HCLHD opens new Thermon building

The Hays County Local Health Department (HCLHD) has officially opened the doors to its new location at 101 Thermon Dr., San Marcos, TX 78666.

The Hays County Local Health Department (HCLHD) purchased a new building in March of this year and have been actively working on remodeling to prepare for the grand opening.

"The Thermon building will allow us to expand our services to better aid the Hays County community" said Hays County Health Department Manager Matthew Gonzales. "Some of the expanded services at the HCLHD will include childhood immunizations and adult safety net for uninsured, underinsured, and low-income residents as well as STI treatment.."

The official opening of the building was August 7, 2023. The public was invited to see the building for the first time at the HCLHD Back-To-School Fair on August 5. The clinic was also open the following week to provide TVFC vaccines to eligible children.

The new building is located at 101 Thermon Drive, San Marcos, TX 78666. The previous location of the HCLHD was 401-A Broadway Street, San Marcos, TX 78666.

"Our staff has been moving over gradually throughout the year," Gonzales said. "Our full staff is finally here and ready to welcome patients."






