Election Officials a good estimate of the resources needed to run a polling place.
 - This includes paper ballots, styles and staffing needs.
- In prior years, paper voter rosters were used. Precinct based voting kept the rosters manageable for poll workers to locate voters and maintain accurate voter records.

Technology frees us from these limitations

2005: 79th Regular Legislative Session Countywide Polling Place Program

- Vote centers were **only** approved for use in the General Election for state and county offices.
- No other elections were approved.
- Lubbock County was the first to implement vote centers.

House Bill 719

- Passed in the 81st Regular Legislative Session (2009).
- Represents a continuation of the countywide programs conducted since 2006
- Vote Centers can be used in the following elections:
 - A general election for state and county offices.
 - A <u>countywide election</u> that takes place on the uniform election date in <u>May</u>.
 - A <u>constitutional amendment</u> election
 - A joint election when holding any of the above elections with a local political subdivision (e.g. city or school)

What are Countywide Polling Places?

More commonly referred to as "Vote Centers", these locations allow an eligible voter of the county to vote at any location used as a polling location on Election Day.

This is the current method of voting used in Early Voting in Hays County.

Technological Requirements

• Must *exclusively* be using direct recording electronic (DRE) voting systems on Election Day.

NOTE: This includes the Texas Specific Definition of a DRE System outlined in Advisory 2017-21 and KP-0170

• Must have a computerized voter registration list capable of instantaneous verification that a voter has not voted (e-poll books).

Selection of Poll Workers

NEW LAW

- House Bill 1735 (2017, 85th Legislative Session) provides the methodology for selecting poll workers for countywide polling places.
 - For judges appointed via the list procedure in Section 32.002 (county elections or elections held jointly with the county), judges must be selected in direct proportion to the percentage of election precincts in each county commissioners court won by a political party in the preceding gubernatorial election.
 - Poll workers do not have to be registered voters of the election precinct that the countywide polling place is located in, but must be registered voters of the county.

Selection of Poll Workers

- An example election:
 - Precinct 5 has:
 - 10 county election precincts.
 - 5 countywide polling places.
 - In the preceding gubernatorial election...
 - Party A won 6 election precincts.
 - Party B won 4 election precincts.
 - 60% of 5 polling places = 3 presiding judges will be affiliated with Party A.
 - 40% of 5 polling places = 2 presiding judges will be affiliated with Party B.

After a Countywide Election

- Following **any** election under the program, the county **must** submit a report to SOS on the use of the program for that election, including voter turnout data for that election and previous similar elections.
- After **one** election under the program, a county may apply for "successful" status, which will allow the county to utilize the program for any qualified election. Unless the county has been designated as "successful", the county will have to file a full formal application to use the program in subsequent elections.

"Successful" Status

- Following one countywide polling place program election, the county commissioner's court must hold another public hearing on the use of the program in the election.
- The county must then submit a letter to SOS requesting "successful" designation following one (or more) countywide polling place program elections. A transcript or recording of the public hearing must be included in the request.
- SOS will review the request along with the county's report on the election (which included voter turnout data for the countywide program election and previous elections).

Get the Word Out

- The county must develop a **communication plan** for providing notice to voters, informing them of the Vote Center program and of the changes that will be made to the polling place location.
 - Examples:
 - Post notices at the Election Day location indicating the location of the closest Vote Centers.
 - Send a flyer to each non-suspense voter that lists the Vote Centers and their addresses.
 - Publish notices in newspapers.
 - Post notices on county, city, and school websites.
 - Provide public service information announcements on TV and radio stations.

Key Findings - Rice University

- The convenience and accessibility of a voter's Election Day voting place is a significant factor to voting.
- Election Day Vote Centers, by allowing individuals to vote at any location throughout the county, might be more complementary with peoples' daily routines that exclusive precinct locations.
- Election Day Vote Centers have a positive and substantial effect on individual electoral participation.
 - This effect is substantially greater for infrequent rather than frequent voters.


Key Findings – Collin County

- Election officials and voters were pleased with the Vote Center experience.
 - Election officials did not have to re-direct voters to precinct specific polling places.
 - Voters were especially pleased when they could vote at the Elections Office, usually the place where voters drop by for polling place information on Election Day and vote in Early Voting.
- Ultimately, the voter benefits from increased convenience and flexibility in the selection of a Vote Center on Election Day.

Key Findings – Stein and Vonnahme, Texas and Colorado

- The results from Stein and Vonnahme's research suggest that EDVCs increase voter turnout, which is consistent with previous research on early adopters of vote centers.
- One unanticipated finding is the much stronger and positive effect vote centers have on voter turnout among non-habitual voters in low than higher turnout elections.

Simply put, a Vote Center is a polling place where any eligible voter in the county may go to vote.

The Vote Center model gives voters more flexibility on Election Day because they are not constrained to a specific polling location.

Vote Centers are connected through secure Internet connections, and as ballots are cast, an electronic poll book is instantaneously updated.

Vote Centers will:

- Lessen the amount of provisional ballots cast due to voters reporting to the wrong precinct polling place.
- Relieve the burden of time and long lines for voters on Election Day.
- Add consistency in voting locations, lessening voter confusion between different election cycles.
- Give the voter more flexibility and convenience in their effort to cast a ballot and have his or her voice heard.





Countywide Polling Place Study Group Locations Precinct 1 / San Marcos




Countywide Polling Place Study Group Locations Precinct 2 / Kyle & Buda






LBJ Student Center to United Campus Ministry – by Car




LBJ Student Center to United Campus Ministry – by Foot
