Community Health Assessment updates

Since February, the Local Health Department has hosted the Community Visioning Session and have received the results of that meeting. The Community Health Assessment Steering Committee has created the following vision statement:

"We envision a Healthy Hays County fully committed to equitable access to resources, where all people are and resilient. We thriving committed to improving the quality of life in Hays County collaborating to ensure a system of high quality medical and mental health services. education. employment, and infrastructure is available to all." The vision statement will the work auide of community health assessment and

the future actions created because of the community health assessment. Initium Health and the Local Health Department is assessing the community strengths and assets of Hays County and conducting a community status assessment of metrics prioritized by the steering committee.

To reach the community we will be conducting a series of community listening sessions with questions that collect the perspectives of community members from various neighborhoods, ages, and interest groups on how to create a healthier Hays County. 

COVID Hospitalizations

Over the course of the pandemic, Hays approximately 2,400 County has had hospitalizations due to COVID-19. Hospitalizations have reliably followed the waves of cases. However, as we enter the 4th year of the pandemic, we are seeing more of an uncoupling of cases and hospitalizations. Due to a combination of vaccination and prior infection, many people have some immunity to the virus. For most, this reduces the severity of the illness. Unfortunately, this is not always the who case for those are immunocompromised or of advanced age. As illustrated by the Hospitalization by Age Group: Rate per 1000 graph, there is a direct correlation between advancing age and an increased risk of hospitalization.




Get involved in promoting outdoor safety

TVFC PROVIDERS

If a provider is enrolled in the TVFC (Texas Vaccines For Children) Program, they will no longer have to refer their uninsured children to a public health center for immunizations. Instead, they will be able to continue to provide care to the child at their office, thus benefiting the provider and client.

We need your help in order to ensure the health and future of Texas children.

If you are not enrolled in TVFC, please consider enrolling. The process is simple:

- fill out Provider Enrollment and Provider Profile forms.
- agree to screen for eligibility,
- agree to maintain screening records, and
- agree to maintain vaccine safety and inventory.

Under TVFC, the following groups of children (birth – 18 years of age) should receive free vaccines:

- uninsured or underinsured children,
- children who are covered by CHIP,
- children who are of Native American or Native Alaskan heritage, and
- children on Medicaid.
