Welcome to the Hays County Open Burn Permit Guide. Use this document to learn how to create an account and apply for an outdoor burning permit. The step-by-step guide should help get you up and running.

Please note: there is no charge for open burn permits in Hays County, but a permit to burn is required by county statute.

Note: The views may appear differently on a mobile device. The steps remain the same.

Step 1: Visit HaysCountyPermits.com to register for an account






Step 3D: Log into your account with the information used to create it




Step 4: Choose 'Apply for a New Operational Permit' on this screen



Step 5: Select the type of Operational Permit for which you're applying




Step 6: Add information for the burn permit, e.g., address




TIP: Check out the helpful open burning guides before starting/lighting/igniting any fire. (Offered in English and Spanish)

Step 6 (continued): Add information, e.g., attendants




TIP: Be sure to use the phone number where you most often send and receive text messages

Step 7: Submit your application



(Be sure to add any notes for the Fire Inspector)

Step 8: This page shows your application was submitted and is being processed.



Step 9: This email confirms your permit application was submitted.

A fire inspector will contact you if there are any questions.

TIP: You will also receive an email saying your application is under review. No action is needed at this stage.

Step 10: This email shows your application has been approved and is ready to activate.

The email also shows the three ways a permit can be activated:

- Text "activate" to 512-877-8344 from the registered phone number
- Call 512-877-8344 from any phone and enter your
 8-digit permit number
- Login into www.hayscountypermits.com and click the activate button.

TIP: Even if you have an active permit, there may be days when weather conditions do not allow outdoor burning. You will receive a notification.

Test Open Burning permit is now Ready to Activate

This message has been sent on behalf of the Hays County Fire Marshal's Office.

The Open Burning permit for Test located at 2171 YARRINGTON RD is now Ready to Activate.

Open Burning permits are only active for one day at a time and must be re-activated for each day you wish to burn.

Open burning is only allowed if the county burn ban is off, weather conditions allow, and your permit has been activated for the day of the burn. Permits must be activated EACH day you wish to burn. Ensure that burns are constantly attended,

Note: a message may be displayed at the top of your permit dashboard if weather conditions do not allow outdoor burning that day. The Hays County Fire Marshal monitors wind conditions daily.

Open Burning Denied: High winds (>22 mph)

TIP: You may see messages about a countywide Burn Ban or Red Flag Days
