HCLHD invites residents to Back-To-School Fair

The Hays County Local Health Department (HCLHD) is gearing up to provide free and low-cost vaccines to the community.

Hays County Local Health Department (HCLHD) is hosting a back-to-school fair to encourage student vaccinations. The HCLHD is a participant in the Texas Vaccines for Children (TVFC) program, which provides low-cost vaccines to eligible children up until the age of 18 who meet the criteria.

"It is important that students receive their vaccinations during summer break," said Hays County Health Department Manager Matthew Gonzales. "Not only does this prepare the students for school, it makes it easier to obtain vaccinations without overwhelming local clinics."

HCLHD's back-to-school fair will give parents and students the chance to receive free vaccinations with the TVFC program. The fair will be held on August 5 from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., just in time for the upcoming school vear.

"We are very excited for the back-to-school fair," Gonzales said. "It's a wonderful opportunity for families to get their students vaccinated. We want to help schools create healthy learning environments and this is one way for the community to help take part in that."



HCLHD NEW BUILDING UPDATES

When the county purchased the 101 Thermon Drive building, officials knew that some changes were necessary to customize the building to our needs. The changes have been completed according to priority. High on priority were items such as the installation of a backup generator, fiber internet, and the modification of the existing floor plans to include exam rooms.

These projects are necessary for the operation of the department and to adhere to grant requirements. Lower priority items are items that are necessary, but not detrimental to operations. Our Director, Tammy Crumley, worked closely with Chris Deichmann, Facilities Maintenance Manager, to start the process of procuring contractors to complete this high-priority work.

The procurement process (primarily overseen by the Auditor's office) can be slow to ensure that we, the county, are adhering to the laws of the State of Texas. As such, many items were not able to begin until after contracts were awarded in early and mid-June.

One such project was the installation and movement of the generator. The generator will ensure that in a power outage, we can continue operations and that our equipment and materials that rely on electricity to control certain conditions will remain stable.

Another project that recently began is the remodeling of 3 offices into medical rooms. One room will be a medical utility room where pharmaceuticals and medical supplies will be stored. One room will be a standard medical exam room. One room will be a negative pressure room.


The negative pressure rooms are used to prevent potentially contaminated air or other dangerous particles from flowing outside into non-contaminated areas. This works by decreasing the pressure inside the room to lower than in the other rooms. The airflow will allow the room to exhaust into a system that purifies the air before being released outside the facility.

Other projects that are in the process of being completed are the remodeling of bathrooms to comply with ADA standards, the completion of a bus stop provided by the City of San Marcos, the installation of fiber internet, and the installation of office equipment to meet the current needs of staff.

EPI INSIGHTS

Mosquito Surveillance

With summertime upon us, so too are nature's deadliest creatures. Mosquitoes are small but mighty with their ability to harbor numerous lethal and debilitating infectious diseases. Capable of transmitting viruses such as West Nile Virus, Dengue Virus, Zika Virus, and Yellow Fever (to name a few), as well as parasites responsible for causing Malaria and Lymphatic Filariasis. Malaria alone was responsible for the worldwide deaths of approximately 625,000 in 2020 and 619,000 in 2021.

The great news is that there are several different ways that you can protect yourself and your family while enjoying the outdoors.

- Eliminating sources of standing, stagnant water around your home, work, or other places that you frequent prevents the laying of eggs and can help break the life cycle of the mosquitoes in your area.
- You can protect from bites by wearing pants and long-sleeved clothing while outdoors and/or use insect repellents that contain DEET or picaridin. This is especially important while taking that summertime trip to a beautiful tropical or subtropical country that most people are not aware of the moderate to high transmission levels of various mosquito-borne illnesses.
- When travelling to a foreign country, you can obtain all health considerations needed from the CDC's Travelers' Health tool. Here you can select your destination country and you will see any important travel health notices, recommended or required vaccinations/medications, and diseases and their preventions. All information is specific to the country selected and can be an excellent tool for preparing and packing for an out-of-country trip.

EPI INSIGHTS

Mosquito Surveillance

The Hays County Arboviral Surveillance Program is a collaboration between the Hays County Local Health Department and Hays County Development Services to actively trap mosquitoes throughout Hays County and have them tested at the State Public Health Laboratory in Austin for West Nile Virus, St. Louis Encephalitis, and Eastern Equine Encephalitis. These three viruses constitute the greatest public health risk from mosquitoes in our Central Texas region.

By actively surveying the mosquito population, we are able to detect infected mosquitoes before they infect humans and take action on alerting the public of an area where more infected mosquitoes may be. This allows the public to be more conscience about protecting themselves or choosing to avoid outdoor activities in that area until we are no longer detecting infected mosquitoes in that location.



On the left, you can see a Gravid Trap, which was designed by Dr. Paul Reiter of the Centers for Disease Control, Division of Vector-Borne Disease for the selective capture of gravid Culex mosquitoes. By limiting captures to this class of females, problems associated with calculation of minimum virus infection rates were reduced.

TEXAS VACCINES FOR CHILDREN (TVFC) INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The Texas Vaccines for Children (TVFC) program provides low-cost vaccines to eligible children from birth through 18 years of age who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Eligible for participation in the Medicaid program
- Enrolled in the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)*
- American Indian or Alaska Native (As defined by 25 U.S.C. 1603)
- Uninsured Children: Children who do not have health insurance
- UNDERinsured: Children who have commercial (private) health insurance, but
 - Coverage does not include vaccines; or
 - Covers only selected vaccines (TVFC-eligible for non-covered vaccines only); or
 - Health insurance covers all vaccines, but the plan has a fixed dollar limit or cap on the amount that it will cover for vaccines (TVFC-eligible once fixed dollar amount or cap is reached).
- *Though children whose insurance pays for vaccines do not qualify for TVFC vaccine, CHIP children do qualify by special arrangement.
- *Underinsured children must be seen by a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC), Rural Health Clinic (RHC), or deputized clinic.

- Hepatitis A
- Hepatitis B
- Hib
- HPV

- Influenza
- Measles, Mumps and Rubella
- MMRV
- Meningococcal
- Pneumococcal

- Varicella (Chickenpox)
